#### Foreword

Bicentennial celebrations may stimulate interest in the origins and heritage of student publications in American secondary schools. Certainly student journalists may take pride in their early newspapers, magazines, and yearbooks. Indeed investigative reporting may provide the basis for timely articles.

Sources of data are back files in the school, alumni, libraries, museums, historical and antiquarian societies, state and national school press organizations. In some instances theses and dissertations have provided information, particularly those before World War II. Quil! and Scroll Studies appreciates the cooperation from advisors and these sources.

#### Introduction

Colorado's first high school newspaper was founded eighty years ago in Colorado Springs. It was the eight-page Lever published by William J. Palmer High School.

Henry M. Stanley was featured on the first page of the second edition printed on March 30, 1887. Rhetorical exercises and the examination schedule made page two of the two-column publication with columns a little under three inches wide.

Published monthly, The Lever was produced by a staff consisting of Frank C. Wilder, editor; Maggie Russell, local editor; Hattie C. Bumstead, personal editor; Charles H. Bliss, advertising manager; Oliver Shoup, advertising agent; Ada Mansfield, mailing clerk. The subscription rate was fifty cents.

The March issue stressed the progress made in the schools during the past three or four years. Issue the members of the board of education and faculty, devoting about a page to personals.

Three and a half pages were filled with local advertising without timely copy or sales appeal. Merchants, dentists, photographers, contractors, bakers, hotels, realtors, and livery stables bought space in the publication.

The first high school yearbook in Colorado also was The Lever, for it consisted of the bound copies of the newspaper with thirty some pages, according to Kenneth L. Hinshaw, principal.

Published in 1895, The North Side High School Chronicle probably was the first high school newspaper in Denver. Published monthly, it sold for twenty-five cents a year--paid in advance. It listed Thomas E. Rust as editor, Jessie Lee as assistant editor, and Gail W. Holmes as manager.

The first page of the first issue featured a poem by Elizabeth D. McArthur entitled "My Favorite City." About one-third as much space was given to reporting the formation on September 28, 1895, of an association of Denver high schools to schedule football games. "A series of practice games was played, all of which resulted in favor of the N.S.H.S."

If other high school publications were founded in Colorado before 1900, school historians have failed to report them to Quill and Scroll Studies which is making a nation-wide study of early high school publications.

High school journalism courses with credit probably were not taught in Colorado until after World War I. A course was taught in 1920 at Central, Pueblo; 1922, Palmer, Colorado Springs; 1927, Centennial, Pueblo; 1929, Central, Greeley; 1932, Fowler; 1935, Manual, Denver. Others probably were founded during this era.

In 1939 there were forty-five mimeographed school newspapers with a total circulation of more than 10,000, Jean Hunt reported in a thesis. Unfortunately she did not identify the newspapers or the schools in which they were published, but none was more than seven years old.

In 1961 journalism courses were taught in only 112 of the 292 high schools. More than three times as many Colorado boys and girls were studying Latin--a dead language few will ever use--than were studying journalism--that is, the mass media all of them will use!

In some instances these and dissertations have provided information, particularly those before World War II. Quill and Scroll Studies appreciates the cooperation from advisors and these sources.

Note: State Archivist Leon de Valinger, Jr., in 1965 made this statement:

"To the best of our knowledge there is no compiled history of secondary school journalism in Delaware; it is therefore impossible for us to determine the first such publication in any category. It is possible that we have one or two items illustrative of later nineteenth century school writing.

"Friends School in Wilmington, compiled by Charles W. Bush and others, published at Wilmington in 1948, pages 24-26, gives an account of the Whittier Literary Society, organized in March 1884 by students of "the Academic classes." One of the Society's immediate undertakings was the Preparation of a school publication, named The Whittier Miscellany after much controversy. It is our understanding that the magazine has been continuously issued since that time.

"The third item is a handbook, entitled <u>Curriculum and Rules of Georgetown Public</u> <u>Schools</u>, a I2-page pamphlet measuring 4 1/4 inches x 6 inches, Printed by "Sussex Journal" Print, Georgetown, Delaware in 1895. There were twelve grades, with English Literature, History, Latin, Algebra, Physics and Geometry as the offering in the final year. The pamphlet also contains the school calendar and three pages of regulations.

