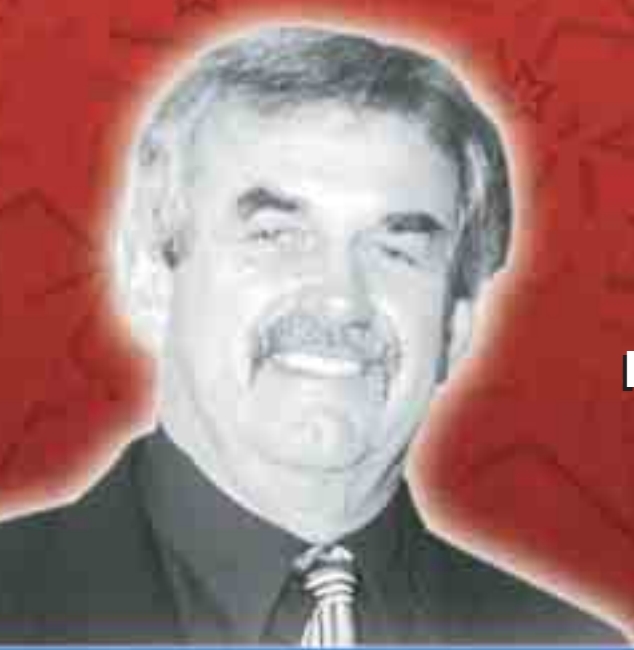

DR. FRANK C. McCUE, III SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by the Virginia High School Coaches Association

The Dr. Frank C. McCue, III Scholarship is named in honor of Dr. Frank McCue, III, an orthopedic surgeon and team physician at the University of Virginia. He is nationally known as an innovator in the field of sports medicine. He was a pioneer in this field and has treated athletes from "benchers to Hall of Famers" with equal professionalism and kind care.

Dr. McCue has treated and cared for athletes and coaches in Virginia for the past 40 years.

The VHSCA will award two scholarships annually in the amount of \$1,000 to two graduates of a Virginia accredited high school(s).

The first scholarship will be awarded to a student that will enter into the field of sports medicine, athletic training, or sports physical therapy.

The second scholarship will be awarded to a student that wishes to go into one of the above careers or into the field of coaching.

These will be awarded to a student who meets these criteria:

Applicants for either scholarship must not be receiving an athletic grant of more than one half the cost.

Each applicant must complete the application below, and the following:

(1) Submit an essay on how sports have influenced his or her life and his or her desire to pursue the fields of sports medicine or coaching as a career.

(2) Submit letters of recommendation from his or her high school coach and from his or her guidance counselor.

(3) Submit a copy of his or her high school transcript.

(4) Applicants are required to have been a member of a sports team as a player, a trainer's assistant, or manager.

All applicants will be notified after the scholarship recipients are selected. The \$1,000 will be credited to the account of the winners at the university or college he or she will be attending.

JIMMIE BRYAN SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by the Virginia High School Coaches Association



This grant is named for Jimmie Bryan, who has provided outstanding leadership to our Association.

The intent of the Scholarship is to provide \$1,000 for two young athletes who are graduating from a Virginia High School League member school and who intend to teach and coach in Virginia. The recipients must not receive any financial assistance through his athletic participation in college.

Candidates must earn a minimum of six Varsity Athletic Letter awards in high school and the Scholarship will be competitive based on the Grade Point Average of the applicants. If three or more candidates meet all the qualifications and have the same Grade Point Average, then the tied applicants must submit a 500 word essay entitled "Why I Want to Coach in a Virginia High School League Member School." This essay will be evaluated by the Scholarship Committee of the VHSCA and the winner will be selected. The \$1,000 will be credited to the account of the recipients at the Virginia College or University of his choice.

To be eligible for the scholarship, one must:

- A. Be a graduate of a **Virginia High School League** member school.
- B. Attend a college or university within the State of Virginia.

- C. Earn six (6) Varsity letters in athletics.
- D. Plan to teach and coach in a Virginia High School League member school. (No penalty if one does not).
- E. Not receive any financial assistance in college as a direct result of athletic participation.

