Chairman Breeden will testify before the House Subcommittee on Appropriations on Tuesday, March 27, beginning at 10:00 a.m. The hearing, on the Commission's budget request for 1991, will be in Room H-310 of the United States Capitol Building.

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

FIVE INDICTED

The Philadelphia Regional Office and the U.S. Attorney's Office for the Western District of Pennsylvania announced that on February 22 an 87-count indictment for tax and mail fraud was returned against Thomas J. Reilly, Philip H. Joyce, Edward P. Zemprelli, Frank P. Wayhart and James C. Chotiner. The individual defendants are former officers of, professionals retained by, or salesmen for Earned Capital Corporation (ECC) and several affiliated companies. Edward G. Krall and Nichols Hrkman, also formerly associated with ECC, were named as unindicted co-conspirators. The indictment alleges, among other things, that from 1976 to 1986, Reilly, Joyce, Zemprelli, Wayhart and Chotiner conspired to defraud approximately 2500 investors of more than \$57 million by selling investments falsely described as depreciable real estate. The indictment further alleges that the defendants conspired to prepare false documents for use in IRS audits, and, by providing investors with fraudulent tax forms, induced investors to underpay federal income taxes. On June 14, 1989, the Commission filed a civil action against these defendants, and others, alleging violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws. [United States v. Thomas J. Reilly, Philip H. Joyce, Edward P. Zemprelli, Frank P. Wayhart and James C. Chotiner, USDC WDPA, Crim. No. 90-42] (LR-12418)

STUART A. GODFREY PERMANENTLY ENJOINED

The Commission announced that on March 22, 1990, it filed a Complaint in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York against Stuart A. Godfrey alleging that Godfrey violated Sections 10(b) and 14(e) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Exchange Act Rules 10b-5 and 14e-3. The Commission alleged that, while in possession of material nonpublic information regarding Grand Metropolitan PLC's intention to conduct a tender offer for shares of The Pillsbury Company, Godfrey purchased, and recommended to others the purchase of, call option contracts on the common stock of Pillsbury. The Commission alleged that Godfrey realized profits of \$14,221.23 from his trading.

Without admitting or denying the allegations of the Complaint, Godfrey consented to the entry of a Final Judgment permanently enjoining him from violating Sections 10(b) and 14(e) of the Exchange Act and Exchange Act Rules 10b-5 and 14e-3, requiring him to disgorge \$14,221.23, plus interest, requiring him to pay a civil penalty of \$14,221.23, and requiring him to cooperate with the Commission in any matters relating to trading in Pillsbury securities. ALIC CORPORATION, OTHERS SUBJECT TO TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER

The Fort Worth Regional Office announced that Chief Judge Tom Stagg, Western District of Louisiana, today issued a temporary restraining order prohibiting further offers and sales, and freezing certain assets and bank accounts in response to a complaint filed by the Commission against ALIC Corporation (ALIC), Glen D. McCart, T.A. Robinson, Mike LeBlanc, and James D. Callicott. The Complaint alleges defendants violated the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. The Complaint also alleges all defendants but ALIC violated the broker-dealer registration provisions. The Commission seeks permanent injunctions, a freeze of assets, other relief, and appointment of a receiver for ALIC.

The Commission's Complaint alleges that from 1987 to the present, defendants raised over \$17 million from over 1,000 investors, mostly senior citizens residing in the Southwest; and offered and sold unregistered securities through a telemarketing boiler room operation. It is also alleged defendants made untrue statements of material facts and omitted to state material facts concerning the risks and returns, guaranteed nature of the securities and financial condition of ALIC. A hearing is scheduled today on the Commission's request for a receiver for ALIC and on April 16 for a preliminary injunction. [SEC v. ALIC Corporation, Glen D. McCart, T.A. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

U.S. BOSTON INVESTMENT COMPANY

A conditional order has been issued on an application filed by U.S. Boston Investment Company (Fund), U.S. Boston Investment Management Corporation, and U.S. Boston Capital Corporation (collectively, Applicants) exempting Applicants from Sections 18(f)(1),

18(g), and 18(i) of the Investment Company Act to the extent that the Fund's issuance and sale of a new class of shares would be deemed: (1) to result in a "senior security" under Section 18(g) and be prohibited by Section 18(f)(1); or (2) to violate the requirement of Section 18(i) that every share of stock issued by a registered management investment company have equal voting rights with every other outstanding share of such stock. (Rel. IC-17388 - Mar. 20)

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

Proposed rule changes have been filed by: American Stock Exchange (SR-Amex-90-01) to prescribe the operating procedures for Amex's Intra-Day Comparison System for processing uncompared equity transactions (Rel. 34-27809); and New York Stock Exchange (SR-NYSE-90-09) to amend the list of rule violations subject to its Rule 476A minor rule violation enforcement and reporting plan.