"We have not been able to document the age of <u>The Whisp</u>, of Wilmington High School. It was started, However, substantially earlier than 1921, for a member of our staff was a subscriber in September 1919 when the magazine was already a school tradition. It had, moreover, a predecessor the exact nature of which has not been fully determined. The capsule placed in the cornerstone of the new High School building in December, 1884 contained, among other memorabilia, The Indicator, edited by H. W. McIntire and Wm. H. Heald, "published monthly by the Indicator Publishing Company at the Boys' High School." It is the issue of July 1880, numbered volume I, No. 4. It is a four-page folder, printed, 8 I/4 inches by II 7/8 inches, priced at ten cents for six months by subscription, or two cents per separate copy. It contains two student commencement essays, an editorial, an account of the High School Commencement and closing exercises of the jower

schools, a humorous treatment of the subject "Co-education," and a few advertisements."

Caroline Philips, secretary of Friends School, provided this information in 1966:

"Friends School in Wilmington, Delaware, started a literary magazine in 1883, known as THE WHITTIER MISCELLANY. The first <u>printed</u> copy was published in April 1895, twelve years after its first issue. The magazine was published three times a year and the final issue in June was a Yearbook format until the 1940's, when a separate Yearbook was published by each senior class.

"In the spring of 1953, THE WHITTIER MISCELLANY became a newspaper and has been published monthly every school year since then, reserving most of one page as a literary section."

Robert V. Martin, Principal of Wilmington High School in 1966, made this statement:

"We have in our files copies of #2 and #5 Volume 1 of "The High School Index, an Amateur Paper, conducted by the Boys and Girls of the Wilmington High School" dated February and May, 1874, respectively. I assume that Volume 1, No. I was published in December of 1873 as a comment by the editor in the No. 2 issue states, "In the hurry to get our first issue out before the holidays we . . . ." It would be safe to state that the first issue was published at the latest in January of 1874."

Note: Dr. Regis L. Boyle made this comment in 1965 on student journalism in the District of Columbia.

"No one has wrinten a history of student publications in Washington. The oldest high school in the District, Old Business High School, closed its doors and was turned into what was then Division 2 (Division I being White, Division 2 being Negro). The next oldest was Central High School, which closed its doors in 1950 when it was turned over to Division 2 and the records transferred to storage, untended by anyone.

"The magazine, the Central High School Review, was begun in 1886. The newspaper at McKinley Technical High School, the Tech News, was begun in 1901, according to the school historian. The Central High School Yearbook was begun in 1906.

"Journalism was first taught at Central High School in 1902. This is the first date we could find for journalism's introduction into the curriculum of the District Schools."

Quill and Scroll is indebted to Dr. Boyle for her cooperation. She has a long record of distinguished service to student journalism in the District of Columbia and Maryland.

Certainly student journalists may take price in their early newspapers, magazines, and yearbooks. Indeed investigative reporting may provide the basis for timely articles.

Sources of data are back files in the school, alumni, libraries, museums, historical and antiquarian societies, state and national school press organizations. In some instances theses and dissertations have provided information, particularly those before World War II. Quill and Scroll Studies appreciates the cooperation from advisors and these sources.

Note: The Georgia Scholastic Press Association, founded in 1928, cooperated in this study, but its own files apparently contained limited data on when specific publications were founded.

Hiss Gigi Parker, 1966 adviser at Savannah High School, reported thus:

"The first issue of <u>The Blue and White</u>, the present newspaper of Savannah High School, was published in December, 1909. The predecessor of <u>The Blue and White</u> was <u>The Savannah High School Monthly</u> which, according to Haygood S. Bowden in his book <u>Two Hundred Years of Education</u>, first appeared in 1905 and was the first paper published by high school students in the state of Georgia. The earliest issue of <u>The Savannah High School Monthly</u> in the files of the Savannah High School library is the Souvenier Issue (V· I, No. 6), a blue covered booklet published for the graduating class of June, 1906. The editor was Washington Faulk, Jr. He was encouraged by Mr. H. F. Train, principal, and Mr. Otis Ashmore and Miss Florence Olmstead, who contributed to the Souvenier Issue Although actual copies of a paper earlier than <u>The Savannah High School</u> Monthly have not yet been found, there are evidences that a newspaper existed bofore it. For example, the exchange column in the Volume I, Number 6 edition of <u>The Savannah High School Monthly</u> states, "The S.H.S. Monthly was recognized this year for the first time in several years."

