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



Victims & constituents receive ...

- National and statewide offender custody status information and notification (e.g. jail, prison, probation);
- Information access 24/7/365 (e.g. phone, website);
- Phone & Email notifications;
- Multi-language notifications;
- Notification registration can be confidential & anonymous;
- Any victim can register for notification; and,
- 24/7/365 live operator support

DATA FEED

- •The Department of Correction
- •94 County Jails
- •43 states



VINE Court

(court case information)

Victims & constituents receive...

- Court case information and notification;
- •Phone notification only;
- Notifications are only provided in English language;
- Technical support and information provided by the district attorney's office, M-F, 8am-5pm;
- Victims as defined by the CVRA can register for notification;
- Victims must register directly with the district attorney's office; and,
- District attorney's office must use the AOC case management system to register victims for automated notification.

DATA FEED

•Only offender files that are manually sent via the CMS to the NC SAVAN CJIS database are stored and made available.

VINE Watch

(administrative use only)

Authorized constituents receive...

- A victim notification management tool;
- Ability to generate victim notification letters;
- Authorized access to offender information;
- 24/7/365 live operator technical support; and,
- Statistical reports for service delivery method, delivery confirmation, number of registrations, types of notifications and much more.

JusticeXchange

(authorized use only)

Authorized constituents receive...



- Offender management and information to better serve victims;
- Historical/current offender data;
- Watch capability;
- 24/7/365 live operator technical support; and,
- Audit capability-CJIS compliant

NC SAVAN CJIS Pilot

- Pilot began on March 14, 2005 with the Durham County Sheriff's Department
- Built upon the NC SAVAN infrastructure
- Training sessions were held in Durham for the initial group of users

One user found someone he had an outstanding warrant on incarcerated in another county in North Carolina during the first training session.

Expansion of Pilot

- Pilot was expanded to include data and users from the four surrounding counties in 2007:
 - Wake
 - Orange
 - Chatham
 - Granville

Pilot Results

- Today, the pilot has averaged in the last 30 days:
 - 450 various users from 29 agencies
 - 2,000 logins per month
 - 6,300 searches per month
 - 500 report queries
 - 2,700 watches with 550 hits (approximately a 20% hit ratio)





Activities During Pilot

- On site training
- User groups feedback:
 - Users want data expanded
 - Juvenile information desired
 - One stop shop for information needs
- Quarterly newsletter called The Xchange






Texas Case Study



- Project Initiated in 2006 by Governors Office of Homeland Security
- In late 2007 transferred to Texas Department of Public Safety

Challenges of Sharing Local CJ Information

- State databases are more accessible
 - Access to local data sources is a major challenge
 - 10-15 major state database sources
 - Over 1,000 local database sources
- Governance challenges requiring strong leadership
- Obtaining rapid results to gain support/credibility with locals and with the legislature




Texas Success Formula

- 1 Start with JX / OffenderNet Base Early Success
- 2 Connect in Local RMS data Sources (1000 total)
- 3 Connect in state databases (DPS, TDCJ, etc...)
- 4 Securely Outsource Network/Data Management
- 5 Integrate with NDEX to drive national strategy
