TEACHER OF THE YEAR AWARD

Clare Huntington Joseph M. McLaughlin Professor of Law



Clare Huntington is the Joseph M. McLaughlin Professor of Law. She is an expert in the fields of family law and poverty law, publishing widely in both areas, including a monograph, *Failure to Flourish: How Law Undermines Family Relationships*, published by Oxford University Press.

Huntington serves as an associate reporter for the American Law Institute's Restatement of the Law, Children and the Law. Her legal experience includes serving as an attorney advisor in the Justice Department's Office of Legal Counsel as well as clerking for Justice Harry A. Blackmun and Justice Stephen Breyer of the Supreme Court of the United States, Judge Merrick B. Garland of the United States Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit, and Judge Denise Cote of the United States District Court of the Southern District of New York.

She earned her J.D. from Columbia Law School and her B.A. from Oberlin College.

Jordana Alter Confino

Adjunct Professor of Law; Director of Professionalism and Special Projects



Jordana Alter Confino is an adjunct professor of law and the director of professionalism and special projects, overseeing the house system and Fordham Law's professionalism and wellness curricula. In addition to teaching Positive Lawyering and Peer Mentoring & Leadership, Confino has developed a robust series of programs designed to help students cultivate the social, emotional, and professional competencies they will need to flourish in their legal careers.

Confino is an expert in positive psychology and lawyer well-being, and her article "Where Are We on the Path to Law Student Well-Being?" was recently published in the *Journal of Legal Education*. Prior to joining Fordham, she served as a lecturer in law, assistant director of academic counseling, and acting clerkship director at Columbia Law School. She also served as a judicial law clerk for Judge Robert D. Sack of the United States Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit and Judge Paul A. Engelmayer of the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York.

Confino holds a J.D. from Yale Law School, a B.A. in psychology from Yale University, and a Certification in Applied Positive Psychology from the New York Open Center.

EUGENE J. KEEFE AWARD

Cristina Lombardi Class of 2021



Cristina Lombardi is a member of the Fordham Law class of 2021. She has served as the treasurer and vice president of the Student Bar Association, the inter-house professionalism fellow, the symposium editor for the *Fordham Urban Law Journal*, secretary of the Entrepreneurial Society, and a student advisor as part of the Board of Student Advisors program. Lombardi also worked as a legal intern in the Federal Tax Clinic with Professor Elizabeth Maresca. During her 1L summer, she split her time between the Tax Clinic and working as a legal research assistant on corporate matters at Wachtell, Lipton, Rosen & Katz. In the summer after her 2L year, Lombardi was a summer associate at Katten Muchin Rosenman LLP. After graduation, she will join the corporate department at Cooley LLP in New York.

Lombardi received her M.A. in political science, with a concentration in comparative politics, from Villanova University in 2015, and her B.A. in political science and economics from Villanova University in 2014.

DEAN'S MEDAL OF RECOGNITION

Linda Sugin Associate Dean for Academic Affairs; Professor of Law



Linda Sugin has served as the associate dean for academic affairs since 2017. In that role, she focused on students, transforming the Fordham Law School student experience. Sugin guided the Law School's academic program through the pandemic, keeping the academic program strong with substantially reduced inperson capacity.

Fordham Law School's professionalism program reflects Sugin's vision for expanding the scope of legal education to include emotional support, leadership training, and essential skills that are not traditionally included in the law school curriculum. She launched the Law School's two signature professionalism programs, the Peer Mentorship Program and the House System, and created the role of the Director of Professionalism. She oversaw the introduction of a January term for upper-level students, designed to offer students small-credit courses in a condensed time frame. Sugin also conceived the Law School's January orientation, introduced in 2020, for first-year students as a day focused on diversity, equity, and inclusion, and worked with the full-time faculty to add diversity, equity, and inclusion training for faculty.

Under Sugin's leadership, the Law School recruited nine tenure-track faculty members, enriching the school's scholarly profile and curricular offerings, and increasing the gender and racial diversity of the faculty. As chair of a search committee, she recruited Kimathi Gordon-Somers to be the Law School's Assistant Dean of Students and Diversity.

Sugin joined the faculty in 1994 and has taught courses in Federal Taxation, Tax Policy, Nonprofit Organizations, Corporations, Contracts, and Quantitative Methods for Lawyers. She was the 2007 recipient of Fordham Law School's Teacher of the Year Award. Her scholarly interests focus on issues of distributive justice in taxation and the governance of nonprofit organizations. Sugin's works on political philosophy and taxation have been downloaded 20,000 times. Her scholarship draws attention to the way that taxation both reflects what is valued in society and shapes that society.