"Another instance is found in an editorial in the Volume I, Number I edition of <u>The Blue and White</u>: "For some time the students of the Savannah High School have published a paper. At first the paper was weekly, but under the conditions which are placed upon a school paper this was soon found to be impractical. The little weekly sheet was discontinued, and a monthly magazine of more substantial form and matter was issued. The paper was published in this form for some time.

Note: Studies by Nixon, Coe, Huff, Jardine, Pierik and Campbell were the sources of many dates. Gene Gilmore, director of the Illinois State High School Press Association, gave substantial cooperation. A list was published in the February 1967 Illinois High School Journalist. Corrections and additions appear in this list. The compiler was director of the Illinois State High School Press Association from 1939 to 1941. He established the planning council. Among advisers cooperating were Lillian Jossem of Belleville, Kay Keefe of Lyons Township.

Note: The first high school press institute was founded by Professor William R. Slaughter at Northwestern in 1932.

Note: From Volume I, Number I, February 20, 1911, The Parker Weekly:

"Editorial -- This issue of the Parker Week y is an experiment. Whether it will become an institution of the school or not is left for the students to decide. There may be some doubt as to whether a weekly newspaper--for that would be the nature of this publication--is desirable in this little school or not, but we believe that with the **right** sort of cooperation of the students, this periodical, small as it is, may be made extremely interesting, not only to the students, but to the Alumni and others who are interested in the school. It is our idea to issue this paper every Monday morning, and to make it a student publication in every sense of the word. Not only will the matter that is to go into the paper be written by the students, but the mechanical (an interesting) part of the work, consisting of composition and presswork, will also be done by students. There are many boys in the school who know enough about printing to be able to do this work in good shape, and their services along this line is absolutely essential to the success of the paper.

"It is to be strictly a nerspaper, giving accounts of the interesting events of the past veck and announcing the various activities of the present week.

"By printing the news from week to week, while it is fresh, we do not think it will detract from the Recorder, as at present issued, but on the other hand will allow even more space for good literary articles.

"Let us know by word or action what you think of issuing the Parker Weekly."

Note: In 1966 Dorrit Keirn wrote:

"As early as 1861 Wilmington may have had a school paper--Vol. 3, No. 10, was published on March 31, 1863. "Knowledge is power" is the slogan appearing on the first page of the paper named the Wilmington School Journal. A copy was found with other papers used as insulation in an old house that was being torn down.

Poetry and miscellaneous compositions are, for the most part, all that the paper carries. Page 3 of the four-page journal, however, features a paraphrase on the first three chapters of the First Book of Chronicles. Topics for the compositions range from "The War" to "Music," to "Honor to Parents." One is on the hard times and the need for wearing patched dresses to school. The writer was glad at least that her patches were "like" her dress.

"Humor is largely a play upon proper names: "Why will some of our scholars never grow old until they are married? Because they are 'Young.'" Of the two small ads on page 2, one concerns a "Mrs. Dr. Coates" who had just returned from Europe and had been persuaded to accept a few piano pupils. "The Dr. would also state that the Glee Club is about to be reorganized."

"Wilmington cannot claim to have had a school paper for all the years since--It was in the fall of 1952 that two teachers sponsored a group of interested junior and senior students in starting a paper. First named the "Wil-Lo-Ette," it later became "The Scribbler." Both were mimeographed. Later the news was given to the publishers of the local weekly who gave the school enough pull sheets for distribution to the students.

Note: From Quill and Scroll:

"Tad Lincoln, son of Abraham Lincoln, edited the first school newspaper in Chicago ... according to Cji Daily News, Vol. 1, No. 1, of the Brown School Budget was edited by 13-year-old Tad and classmate in 1866. 4-pp is on display, Lincoln Hall, Chicago Historical Society ... Christmas or holiday edition of Brown School Budget...."