The competitive aspects of the scholarship include:

- A. The three applicants with the highest final grade point average will be the winners. An official transcript must accompany the preliminary application and a final official transcript must be submitted as soon as possible.
- B. If three or more applicants have the same grade point average through seven (7) semesters; (9th Grade, 10th Grade, 11th Grade and 1st semester 12th Grade) the finalist must write a 500 word essay entitled, "Why I Want to Coach in a Virginia High School League Member School."

This essay must be submitted on high school stationery and must be hand written. The scholarship committee of the Virginia High School Coaches' Association will make the final decision after reviewing the essays.

DEADLINES

May 1st—This application and an official transcript submitted.

June 1st—Finalists will be notified by Scholarship Committee.

June 15th—Finalists must submit 500 word essay "Why I Want to Coach in a Virginia High School League Member School." Verification of sixth Varsity letter award must be submitted.

July—Recipient will be announced and scholarship awarded at Virginia High School Coaches' Association Clinic.

There is never a shortage of fun in Hampton Roads center attraction! There are more than

100 area attractions within minutes of us. Your family is sure to enjoy the new *Adventures in Flight Gallery* at the **Virginia Air & Space Center**, **The Cousteau Society**, the **Hampton History Museum**, **Bass Pro Shops** and much more.

Surrounding area attractions include **Colonial Williamsburg**, **Virginia Beach**, **Busch Gardens**, harbor tours on the largest natural harbor in the world, and water sports on the Chesapeake Bay. Our region is rich in colonial, Civil War, African American and aviation history!



The Virginia Air and Space Museum exhibits many of NASA's most dramatic space artifacts, including the Apollo 12 Command Module, a Viking Mars Lander, satellites, space suits, and moon rocks. The center also houses a dozen aircraft, the Hampton Roads History Center, and southeastern Virginia's only IMAX theater.



Hampton Attractions

AIR POWER PARK

Learn about Hampton's space and aviation history by touring the outdoor air and spacecraft displays, model airplane collection and wind tunnel exhibit at Air Power Park. Home to one of the largest civilian-owned collections of aircraft and missiles in the United States, Air Power Park contains aircraft from the country's various service branches, including a Nike surface-to-air missile, a P-1127 Kestrel vertical-lift jet and an F-100D Super Sabre, the first Air Force fighter with true supersonic performance.

BASS PRO SHOPS (OUTDOOR WORLD)

Located at Pine Chapel Road and I-64, Bass Pro Shops® Outdoor World® is much more than a hunting and fishing store, Bass Pro Shops also offers equipment for hiking, backpacking, camping, outdoor cooking and more. Shoppers will also find outdoor apparel for men, women and children, along with a fine selection of casual and athletic footwear. A gift and nature shop serves up a wide variety of outdoor-related items from lamps and dishes to bird feeders and furniture.

Unique exterior and interior motifs have branded Bass Pro Shops stores as Visually appealing, high quality outdoor stores. The outdoor feel is brought indoors through massive log and rock work, aquariums and water features, as well as an extensive collections of fish and wildlife exhibits all helping to maximize the experience of the outdoor enthusiast.

A large atrium inside showcases an impressive 30' rock mountain climbing wall, fashioned to resemble a rock bluff from the Roanoke Valley. A cascading waterfall tumbles down into a 19,000-gallon aquarium stocked with striped bass, catfish and crappie. The aquarium is also home to lunker largemouth bass. Trees plus other plants and wildlife native to Virginia can be seen on the rock ledges and crevices.

BEACHES AND FISHING

Buckroe Beach, located along Hampton's Chesapeake Bay shoreline, is a popular family beach. The beach officially opens Memorial Day weekend and closes Labor Day weekend. Lifeguards are on duty during the official season. Visitors are invited to enjoy the playground, in-water craft available for rent, guided beach explorer programs. Don't miss the evening entertainment on Tuesdays and Sundays during the summer season.

