



Weekday School

On Monday, April 18, the 2nd Pres staff traveled to Bernheim Forest, about 30 minutes outside of the city. If you have never been, Bernheim Forest is an arboretum and research forest with over 16,000 acres of diverse species of trees. It was originally bought and cultivated as a gift to the Commonwealth of Kentucky by Isaac Bernheim in 1929. His vision was that it

would be a place where people could connect with and experience nature and art together. For the teachers and administrators of 2nd Pres. Weekday School, Bernheim Forest was an idyllic setting for gathering outside of school for a time of impactful learning together. Our training focused on how children's play experiences, as well as daily challenges, provide them the opportunities they need to build important and necessary life skills. Play is spoken about often by the Weekday School: like other components of healthy living, such as sleep and exercise, it is emphasized for its importance. When children are provided time, space and materials to purely play, they are able to practice the important and necessary skills they need to become joyful, self-assured, independent, resilient, thoughtful, satisfied (and the list goes on!) adults. At 2nd Pres, we call these traits & abilities "lifelong learner" skills. They include qualities such as patience, persistence, flexibility, problem-solving, reflection, and compromise. When children are overscheduled or much is done for them, opportunities to practice and build these lifelong learner skills can be missed. We can help balance this by guarding the time children have for self-directed, intrinsically motivated and freely chosen play.

During our discussions together as a staff, we looked closely at our role as educators in children's play, conflict resolution and productive struggle. It was important for us to remember to be mindful of how often we are intervening in our students' engagement with materials, ideas and each other. If we jump in to help solve, fix or direct frequently, the message sent to children is that they should rely more on adults than on themselves. Instead, we watch, wonder and wait. We give children space to come up with responses to their challenges, further building that strong sense of self within them. And if they need guidance, we do so not by taking away the obstacle or telling them exactly what to do. Instead, we provide children with the "just right" amount of support and the belief that they are capable and then knowing when to step back again. In the end, we

want our school to be a place adults remember feeling known, respected and empowered when they were 2nd Pres kids.

SLCM serves our neighbors in zip codes 40118, 40208, 40209, 40214, and 40215 during their greatest time of need to prevent their crisis from turning into catastrophe. Our community extends to more than 80,000 people and struggles with the second highest poverty rates in Louisville but we believe that through collaboration and kinship, we can be that compassionate home base to everyone.

As we are entering the third year of the pandemic, unfortunately, direct service providers are stretched thin after two years of going well beyond normal capacity but the urgency we once felt as a nation, no longer exists. Funding for financial assistance is, once again, becoming limited. SLCM continues to receive a tidal wave of assistance requests every day. Citywide COVID funding has now ended, but we move forward with a focus on collaboration, advocacy, and compassionate connection. As one client stated, "Without SLCM, there would be times when I wouldn't have had food or my LG&E would have turned off. It isn't always about getting help but it's taking the time to respond when requested and the willingness to listen and work through situations." Emergency Aid for Ukraine

The current Russian invasion that started on February 24 follows eight years of conflict between Russia and Ukraine. Hundreds of thousands of people across the country are enduring bombings and assault by Russian military forces; and have lost power, been cut off from water and fuel. As people head toward the western regions, there is a shortage of food and other basic supplies.

In the midst of the chaos, Presbyterian Disaster Assistance is working with sibling churches and ecumenical partners who are already providing assistance with basic items for survival. Initial assistance being provided includes shelter, food, clothing, blankets, baby food and diapers, other hygiene supplies, flashlights and candles, generators and fuel.

Our first priority is to provide funding to these partners on the ground. Our response to the situation in Ukraine will include both financial and technical assistance as the network of faith communities providing humanitarian assistance grows in the months ahead. The needs for the response will be great.