Note: In 1966 Mrs. Mary Youngdahl wrote:

"The Line O'Type, the Moline High School newspaper, began in 1917 and so we are now publishing our 49th year with next year being our golden anniversary. We plan a number of feature stories about it continuing through the year.

"The newspaper began as a four page 7 by 9 issue that came out rather regularly

about once a month. It has been published every year since that time. It has won scores of All Americans, Medalist nearly every year for the last 15 years or more and International honor ratings from Quill and Scroll besides getting the coveted Pacemaker award once.

"We have bound copies of the paper ever since it was started and if you have some specific questions concerning it, I would be glad to look them up for you. I became adviser in the fall of 1958."

Note: Betty House in 1966 wrote:

"Bloom's long-hoped-for school newspaper made its debut on March 5, 1924, under the sponsorship of Miss Ida Way and the editorship of Miss Ellen Caskey.

"Miss Way had come to Bloom in the fall of 1923 from Knox college. She started a newswriting class in the fall and took over the sponsorship of the Bloom annual at the same time.

"The paper originally was a 4-page bi-weekly, but under the editorship of Pio Uliassi in 1941, financial and other conditions permitted several 6-page editions, and the paper has retained this status save for an occasional 8-page or 4-page Pony special edition.

"Following Miss Way, Miss Ellen Caskey assumed the duties of adviser for a year and a half; then Mr. Kenneth Hindley took the helm for a semester. Miss Mary Elizabeth House, present adviser, assumed her duties in 1937.

"The Broadcaster celebrated the "new" Bloom's 10th (new building) anniversary with a special edition on February 18, 1944. The paper observed its Silver anniversary on March 12, 1949."

Note: In 1965 Joanna Zander wrote:

"The "E" Weekly was first produced in September, 1922. It had several predecessors. There seem to have been sporadic attempts as early as the early '90's to do something in the line of a news bulletin. At first they seem to have been posted on bulletin boards. In 1899 there was a Purple and White, sold at 5¢ a copy. Briefly in 1902, there was a school news column in a community paper called The Chicago Eye. In 1912, for one month there was a bulletin board newspaper called The How!. By school vote this was discontinued and a literary magazine called the "E" was started. In February, 1920, a weekly newspaper called The Reporter was begun. After two years, it was felt that both a newspaper and a magazine were too great a financial burden. Both were dropped, and The "E" Weekly came into existence. It lasted until I ceased functioning as adviser. I think that was in 1941.

Note: In 1967 Wayne Elasler wrote:



"We heard of your searc or early school newspapers. A check of the Lab Schools' archives reveals a U-High Weekly from 1903 to 1906, a U-High Daily (sometimes

it wasn't) from 1907 to 1922 and a U-High Midway from  $192^{2}$  On. U-High Midway also was the name on an earlier literary magazine here. The  $e^{1}$  ementary school had the reporter, actually a literary magazine, from 1910-21 it appears.

### INDIANA: DATES EARLY STUDENT PUBLICATIONS WERE FOUNDED

#### IN SECONDARY SCHOOLS

Compiled by Dr. Laurence R. Campbell, Director Quill and Scroll Studies, 1975

### Foreword

Bicentennial celebrations may stimulate interest in the origins and heritage of student publications in American secondary schools. Certainly student journalists may take pride in their early newspapers, magazines, and yearbooks. Indeed in-vestigative reporting may provide the basis for timely articles.

Sources of data are back files in the school, alumni, libraries, museums, historical and antiquarian societies, state and national school press organizations. In some instances theses and dissertations have provided information, particularly those before World War II. Quill and Scroll Studies appreciates the cooperation from advisors and these sources.

<u>Note</u>: In 1965 Mary Benedict, one of Indiana's outstanding advisers, gathered these data:

"The earliest recorded newspaper within an Indianapolis Public School was at Shortridge High School in 1880. Called <u>The Junior</u>, the publication measured 4 and 3/8 by 5 and 7/8 inches and was published faithfully as a weekly, appearing 40 times that first year. It sold for slightly more than one cent a copy and contained news, letters from students, poetry, and continued stories.

"In 1898 The Junior became The Comet, resembled a magazine, and boasted in one issue that it exchanged with 130 schools throughout the nation. It specifically mentioned that within the state it exchanged papers with schools in Muncie, Portland, Kokomo, and Richmond so all of those schools must have had papers as early as 1898.

