We knew him in the Alumni Association because of his many financial gifts to the alumni scholarship program, always in memory of his late wife Carol. Over the last 16 years he was able to gift \$59,000 to our program, thereby providing many students with scholarships and supporting the long term scholarship endowment (Legacy Fund) program.

I saw Bob at last fall's alumni luncheon and asked him why he had donated so generously all these years? His paraphrased reply reflected his straightforward approach to life. "I didn't have the chance to go to college and I saw over the years how much that helped the people I worked with. I wanted to help others make that step."

Bob Rois made a difference, and we're all the better for it.

It is modestly located on the northwest corner of Third Avenue and Cedar Street in the outskirts of Belltown. One of the last one-story buildings in the area, but the heart of city maps created and added to by three generations plus, and the merger of Kroll and Metsker Maps into one agency which can provide maps of the city, county and region. Carl Kroll started the one firm. It is now 106 years since it began.

The current location was acquired in 1975 and looks to be continuing for at least one more generation, due to **John Loacker's '73** stewardship. John worked from his youth steadily at the firm, continuing to provide both updated maps and copies of many of the earlier maps showing the growth and development of Seattle and its environs. Most of these maps are also found at the Seattle Collection in the Downtown Seattle Public Library, but the best copies to own are still available at Kroll.

What will become of the mapmaking business when John retires? That is for the future to decide, and for us to lament. If you wish to learn more about Seattle's maps, stop by the company Monday-Friday and visit. You may also read the well-written article which appeared in the Pacific NW Magazine in the Seattle Times for March 25, 2018.