Grandview Nature Preserve and Beach, located off Beach Road, is ideal for wildlife observations, ecological studies and hiking. Grandview's 578 acres of marshland include a beach that stretches for more than two miles. Educational tours and guided canoe/kayak excursions through the preserve are offered.

Charter fishing boats depart from Down Hampton Public Piers, the foot of King Street, Salt Ponds Marina and Wallace's Marina at Dandy Point for excursions on the Chesapeake Bay. Several head boats offer fishing excursions and charters year-round.

HAMPTON HISTORY MUSEUM

Opened in May 2003, the Hampton History Museum interprets Hampton's unique past spanning from its inhabitation by the Kecoughtan Indians to the 20th century and the city's role as the birthplace of American space program. The center's ten galleries spotlight events in the city's history including the arrival of Captain John Smith and the first settlers, the demise of Blackbeard the Pirate, and the emergence of Hampton's seafood industry, establishing the city as "Crabtown." A changing gallery on the second floor hosts visiting historic and pop culture exhibits. The museum also houses the Hampton Visitor Center.

MISS HAMPTON II HARBOR CRUISES

A double-decked tour boat, the Miss Hampton II carries passengers out to the Hampton Roads harbor and Chesapeake Bay. On this narrated tour, visitors will cruise past Blackbeard's Point, Hampton University, Old Point Comfort and the Norfolk Naval Base, where they'll get a look at the mighty ships and submarines berthed at the world's largest naval base. A highlight of the cruise is a stop at Fort Wool, where passengers disembark for a guided tour of this island fortification.

VIRGINIA AIR & SPACE CENTER

The official visitor center for NASA Langley Research facilities, the Virginia Air & Space Center and Hampton Roads History Center houses a spectacular collection of flight- and space-related artifacts, interactive exhibits, historical displays and a giant-screen, 3-D IMAX® Theater. Visitors can see a three-billion-year-old moon rock, collected during the Apollo 17 mission; the Apollo 12 Command Module that journeyed to the moon and back; and a replica of the Lunar Orbiter, which mapped the moon's surface for future landings. The Cosmic Café offers food and be sure to browse the gift shop.

Unveiled in time to celebrate the Centennial of Flight (2003), the Adventures in Flight gallery offers a 15,000 square foot expansion which highlights commercial, civil and military aviation while exploring the origins of flight. A section tells the Wright Brothers' story through a series of interactive exhibits such as a full-scale reproduction of the Wright Flyer, the Wright Brothers' Bicycle Shop, a wind tunnel exhibit and a Wing Warper component.

The gallery's Commercial and Civil Aviation area features a full-size DC-9 with flight simulator. Check out the Test Flight Pre-show Theater, Flying Lab simulator, Propulsion Mini-Theater and A Day in the Life of a Suitcase. The Air Traffic Control area displays a real-time electronic map of North America showing all aircraft in flight. The Air Power Over Hampton Roads allows adventurous minds to build airplanes and a B-24 motion simulator provides the first-person experience of a World War II bomber.

GENERAL CRITERIA

Nominees must exemplify the highest standards of sportsmanship, ethical conduct, moral character, and carry the endorsement of their respective high school.

The categories of athlete, coach, and contributor are included on the nomination form for expediency in understanding the primary area in which an individual is to be considered for their achievements in interscholastic athletics and activities. The grouping is for screening purposes only and to assist those making the nominations in understanding the type of information required. Once nominees are inducted, they are not categorized, but all are recognized as members of the Virginia High School Hall of Fame.

To further explain, athletes would be former student participants who are being nominated for their achievements in interscholastic athletics. Coaches would be considered on the merits of their high school coaching achievements only. A contributor would be an individual who has made a contribution to interscholastic athletics or activities in some capacity other than those previously mentioned, including such areas as administration, sports, medicine, sports media, official, activities sponsor or participant, etc.