"The first high school in Indiana was in New Albany so you might double check with that school system to see whether they had a publication before the 1880 date.

"In one half of the ten Indianapolis schools, there is no formal classroom instruction in journalism before staff participation. In those five schools there is a short unit (two weeks) covering journalism in certain English courses. One school includes it in English IV (last half of the sophomore year), two schools give some attention to journalism in accelerated English courses at the III (first half of sophemore year) and V (first half of junior year) levels. One school has no journalism instruction while the other designates one section of English V as that which will include a journalism unit. So even within one given school system the practice varies greatly from one school to another."

Note: Cooperation of Grotchen Komp, John A. Boyd, Ruth Marie Griggs, and the Indiana High School Press Association is appreciated. At one time the National Duplicated Publication Association had its headquarters at Central Teachers

College, Danville, Indiana. The director was Blanche Wean. The college was closed and the story of this association seems to have been lost.

Note: Albert Mock in his thesis, "A Study of High School Publications," in 1922 identified many Indiana student newspapers, some of which may have been founded before 1921.

<u>Note:</u> Indiana has had many outstanding publication advisers, including Rowena Harvey and Ella Sergenberger.

<u>Note:</u> In 1890 the New Carlisle High School students published news regularly in the New Carlisle Gazette. This procedure was followed in many communities.

Note: By Hattie Byland (1965):

"Volume 1, Number 1 of the Shortridge Daily Echo, Sept. 26, 1898, set a precedent in high school journalism.

"It was the first edition of a high school daily newspaper in the U.S. It is now one of five daily high school newspapers in the U.S.

"The first Echo, which was founded by a senior, Fletcher Barnard Wagner, consisted of one page of news three columns wide. The back was covered by advertisements for carriages, buggies, spring wagons and liquor. The news of the day was an account of two meetings of the Shortridge senate, an institution still in existence, and a sports story about a bicycle and tandem race.

"After 31 issues the paper flopped. The Echo had become a big part in the life of a Shortridger, nowever, and was reorganized Jan. 16, 1899. The school board granted \$250 for the purchase of a press for the high school and since then the paper has been published by the school's print shop.

"To celebrate the Echo's 50th anniversary in January, 1948, an alumni dinner and reception was held at the school.

"The Echo of today is a four-page daily with five staffs. Mrs. William Earl is sponsor. It is financed by subscriptions, which are handled by Echo agents, and advertisements.

"Each fall a special edition of the Echo is devoted to the annual PTA-sponsored Family Frolic. This year a special Shortridge Day Echo was printed for the first time in honor of the Shortridge Day celebration.

"An annual publication, the Christmas Echo, containing poems, essays, and short stories written by Shortridge pupils and organized by a student editor, is published each December. The art department sponsors a contest among the students for the winning cover design for the publication.

"Last year the Echo instituted one of its biggest changes, the addition of a double page of pictures in every Wednesday edition."

#### IOWA: DATES EARLY STUDENT PUBLICATIONS WERE FOUNDED

IN SECONDARY SCHOOLS

Compiled by Dr. Laurence R. Campbell, Director Quill and Scroll Studies, 1975

#### Foreword

Bicentennial celebrations may stimulate interest in the origins and heritage of student publications in American secondary schools. Certainly student journalists may take pride in their early newspapers, magazines, and yearbooks. Indeed in-vestigative reporting may provide the basis for timely articles.

Sources of data are back files in the school, alumni, libraries, museums, historical and antiquarian societies, state and national school press organizations. In some instances theses and dissertations have provided information, particularly those before World War II. Quill and Scroll Studies appreciates the cooperation from advisers and these sources.

Note: Early dates were verified by the compiler on the basis of studies by Huff, Nixon, Coe, and Kropf as well as his 1939 study. Both NSPA and CSPA were helpful. Baird C. Mcllroy in his 1939 thesis, "A Survey of Journalism as it is Taught in lowa High Schools," listed newspapers in existence. No doubt some were founded earlier. Marguerite Blough, a distinguished adviser at East Waterloo, was among those who cooperated.

