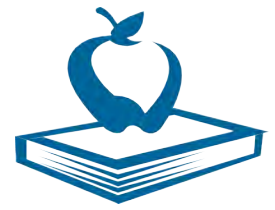

BSA has more trainings than you can shake a stick at (*but please don't- it might run afoul of item 14 on BSA's list of prohibited activities*) however there are three really important things about training you need to remember:

## 1. You must be BSA registered

## 2. Youth Protection Training (YPT) & Hazardous Weather MUST RENEW EVERY TWO (2) YEARS

## 3. Position Specific trainings and most other trainings do not expire

### Quick Look

#### Cub Scout

- **YPT (online) 1 hr.**
- Hazardous Weather (online/ renew every 2 years) 1 hr.
- Combined Cub Leader Position Specific (online or classroom) 4 -6 hr.  
[Cubmaster/Assist. Cubmaster; Pack Committee/Chair] **or** [Den Leader/Assist. Den Leader]
- BALOO (optional but required for unit camping) (classroom & camp setting overnight) 1 ½ days

#### Scouts BSA

- **YPT (online) 1 hr.**
- Hazardous Weather (online/ renew every 2 years) 1 hr.
- Combined Scouts BSA Leader Position Specific (online or classroom) 4 -5 hr.  
[Scoutmaster/Assist Scoutmaster] **or** [Troop Committee/Chair] **or** [Merit Badge Counselor]
- IOLS (classroom/camp setting overnight) 1 ½ days

#### Venturing & Sea Scouts

- **YPT (online) 1 hr.**
- Hazardous Weather (online/ renew every 2 years) 1 hr.
- Combined **Venturing** Leader Position Specific (online or classroom) 4-5 hr.  
[Crew Advisor/Assoc Advisor] **or** [Crew Committee/Chair]
- Combined **Sea Scout** Leader Position Specific (online or classroom) 2 hr.  
[Skipper/Mate] **or** [Ship Committee & Chair]

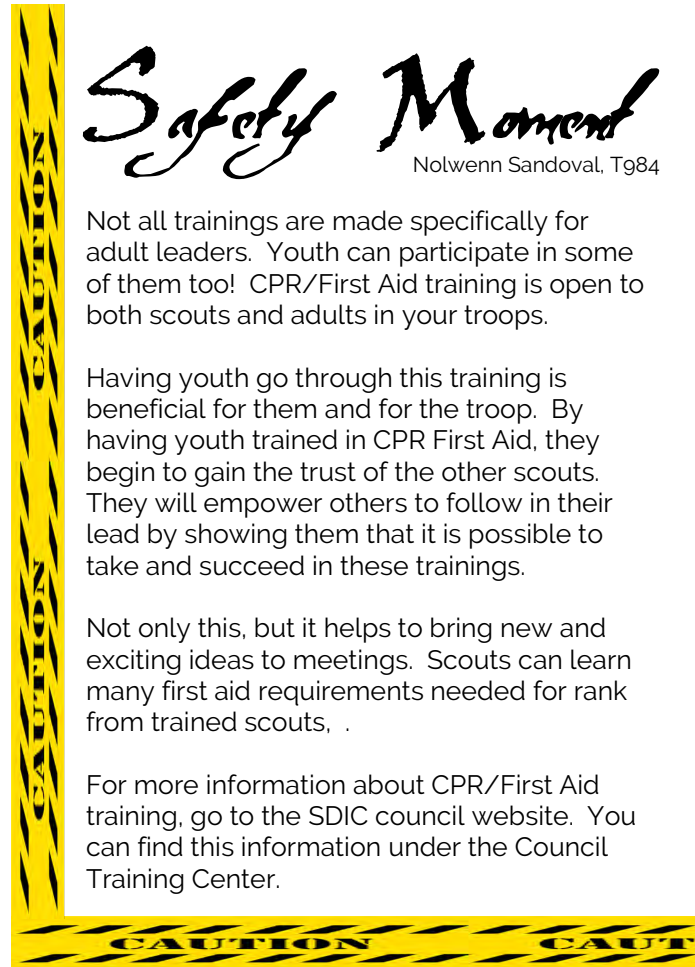

Not only this, but it helps to bring new and exciting ideas to meetings. Scouts can learn many first aid requirements needed for rank from trained scouts, .