All candidates will be judged on their significant and/or long term contribution to interscholastic athletics and activities. While many have served their school and local programs over a long and distinguished career, their accomplishments must have been worthy of state recognition for them to be considered. Longevity, without meaningful state impact, does not constitute appropriate credentials for hall of fame consideration.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- (a) Coaches being considered must be retired or deceased with at least 20 years service in Virginia at a member school(s) or have served 25 years at a member school(s) and still actively coaching. Persons nominated as a contributor to the VHSL must meet similar criteria for a comparable period of time. If the candidate is a coach, the candidate must be a member of the Virginia State High School Coaches Association
- (b) Athletes are eligible for nomination 5 years after their high school graduation. Their nomination initially will be placed in a Inactive Category; 10 years after their high graduation, they will be placed in the Active Category and brought before the Screening Committee for consideration in the Hall of Fame.

METHODS OF NOMINATION

- (a) Any VHSCA member in good standing or VHSL member school may nominate.
- (b) The nominating deadline in Oct. 31, in the year prior to the year of induction.
- (c) No individual may make more than one nomination per year.
- (d) Nominations for candidates not selected shall remain open for consideration each of the next two years but will no longer be considered thereafter unless a new renomination is submitted.

2008 19th HOF Class features 11 inductees, the most since the Class of 1994

coaches

ROGER BERGEY

Harrisonburg High School



In 30 years (1972-2002) as head boys basketball coach at Harrisonburg High School, Roger Bergey amassed 435 wins, two VHSL Group AA state basketball championships, six region championships and numerous district titles. Under his guidance, the Ralph Sampson-era at Harrisonburg produced back-to-back state titles in 1978 and 1979. He also coached the most sought after high school player in the nation during the 1978-79 season. The protective "Recruitment Guidelines" he established during Sampson's recruitment by college coaches are still being used today by the NCAA and its member schools. In addition to coaching basketball,

Bergey served as the Blue Streaks athletic director for 13 years. He also worked tirelessly in leadership positions within the VHSCA, VIAAA and VHSL serving as director of the Group AA football championships for over 10 years and director of district and regional boys and girls basketball tournaments for 12 years. Bergey began his coaching career at Patrick Henry High School in Ashland (1963-68) as head boys basketball, baseball and JV football coach before moving to Varina High School (1968-72) as assistant boys basketball, baseball and JV football coach. He retired in 2002 but is still active in the VHSCA serving on the Legislative Council; the Executive Committee; Chairman of the All Star Games Committee and Hall of Fame Committee.

SHELLEY BLUMENTHAL

Blacksburg High School



In 16 years as the head boys soccer coach at Blacksburg High School (1992-2007), Shelley Blumenthal established a powerhouse program that captured eight VHSL Group AA boys soccer championships (1993, 1995, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2002, 2005 and 2007); four state runner-up finishes (1992, 2001, 2003, 2006); plus 14 regional championships and 16 district titles. He compiled a 313-20-14 overall record and his 93.9 winning percentage is the second best in NSCAA (National Soccer Coaches Association of America) history. Under his guidance, his Blacksburg players were just as impressive in the classroom as on the field, earning seven NSCAA Team Academic Awards with a team GPA of 3.25 or higher. In addition to his numerous coach of the year awards, which included being named the National Boys Small Public Coach of the Year by the NSCAA in 2007, Blumenthal produced 27 first-team all-state

players, 13 second-team all-state players and three NSCAA Scholar all-Americans. He came to Blacksburg in 1990 and spent two years as the assistant boys soccer coach and goalkeepers coach helping the Bruins to back-to-back regional titles and a Group AA runner-up finish. He has served on numerous VHSCA and NSCAA committees during his career. He currently works at the Roanoke Valley Governor's School and is a volunteer assistant coach with the Roanoke College men's soccer team.