In 1964 Kenneth Stratton, one of lowa's great high school teachers, wrote:

"I wish I could give you some information about student publications in the early 20's or before, but I can't. I started teaching in 1922 but didn't get into journalism till 1930. For a long time I kept up a series of scrapbooks, consisting mainly of clippings from Scholastic Editor, School Press Review and Quill and Scroll. However, there is nothing of historical interest in them, for I was interested only in helps for advisers and students."

William J. Peterson, Superintendent of the State Historical Society of Iowa, in 1965 wrote:

"Why in the world don't High Schools (if they find a State Historical Society is willing to house their Annuals and their Newspapers and bind and preserve them in permanent form) place them in their State Historical Society Library?

I have spoken to individual Superintendents and Principals and I think at the present time we are getting three or four lowa High School Annuals, but no newspapers. We are interested in getting a representative collection of these because we feel that sometime good articles could be written on various phases of high school activity and that ultimately a well-illustrated book could be gotten out on this subject which would have real significance and meaning. Unfortunately, we get no response."



IOWA

In March, 1954, the State Historical Society of Iowa published several detailed articles on basketball. Similar reports on student journalism could be published if cooperative efforts resulted in a collection of high school publications. .

Unfortunately in the consolidation of schools, some files of early  $\rho$  = lications may have been lost or destroyed.

#### Foreword

2 -

Bicentennial celebrations may stimulate interest in the origins and heritage of student publications in American secondary schools. Certainly student journalists may take pride in their early newspapers, magazines, and yearbooks. Indeed in-vestigative reporting may provide the basis for timely articles.

Sources of data are back files in the school, alumni, libraries, museums, historical and antiquarian societies, state and national school press organizations. In some instances theses and dissertations have provided information, particutarly those before World War II. Quill and Scroll Studies appreciates the cooperation from advisors and these sources.

Note: The first high school journalism course in Kansas may have been taught in 1912 when Miss Cora Colbee taught journalism at Salina High School. A course was taught at Oberlin in 1916, at Topeka in 1918, and at Altamont in 1920. Miss Carmie Wolfe taught the course at Topeka.

In 1961 journalism was taught in 140 of the state's 621 public high schools. Of the 156,705 students 381 enrolled in one-semester courses and 2,235 in one-year courses. The state department of education was unable to provide significant data on high school journalism activities, curricular or co-curricular.

The first high school yearbook published in Kansas was probably the Annual Catalog published by the LaBette County Community High School in 1893. It included "the faculty, pictures of different classes, articles about different departments with pictures and the school's course of study," according to Curtis D. Sides, principal.

Ola Floyd Nixon in a master's thesis accepted in 1922 and G. Gordon Grandberg in a master's thesis accepted a decade later referred to various yearbooks then in existence, but neither referred to the date of founding. So far no comprehensive study of the history of yearbooks in Kansas high schools has been made.

The Kansas State Historical Society in Topeka in 1967 reported that it has "75,000 volumes and original newspapers," but that it did not have the personnel to make a search for student publications. Quill and Scroll Studies appreciates the cooperation of Professors Elinee Beth and Warren Agee.

This statement appears in <u>Sixty-Two Years of History in the Topeka High School</u>, 1870-1932:

"As early as the Lyceum was organized [1872], a school paper was edited and read before the society by different members of the school. Usually they were entitled with such satirical headings as "The High School Advance," "High School Helmet," "High School Tribune," "High School Times," "High School Advocate," "Lyceum Lantern," and "Washburn Star." These papers were written solely for their

entertainment and contained very little if any historical value.

"The first attempt at a real publication was made in the term 1893-94. The High School Budget Co. issued "The High School Budget." It contained four pages,  $10 \times 12$  inches and was greatly appreciated by the students. The paper was not strictly a high school enterprise as the grade students were interested as well as High School students. Only eight numbers of this little bi-monthly were issued--from October, 1893, to February, 1894.

"No further effort was made in journalistic lines by students until September, 1896. On September 18, "The High School World" made its initial appearance. It was published by the Topeka High School News Co. and edited by a staff chosen from the upper classes. For the first year it contained four pages,  $13 \times 18$  inches in size and resembled a country newspaper in appearance. The next year the magazine form was adopted. The book was nearly square,  $8 \times 10$  inches, and contained eight pages.