She has written about nonprofit governance, philanthropy and inequality, and corporate philanthropy. Sugin is co-author of a textbook for the basic course on federal income taxation, The Individual Tax Base. Her op-eds have appeared in the New York Times, and she is regularly quoted in the media on issues of nonprofit governance.

Sugin is a graduate of Harvard College and NYU School of Law, where she began her academic career as an acting assistant professor of law. After law school, Sugin clerked in the Second Circuit Court of Appeals for Chief Judge Wilfred Feinberg and practiced tax law at Fried, Frank, Harris, Shriver and Jacobson. She is a member of the New York bar and the American Law Institute, and a former member of the board of advisors of the National Center on Philanthropy and the Law. **Hillary Rodham Clinton** Former United States Secretary of State



Throughout her long and distinguished career in American public life, Hillary Rodham Clinton has not only made history but also made an impact on personal histories everywhere. As a lawyer, activist, speaker, senator, and diplomat, she has spent decades fighting to empower people—especially children and families—and to bring about a more just and equitable society.

Her passion for social justice was ignited in her childhood when she heard Martin Luther King Jr. speak during a trip to Chicago with her youth ministry. She began her career in law and public service after graduating from Wellesley College and Yale Law School, where she met her future husband, Bill Clinton. After working as a staff attorney with the Children's Defense Fund and as a member of the impeachment inquiry staff in the House of Representatives in 1974, she moved to Arkansas with Bill. In Arkansas, she ran legal clinics serving the disenfranchised, founded one of the state's first child advocacy groups, and championed improvements in health and educational policy during her husband's governorship. Then, as first lady of the United States from 1993 to 2001, she helped to create the Children's Health Insurance Program, which provided coverage to more than 8 million children.

With her election to the U.S. Senate in 2000, Clinton became the first woman to win statewide office in New York. As senator, she helped secure federal funding for rebuilding New York after the 9/11 attacks, worked to secure health care for responders at Ground Zero, and launched initiatives to help New York farms and small businesses find new markets for their products. In 2009, she moved into a new role on the international stage as secretary of state under President Barack Obama. In addition to building a coalition for sanctions that paved the way for the nuclear accord with Iran, she forcefully championed human rights and new opportunities for women and girls, people of color, LGBT people, and young people worldwide. In 2016 she became the first woman to earn a major party's nomination for U.S. president. After the election, she founded Onward Together, an organization devoted to advancing progressive values and bringing about a fairer and more inclusive America. Clinton has also authored several bestselling books, including *It Takes a Village*, focused on how society can help children grow into capable, caring adults.

For all she has done to bring people together and secure the blessings of peace, security, well-being, and opportunity for all, we, the President and Trustees of Fordham University, in solemn convocation assembled and in accord with the chartered authority bestowed on us by the Regents of the University of the State of New York, declare Hillary Rodham Clinton Doctor of Laws, *honoris causa*. That she may enjoy all rights and privileges of this, our highest honor, we have issued these letters patent under our hand and the corporate seal of the University on this, the 22nd day of May in the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty-One. Awards based on academic performance will be announced after final grades are calculated.

THE ABRAHAM ABRAMOVSKY AWARD is presented to a member of the graduating J.D. class in recognition of their outstanding performance in Trial Advocacy.

THE ACTUM FOUNDATION PRIZE is awarded to a graduating LL.M. student who, in the judgment of the administration, has done distinguished work in the Banking, Corporate, and Finance Law Program. The prize was established through the generosity of Pierre Charpie of Switzerland, a 1995 and 1996 graduate of the Fordham LL.M. program.

THE ADJUNCT TEACHER OF THE YEAR AWARD is presented by the Student Bar Association to the adjunct professor selected by students for excellence inside and outside the classroom and for exhibiting the highest level of education to her or his or students.

THE CHAPIN PRIZE is awarded to the student in the graduating J.D. class who has attained the highest weighted average throughout law school. This prize was established in memory of Professor H. Gerald Chapin, who served on the faculty of the Law School from its founding in 1905 until his death in 1920.

THE DAVID F. AND MARY LOUISE CONDON PRIZE is awarded to the J.D. student who attains the highest grade in American Legal History.