THOMAS JONES

Powell Valley High School



Thomas Jones led Powell Valley to back-to-back VHSL football championships in 1994-95. In leading the Vikings to two state titles, he finished his prolific football career first and third in the VHSL record book in single-season rushing with 3,319 yards as a junior and 3,007 yards during his senior year. He also finished first in single-game rushing with 462 yards, first in career touchdowns with 104, second in single-season scoring with 296 points and second in both career scoring (638 points) and career rushing yards (7,193 yards). In addition, he guided

Powell Valley to a VHSL track championship and was named the Gatorade High School Player of the Year in Virginia following his senior year. Jones continued his football career at the University of Virginia where he holds 15 UVA records and 10 ACC records. He was a consensus all-America in 1999, a Doak Walker Award finalist and was a first-team all-ACC running back as a junior and senior. Following his final year at Virginia, Jones was the seventh overall pick in the 2000 NFL draft by the Arizona Cardinals. As a Chicago Bear in 2006, he gained over 1,000 yards rushing and in Super Bowl XLIII he rushed for 123 yards against the Colts. He joined the New York Jets in 2007 and will be entering his eighth NFL season in 2008.

MEGAN McCARTHY

James W. Robinson Secondary School



One of the most celebrated women's soccer players in U.S. history, Megan McCarthy was a two-time NSCAA (National Soccer Coaches Association of America) high school all-American. Twice named first team all-state, she was the Virginia High School Player of the Year in 1984 and was a first-team Washington Post all-Met selection four times. In addition, she earned first-team all-district and all-region honors all four years at James Robinson Secondary School. She led the Rams to the first-ever VHSL Group AAA girls soccer championship in 1984. She continued her soccer career at William & Mary earning NCAA co-Freshman of the Year honors; NCAA all-American honors three times and was the Adidas/NCAA National Collegiate Player of the Year in 1987. Following her college career, she was a member of the U.S. Women's National Team from 1987-1991 and 1994 helping the U.S. team win the first-ever

Women's World Cup Championship in 1991. She was a Medal of Honor Recipient in 2001 along with her U.S. national teammates. McCarthy played professionally with FC Prato in Florence, Italy in 1988 and with the USASA Maryland Pride from 1995-98. She currently teaches mathematics at Centreville High School and is the assistant varsity girls soccer coach.

Contributors

MARTHA AKERS

Loudoun Valley High School



For the past 28 years, Martha Akers has had an abiding commitment to students, teaching, learning and leadership. Not only is she recognized as an outstanding educator at Loudoun Valley High School, but her contribution to scholastic journalism is recognized nationally. She has been a director of four VHSL/Justens Regional Journalism Publications Workshops and a Director of the VHSL's Fall Publications Workshop. She has served on the VHSL Scholastic Publications Advisory Committee and served on the VHSL committee that formed the Charles E. Savedge Scholarship for Virginia student journalists and the Charles E. Savedge Award for Sustained Excellence in Journalism. In 2006, the Journalist Education Association named her the national Yearbook Adviser of the Year, the highest honor the association can give. Her students have won numerous publication awards, including 22 VHSL Trophy

Class Awards in Yearbook, which is the equivalent to a state championship in scholastic publications. Loudoun Valley has won three Charles E. Savedge Awards for Sustained Excellence in Journalism from the VHSL. Among her many accolades, she was inducted into the Journalism Hall of Fame in 2003 and was awarded the Virginia Association of Journalism Teachers and Advisers' Thomas Jefferson Award for Lifetime Achievement in Scholastic Journalism. She continues to teach photojournalism and is the yearbook and National Honor Society Adviser at Loudoun Valley where she has taught since 1980.

JEFF DIETZE

West Potomac High School



The "Father of Professional Development" in the state of Virginia and known as the "Dean of Student Activities Directors," Jeff Dietze retired this past February after serving the West Potomac community for more than 37 years, and for 33 years as Director of Student Activities at West Potomac High School. He was instrumental in the development of the national certification program for athletic administrators during his service to the National Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association. He co-authored the National Council for Accreditation of Coaching Education state certification of state coaching education program. His development of the Virginia high school coaches' education program to educate coaches in local and state regulations set the standard for coaches' education across the country. Through his leadership, Virginia has the only national certified coaching education program for high school coaches in the United States. A past president of the VIAAA, he also served in numerous leadership positions within the VHSL, including serving as co-chair since 1995 of the VHSL State Coaching Education Steering Committee. Among his many national awards, he received the NIAAA Distinguished Service Award, NIAAA State Award of Merit, VIAAA Athletic Director of the Year, VIAAA John C. Youngblood Lifetime Achievement Award and VHSL Regional Award of Merit.