"No World was issued in the fall of 1898, but was resumed with renewed vigor in February of 1899. Six more pages were added, making 14 in all. The size was changed to  $6 \times 9$ , the regular book, which it has been ever since. From i896 to 1899 the senior class edited one issue of the World for their class annual. Above taken from Forty Years of History in Topeka High School."

John Harry, Journalism instructor of Cherokee County Community School, reports:

"In 1912 the first newspaper was started here at Columbus High School. It was called the Question Mark because they were not sure it would last. In 1923 the high school became the Cherokee County Community High School and the newspaper became the CCCHS Record. In 1955 the high school became Cherokee County Rural High School and the newspaper became the CCRHS Record."

<u>Note:</u> <u>The English Teacher in Kentucky</u> by Robert Newman Guise recognizes journalism as an incidental or accidental by-product of English teaching. Published in 1964, it is a study of the academic and professional preparation of public high school teachers of English in Kentucky. It makes no significant recommendations for improving requirements for journalism teachers and publication advisers.

Of 2,146 English teachers, only three listed journalism as the area of the first major and two as the area of the second major. In any event, in Kentucky as in most states, leaders in English education accept no responsibility for the teaching of communication in journalism. This is the attitude of NCTE and many national leaders in English education.

<u>Note:</u> In 1967 the compiler and Robert Murphy completed a study entitled "Journalism Activities in Kentucky Public and Non-Public High Schools."

We came to a decision that these would be more useful in a school of education, so we broke off our collection with 1876, and sent a whole carload of the later ones to Columbia University Teachers College. Whether or not they have kept up the collection I do not know. No doubt we do have quite a few such publications before 1876, but unfortunately they are not segregated from the official publications of the schools, so the only way to get at them would be to go through the shelves pamphlet by pamphlet."

#### Foreword

NORTH CAROLINA HIGH SCHOOL PUBLICATIONS SINCE 1900 By Laurence R. Campbell Director, Quill and Scroll Studies - 1974

In 1971 Quill and Scroll Studies published a brief article entitled "School Publications in North Carolina before 1900." To the list should be added "The Guidon," Carolina Military Institute, Maxton.

Commenting on publications since 1900 Professor Walter Spearman in 1965 wrote:

I edited the Central High School yearbook in Charlotte in 1925 (Snips and Cuts) and worked on the high school paper (The Rambler) and they had both been in existence long before I was in high school. I am quite sure the larger cities of the state also had high school newspapers and yearbooks before then.

These lists are published in the hope that those who may have significant data on this subject will make additions and corrections.

For example, the program of the 23rd Annual North Carolina Scholastic Press Institute listed a number of participating schools for which we have no dates of the origin of their student publications.

HIGH SCHOOL PUBLICATIONS IN SOUTH DAKOTA By Laurence R. Campbell Director, Quill and Scroll Studies - 1974

The High School Newspaper, a 31-page booklet by Paul W. Kieser and Mildred E. Yule, in 1922 reported that "there are approximately 35 high schools in the state which are now publishing separate papers containing school news."

"A healthy 94 Per cent of the schools in the state published a newspaper, a yearbook, or both," D. J. Cline reported for the year 1971-72. There were 210 high schools in operation that year in South Dakota.

Published in 1903, the Bear Butte Breezes of Sturgis may have been the first newspaper. Within a decade newspapers or magazines were founded at Lead, Mitchell, Washington High School in Sioux Falls, and Watertown.

The class Book was published in 1899 at Washington High School, Sloux Falls. The Phenom at Brockings appeared in 1909, The Interlakes at Madison in 1913, The Patee at Hot Springs in 1914. Brookings changed its yearbook name from the Phenom to the Bomb in 1918, to the Pheasant in 1926, to the Bobcat in 1930.

