Child Nursing

Entry criteria 300 UCAS points

- BTEC Extended Diploma/ ND in N & M or Applied Science at D/D/M,
- A levels A maximum of 3 A levels, inc. one at grade B
- Access to Nursing and Midwifery pass inc. 24 Level 3 units in human biology, general science, chemistry and physics) with 18 distinction level
- Plus 6 GCSEs, grade C or above with 2 subjects at grades A or B, inc. Maths, English and Science. Access GCSEs tbc



Adult, Learning Disability, Mental Health Nursing

Entry criteria 280 UCAS points

- A levels Minimum of 2 A levels, inc. two at grade C
- BTEC Extended Diploma/ ND in Health & Social Care or Applied Science at D/M/M,
- Access to N and M, Science or Applied Science pass
- Plus 5 GCSEs, grade C or above, inc. Maths, English and Science – GCSE requirements with Access tbc





Midwifery

Entry criteria 300 UCAS points

BTEC Extended Diploma/ ND in N & M or Applied Science at D/D/M,

A levels - A maximum of 3 A levels, inc. one at grade B

Access to Nursing and Midwifery pass inc. 24 Level 3 units in human biology, general science, chemistry and physics) with 18 distinction level

Plus 6 GCSEs, grade C or above with 2 subjects at grades A or B, inc. Maths, English and Science. Plan to ask for the same for Access tbc





Nursing and Midwifery

Other considerations

- Certain subjects limited or excluded from entry tariff, such as A level General Studies, and limited study skills units in Access courses (check prospectus)
- Entry to all are by interview
- Declaration form and DBS clearance is required for the profession
- Occupational Health clearance is required
- Dual registration is an option in Nursing





Nursing and Midwifery

Comments

- Number of student places are fixed externally by the East Midlands Learning and Education Training Board (EMLETB)
- Entry to both Nursing and Midwifery is competitive, particularly in child nursing and midwifery
- Number of interview days are limited due to practitioner presence being required at every interview