Eleven individuals who have made outstanding contributions to high school athletic and activity programs have been selected to the 2008 Virginia High School Hall of Fame. Members of the Class of 2008, the 19th to be inducted, will bring total membership to 198.

Sponsored jointly by the Virginia High School League and the Virginia High School Coaches Association, the hall is dedicated to preserving the rich heritage of outstanding achievements by students and adults in sports and activities within Virginia's public high schools. Athletes are eligible for consideration 10 years after completion of their high school careers and are judged primarily for their achievements in interscholastic sports. Coaches are eligible after 15 years of experience or upon retirement and are judged on the merits of their achievements at the high school level. Contributors are professionals who have rendered significant services in some other capacity such as administration, academic activities, officiating, media or sports medicine.

PATRICIA MITCHELL

Hampton High School



A pioneer in the Virginia High School Coaches Association, Trish Mitchell was among the first group of women admitted into the organization in 1974. In 1992, she became the first and only woman president of the VHSCA serving in that leadership position until 1994. She continues her long service with the VHSCA serving on the Executive Committee, Legislative Council and Budget and Finance Committees. In addition, she has served on the Hall of Fame Screening Committee and the Virginia High School League Advisory Council. Through her tireless efforts the VHSCA has doubled its membership over the past 15 years and is regarded as one of the finest coaches associations in the country. In addition to her duties with the VHSCA, Mitchell spent 32 years as a teacher, coach and athletic director at Hampton High School earning numerous awards, including National High School Region 2 Coach of the Year in 1980. She spent 26 years (1967-1999) as the girls tennis coach and served as the school's athletic director from 1985-2001. During her time guiding the Hampton athletic program, the Crabbers captured 11 VHSL team championships. She has served in various leadership positions within the Peninsula District serving as director of the Scholastic Bowl and Forensics activities, as well as establishing and directing the District cheerleader competition.

JIM RIKE

James W. Robinson Secondary School



Jim Rike has been the main voice for girls soccer for over 25 years and is a major reason why the sport has enjoyed tremendous growth in Virginia. In 26 years as the head coach at James W. Robinson Secondary School, he guided the Rams to four VHSL Group AAA state titles, including the first-ever girls soccer state championship in 1984 captained by fellow Hall of Fame inductee, Megan McCarthy. In addition to his state success, his teams have won nine regional championships and 10 district titles. He's been named VHSCA Coach of the Year three times, Washington Post all-Met Coach of the Year twice and was NHSACA National Coach of the Year in 2005. Including his five years as head boys soccer coach at Falls Church High School, Rike has a lifetime record of 420-19-40. He has also made significant contributions through his association with the VHSCA serving as chairman for the girls soccer all-state selection committee and all-star selection committee. Besides coaching soccer, Rike has also been an assistant varsity wrestling coach for 20 years (five at Falls Church and 15 at Robinson) and assistant varsity football and head freshman coach for 10 years at Robinson.

CALVIN TALFORD

Castlewood High School



For two years, few players in VHSL history dominated two sports like Calvin Talford did during his junior and senior years in track and basketball at Castlewood High School. In basketball, he was named Hogohegee District Player of the Year, first-team all-Region C, first-team Group A all-state and Russell County and Southwest Virginia Player of the Year. He recorded 1,657 career points, including a single-game high of 59 points. In track, he owned the Group A state jumping events winning six individual championships in the long jump, triple jump and high jump. He established Group A state records in each event that are still the standards today. Talford also earned second-team Group A all-state honors in football as a senior and all-region honors in baseball. He was named the 1988 Roanoke Times Male Athlete of the Year following his senior year. He continued his basketball career at

East Tennessee State University earning four letters and winning the 1992 NCAA Slam Dunk contest before playing pro basketball in Europe. He currently resides in Johnson City, TN.

