

The Inland Empire Advisory Council (IEEAC) is composed of employer volunteers representing a cross section of business, industry, community based organizations and public employers.


IEEAC promotes stronger partnership, between the California Employment Development Department (EDD) and the business community to conduct business more effectively and efficiently, providing education and information on labor.