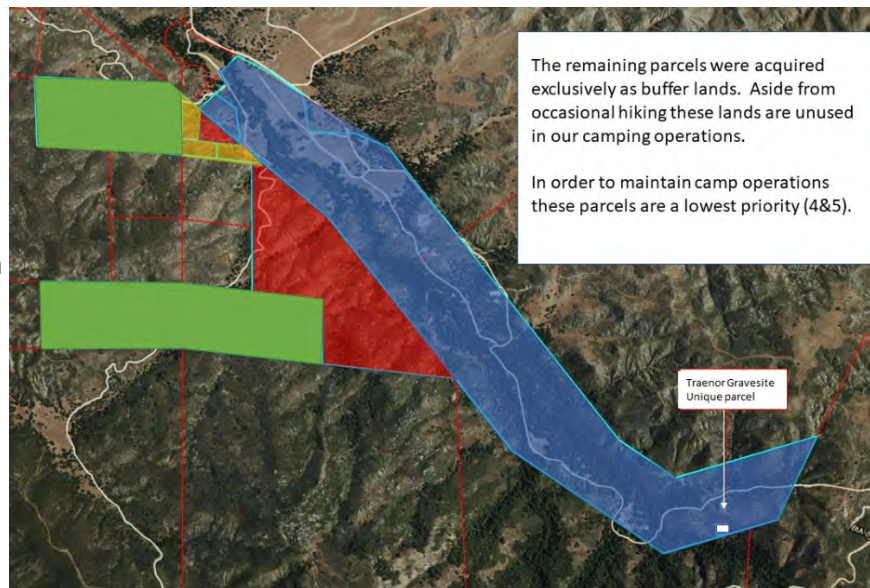

# Council Update



In the letter that went out August 19, 2021 regarding the National Bankruptcy Settlement, it was announced that the local contribution from San Diego – Imperial Council is to be \$2,408,700.80. Our Board has chosen to make our contribution via used property only. We have identified several parcels of land owned by the council that we plan to contribute (shown **in green** to the right). All of these parcels are surplus buffer land west of and adjacent to the Mataguay Scout Reservation (in blue) and are not necessary for our core programs at this time or in the foreseeable future. We feel that this is the best course of action to meet our commitment to the settlement while maintaining our council's ability to deliver Scouting programs as we have been doing.

	<b>Position-Specific Leader Training</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Available for every position</li> <li>Can be completed online or at certain in-person events</li> <li>Once complete, leader can wear "Trained" patch on uniform</li> </ul>
	<b>University of Scouting</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Held annually by San Diego-Imperial Council</li> <li>Full day offering training to leaders in all programs at all levels</li> <li>Frequently has position-specific training available</li> </ul>
	<b>Cub Scout Pow Wow</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Held annually by San Diego-Imperial Council</li> <li>Full day offering training to Cub Scout leaders</li> <li>Frequently has position-specific training available</li> </ul>
	<b>Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation (BALOO)</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>2-day overnight course introducing the Cub Scout outdoor program</li> <li>Held periodically by San Diego-Imperial Council</li> <li>A BALOO-trained leader <b>must</b> be present at all overnight activities</li> </ul>
	<b>Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Training for Volunteers</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Brand new training</li> <li>Offered online at <a href="http://my.scouting.org">my.scouting.org</a></li> <li>Teaches how to support diverse youth and make all feel welcome</li> </ul>
	<b>Wood Badge</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Advanced leadership course for fully trained, registered BSA leaders</li> <li>5-day course held over two weekends, with up to 18-month follow-up</li> <li>Next two opportunities: Fall 2022, Fall 2023 (dates TBA)</li> </ul>
	<b>Pack Trainer</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Unit-level position</li> <li>Promotes training opportunities &amp; stays current with requirements</li> <li>Primary objective is to have 100% of pack leaders fully trained</li> </ul>

### B.A.L.O.O.

*Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation*

- Introductory training for Cub Scout leaders who will be taking Scouts camping
- A BALOO-trained leader must be present at any overnighter
- Combines previous BALOO training and Outdoor Leader Skills for Webelos Leaders

- Be better prepared to plan and lead Webelos den and pack overnight events
- Learn how to make camping fun!
- Focus on safety
- Learn to plan an event that is firmly rooted in Cub Scouting's principles

- Two components:
  - Online portion available 24/7 in the BSA Learning Center; must be completed prior to in-person portion
  - Practical, hands-on 1.5-day overnight course