RALPH LAW

Charlottesville



Ralph Law has been a VHSL football official for 44 years and has officiated nearly 600 varsity football games and over 600 sub-varsity games. He has been selected to officiate 25 regional and three state championship games. Since 1980, he has been the Commissioner of the Piedmont Valley Officials Association and is responsible for providing training programs for over 125 officials in Central Virginia. In addition to his officiating duties, Law has made significant contributions to the Virginia High School League over the past 40 years. He has directed and assisted with a number of VHSL championships including the Group A state track meet and served as the official scorer for VHSL state basketball championships. In addition, he has been a member of the VHSL Strategic Planning Policy Committee. After graduating from Granby High School and the College of William and Mary, he returned to

Granby as head track and swimming coach. He led Granby to the 1962 Group AAA track and field state title and won an Eastern District championship in swimming. In 1963, he was named the head swimming coach at the University of Virginia before serving as a school principal in the Charlottesville school system.

CHARLENE TILLER

John Tyler Community College



Charlene Tiller has directed the VHSL state forensics tournament since 2001 managing and organizing annually a staff of 130 judges and 360 students who represent over 110 high schools across the state. Since taking over the tournament, she has been responsible for selecting tournament personnel; organizing the schematics for four rounds of competition in 10 events in three simultaneous tournaments in Group A, AA and AAA. In addition to running the state tournament, her contributions for training Virginia high school speech coaches may be her legacy. As an officer with the Virginia Association of Speech, Debate and Drama Coaches (VASDDC), she organized an annual summer workshop inviting national and state leaders to present a two-day workshop in all aspects of forensics and debate competition. The workshop was so successful she added a third seminar to include

theatre. She was selected as the Section 2 (Mid-Atlantic States) representative on the NFHS Speech, Debate and Theatre Association board, where she is instrumental in developing a supporting speech program nationwide. She began her forensics career in 1987 at Hopewell High School coaching the forensics team before taking over the same duties at Charles City County High School from 1990-1999 and at Prince George High School 1999-2000. She is currently employed as an assistant professor of speech arts and sciences at John Tyler Community College.