THE JOSEPH R. CROWLEY AWARD is presented to the graduating J.D. student who has shown academic achievement and concern for others, as demonstrated by participation in volunteer activities. It is presented in memory of the associate dean and professor of law who served on the faculty from 1957 to 1985. THE MARY DALY PRIZE in legal ethics is awarded to the graduating J.D. student who publishes the most significant writing relating to lawyers' professional responsibility and/or the legal profession. It was established by the directors of the Stein Center for Law and Ethics in memory of their beloved colleague Mary Daly, who directed the Stein Center in the 1980s and '90s.

THE DEAN'S SPECIAL ACHIEVEMENT AWARD is given to a student in the graduating J.D. class who has made a singular and distinctive contribution to the Law School community.

THE JUDY AND DENNIS KENNY FASHION LAW LL.M. AND THE FASHION LAW M.S.L. AWARDS recognize distinguished achievement by students in these unique master's programs. Selection criteria include academic excellence, engagement, and service.

THE JOHN D. FEERICK AWARD IN INTERNATIONAL DISPUTE RESOLUTION was established through the generosity of Dennis Kenny, LAW '61. It is awarded to the graduating LL.M. student in the International Dispute Resolution program who attains the highest cumulative average.

THE FEINGOLD FAMILY PRIZE recognizes a commitment to public service by a graduating J.D. student not only throughout their Fordham Law career but a broader commitment beyond law school through their choice of employment following graduation.

THE BENJAMIN FINKEL PRIZE is awarded to that member of the graduating J.D. class who has excelled in the course in Bankruptcy. It is named in memory of a distinguished alumnus who was long a practitioner in this field, Benjamin Finkel, LAW '27. THE FORDHAM LAW ALUMNI ASSOCIATION MEDAL IN CONSTITUTIONAL LAW is awarded to the member of the graduating J.D. class who excelled in Constitutional Law in their first year.

THE KIMBERLY GREER SINGER AWARD is awarded to a member of the National Moot Court Competition team who possesses outstanding oral advocacy and legal writing skills, as well as demonstrated an interest in teaching or mentoring students.

THE WHITMORE GRAY PRIZE is awarded to the graduating J.D. student who, in the opinion of a committee of the faculty, has been outstanding in courses or activities relating to international law practice. It was established through the generosity of Professor Whitmore Gray, a distinguished visiting professor at Fordham.

THE EMILY C. AND JOHN E. HANSEN AWARD is awarded to the graduating LL.M. student in the Intellectual Property and Information Technology Program who attains the highest cumulative average. It was established in honor of Professor Hugh Hansen's parents.

THE EDWARD J. HAWK PRIZE, established through the generosity of Professor Barry E. Hawk, is awarded to the graduating LL.M. student in the International Business and Trade Law Program who attains the highest cumulative average.

THE HUGH R. JONES AWARD in law and public policy is presented to the student in the graduating J.D. class who has attained the highest combined weighted average in the subjects of Constitutional Law, Criminal Justice, and Professional Responsibility. The prize is named in honor of the distinguished former member of New York's highest court. THE EUGENE J. KEEFE AWARD is presented to the person or organization that has made the most important contribution to the Fordham community. It is presented by the Student Bar Association in memory of a beloved faculty member who served at Fordham from 1926 to 1968.

THE WALTER B. KENNEDY AWARD is presented to a member of the *Fordham Law Review* in recognition of extraordinary service that exemplifies the commitment to legal excellence of Professor Walter B. Kennedy, who served as the *Law Review*'s moderator from 1935 to 1945.

THE JAMES LEITNER AWARD was established by faculty and alumni of the Leitner Center for International Law and Justice. This prize is awarded to the graduating LL.M. student in International Law and Justice who attains the highest cumulative average. It is named for James Leitner, LAW '82, with gratitude for his unparalleled generosity and support for human rights around the world.

THE DONALD MAGNETTI AWARD is presented to a member of the graduating J.D. class in recognition of their outstanding public commitment and contribution to those beyond the Law School community.

THE MICHAEL M. MARTIN AWARD is given to the graduating M.S.L. student with the best grades in the M.S.L. program in Compliance. This award is established in honor of former Dean Michael M. Martin under whose tenure the M.S.L. degree program was conceived and developed.

THE EMMET J. McCORMACK FOUNDATION PRIZE is awarded to the J.D. student who has attained the highest grade in Admiralty Law. THE LAWRENCE J. McKAY PRIZE is awarded to the graduating J.D. students who represented the Law School in the National Moot Court Competition.