In 1967 the Alderman Library University of Virginia reported:

"In spite of an extensive search, we have had little luck in determining the founding derives of the early publications. In the first place, we seem not to have coperate the publications in our collections. Second, what should be valuable sources of information are actually of no real assistance with your question. For example, Morris S. Tischler's <u>A Study of Scholastic Organizations</u> Offering Aid to Publications in the Public White Secondary Schools of Virginia (M.A. thesis, University of Virginia, 1949) includes a section on the history of secondary school publications; but Tischler does not name any early Virginia publications. Similarly, Alvin C. Cooper's <u>A Study of Student Publications</u> in the White Accredited Secondary Public Schools of Virginia (M.A. thesis, 1931) and Donald Miller's <u>A History of the High Schools of Virginia</u> (M.A. thesis, 1928) contain nothing pertinent. Of printed works such books as George C. Wells's <u>Student Publications</u> (New York: A. S. Barnes, 1930) have comments on the history of publications but tend to deal in generalities."

#### Foreword

Bicentennial celebrations may stimulate interest in the origins and heritage of student publications in American secondary schools. Certainly student journalists may take pride in their early newspapers, magazines, and yearbooks. Indeed in-vestigative reporting may provide the basis for timely articles.

Sources of data are back files in the school, alumni, libraries, museums, historical and antiquarian societies, state and national school press organizations. In some instances theses and dissertations have provided information, particularly those before World War II. Quill and Scroll Studies appreciates the cooperation from advisors and these sources.

<u>Note</u>: The cooperation of Warren M. Hazzard, Homer Post, and Howard M. Brier was invaluable in this inquiry. Unfortunately the University of Washington School of Communications discontinued the Pacific Slope School Press which Howard Brier had developed into an outstanding association.

<u>Note</u>: The compiler attended Quincy High School for two years. During his second year he edited "Qu Qu", a handwritten magazine. There were 20 students in the school, 4 in the sophomore class. He took his first journalism course at the University of Washington. In 1950 he spoke at the PSSP conference. In 1960 there were 4,795 students in high school journalism courses.

Note: In 1965 Mrs. James E. Casto of Marshall University, Huntington, wrote: "The United High School Press of West Virginia, itself, was founded in February 1927 by Professor W. Page Pitt. Annual meetings of the state organization were held every year through 1942 and then were resumed on an annual basis bollowing World War II. The members of UHSP are representatives of West Virginia high school newspaper staffs.

"The companion organization, United High School Yearbook Association of West Virginia, however was not formed until 1952. But the West Virginia Journalism Teachers (WVJTA) was organized by the Marshall University Journalism Department in February 1931. Members are advisers of high school yearbooks and newspapers.

"According to Mrs. Ruth Sutherland, Journalism Teacher, Ceredo-Kenova High School, Ceredo, W. Va., her high school has copies of yearbooks published in 1914-15. Mrs. Jack Nichols of Huntington High School, Huntington, W. Va. has the first copy of the school newspaper, The Tatler which is dated November 1909 and was published as a news magazine. Huntington High also has a combined yearbook and newspaper published in 1914. "East Bank High School's newspaper, The Pioneer Post dates back to 1913 under the name The Pioneer Chatterer. The yearbook for East Bank also goes back to 1913 and is entitled The Kanawhan. Mrs. Shirley M. Gilkerson

is the present yearbook adviser."

#### Foreword

Bicentennial celebrations may stimulate interest in the origins and heritage of student publications in American secondary schools. Certainly student journalists may take pride in their early newspapers, magazines, and yearbooks. Indeed investigative reporting may provide the basis for timely articles.

Sources of data are back files in the school, alumni, libraries, museums, historical and antiquarian societies, state and national school press organizations. In some instances theses and dissertations have provided information, particularly those before World War II. Quill and Scroll Studies appreciates the cooperation from advisors and these sources.

<u>Note</u>: Substantial cooperation from R. L. Tottingham, executive secretary of the Wisconsin Journalism Teacher-Adviser Council, accounts for the scope of this inquiry. In preliminary stages in 1965 he wrote:

"<u>The Increscent</u>, Beloit Memorial High School's student newspaper is indeed the oldest in the state in continuous publication. It was founded in 1898. I am sorry I do not have information on the earliest yearbook, although I know that Beloit's is a qualifier here, certainly."

Significant sources also were studies by Mixon, Granberg, and Campbell. Lists of critical service reports in "Scholastic Editor" and "Quill and Scroll" were helpful. Many principals, advisers, and student editors cooperated. Approximately 3,360 students were enrolled in Wisconsin high school journalism courses in 1968.