THE HONORABLE JOSEPH M. McLAUGHLIN PRIZE is awarded to the J.D. student who attained the highest combined weighted average during their first year. The award is named in honor of Hon. Joseph M. McLaughlin of the United States Court of Appeals.

THE ADDISON M. METCALF LABOR LAW PRIZE is awarded to the student in the graduating J.D. class who has received the highest grade in the basic Labor Law course. The prize was created in honor of Mr. Addison Metcalf, a longtime member of the Law School's administrative staff.

THE HENRIETTA METCALF PRIZE is awarded to the student in the graduating J.D. class who has received the highest grade in Contracts.

THE KEITH C. MILLER MEMORIAL AWARD is presented to a member of the graduating J.D. class who has demonstrated unselfish dedication to the Fordham Moot Court program. It is named in memory of Keith Miller, who was the managing editor of the Moot Court Board in 1986–87.

THE ADELE MONACO MEMORIAL AWARD is presented to a member of the graduating J.D. class in the evening division who has made a positive impact on the lives of evening division students through the demonstration of compassion, courage, determination, and commitment to public service.

THE ANN MOYNIHAN AWARD is presented to a member of the graduating J.D. class in recognition of their outstanding performance in the Law School's Clinical Program. THE MONSIGNOR JAMES J. MURRAY PRIZE FOR ACHIEVEMENT IN PUBLIC SERVICE is given to a graduating Fordham Law School J.D. student who is committed to a career in public service. The prize was established through a generous gift from James J. Houlihan, GABELLI '74, Christie L. Houlihan, LAW '11, and the Houlihan family. Just as Monsignor Murray exemplified the Fordham Law motto, "In the service of others," it is the hope of the Houlihan family that the recipients of this prize will commit their professional lives to public service.

THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF WOMEN LAWYERS OUTSTANDING LAW STUDENT AWARD is presented to the outstanding J.D. graduate who has demonstrated academic achievement, contributed to the advancement of women in society, promoted issues and concerns of women in the legal profession, and earned the respect of the Law School community.

THE PETER J. O'CONNOR PRIZE is awarded to the J.D. student with the highest weighted average in courses in Evidence and New York Practice. It is named in memory of Professor O'Connor, a 1956 graduate of the school, who taught at Fordham Law for 15 years until his death in 1988.

THE PARCHOMOVSKY-SIEGELMAN STUDENT GRADUATION PRIZE is awarded to the graduating student who produced the best work of scholarship published in one of Fordham Law School's journals.

THE THOMAS F. REDDY JR. PRIZE is awarded to the graduating J.D. student with the highest grades in courses in intellectual property. It is presented in memory of Thomas F. Reddy Jr., a 1941 graduate of the School, who was a senior partner in the firm of Penine & Edmond and a widely respected authority in this field of law. THE ROBERT ARAM RENZULLI PRIZE IN CRIMINAL LAW, in the amount of \$1,000, is presented to the graduating J.D. student who has excelled in the area of criminal law during their three years at Fordham Law School and who intends to engage in public service criminal law work upon graduating. The prize is supported by the Renzulli Charitable Trust and Kevin and Jeanine O'Brien.

THE JORENE FRANKL ROBBIE '79 MEMORIAL LEGAL RESEARCH PRIZE is presented to a graduating student who has demonstrated excellence in the Advanced Legal Research program.

THE ROBERT SCHUMAN PRIZE, established through the generosity of the late Professor Roger Goebel, is awarded to the graduating LL.M. student who has achieved the highest grades in courses in European Union law. The prize is named in honor of the distinguished former prime minister of France, who was one of the leading statesmen inspiring the creation of the European Union.

THE SENIOR PRIZE is awarded to the students in each division of the graduating J.D. class who attain the highest weighted average throughout the year.

THE TEACHER OF THE YEAR AWARD is presented by the Student Bar Association to the professor students identify as being a master teacher. THE WILLIAM MICHAEL TREANOR AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN U.S. LAW STUDIES is named for former Fordham Law School Dean William Michael Treanor and is awarded to the graduating LL.M. student in the U.S. Law Program who attains the highest cumulative average. Established through the generosity of Professor Thomas Lee and Assistant Dean Toni Jaeger-Fine, this award recognizes the extraordinary contributions made by Dean Treanor to the development of the Law School's LL.M. and international programs.