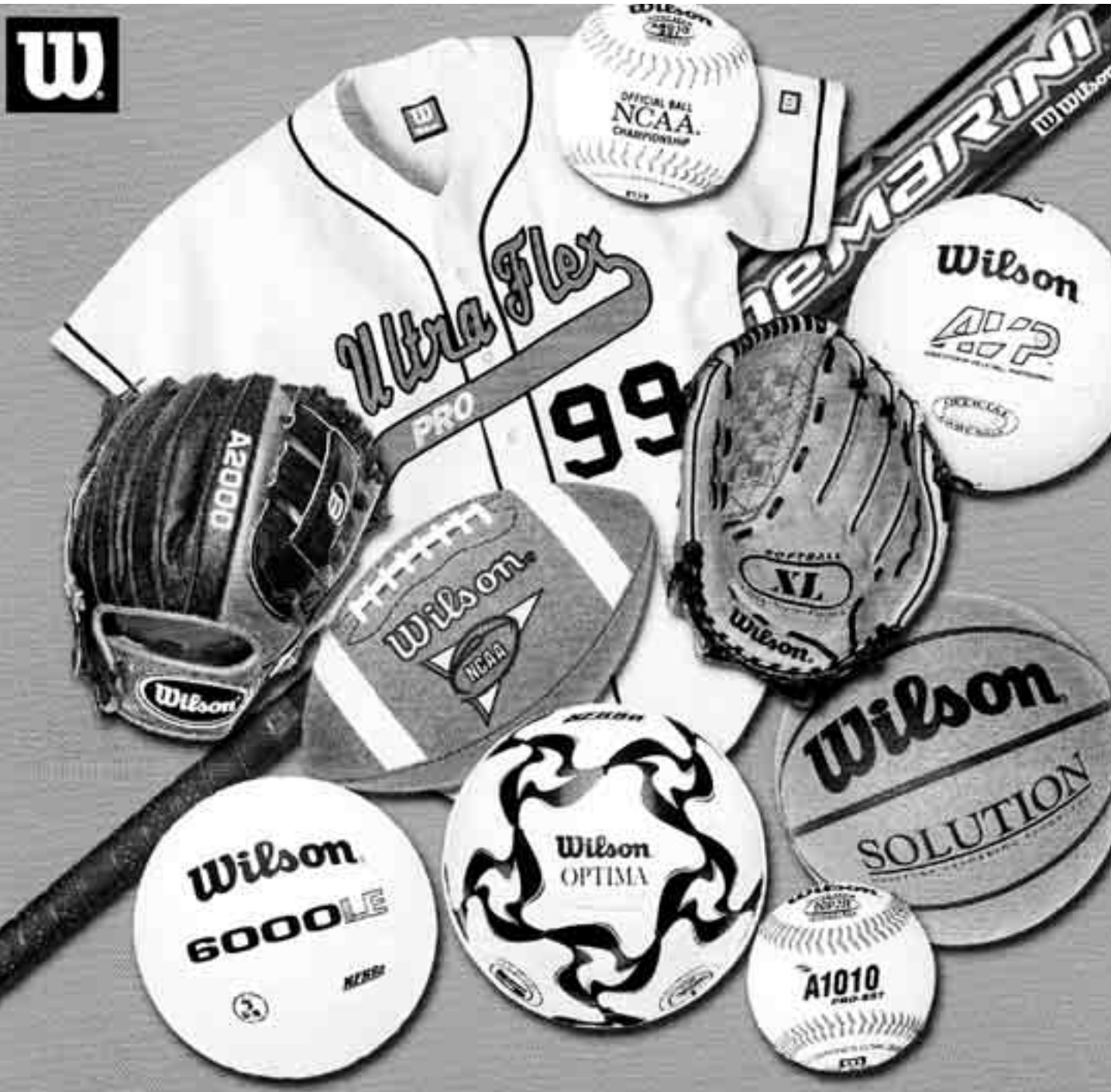

VHSCA Awards

All awards presented by the VHSCA are listed below and included are any special criteria for special awards. For coaching awards, the coach must be an active member of the VHSCA. The awards application is always in the Virginia Coach. Send duplicate applications for each award requested.

Note change in request procedure below!

I STATE CHAMPION RING AWARD

The VHSCA will present a ring to any active member head coach who has won two state championships in the same sport. Recipients need to submit the awards application form with ring size, stone, and verified two state championship years. There is no charge for the ring. Failure to attend and receive the ring at the VHSCA Banquet during the summer clinic will result in a \$25.00 charge unless the Awards Chairman is notified before July 1. A head coach can receive only one state championship ring. However, additional rings may be purchased.

II STATE CHAMPION PLAQUES

These plaques must be requested. There is no charge. Failure to attend and receive the plaque at the VHSCA Banquet during the summer clinic will result in a \$10.00 charge unless the Awards Chairman is notified before July 1.

III STATE RUNNER-UP AND REGIONAL CHAMPION PLAQUES

These plaques must be requested by submitting an awards application form. There is no charge except for postage and handling if requested within two years. Any requests prior to the previous two school years will cost \$12.00 per plaque. Send check payable to VHSCA with application form.

IV DISTRICT CHAMPION CERTIFICATES

The certificates must be requested by submitting an awards application form. There is no charge except for postage and handling if requested within two years. Any requests prior to the previous two school years will cost \$3.00 per certificate. Send check payable to VHSCA with application form.

V DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARDS

Four of these awards can be given each year (one per four areas of state). The only criteria is to submit a written nomination to the Awards Chairman.

VI FRANK McCUE SPORTS MEDICINE AWARD

This award is presented each year to a doctor or trainer who has made outstanding contributions to high school athletics. A written nomination must be submitted to the Awards Chairman.

VII MARSHALL JOHNSON NEWS MEDIA AWARD

This award is presented each year to an outstanding high school sports journalist. A written nomination must be submitted to the Awards Chairman.

VIII JIMMIE BRYAN SCHOLARSHIP

Three \$1,000.00 scholarships are awarded each year to outstanding high school senior student-athletes. Information, deadlines, and application forms will be in the October and February issues of Virginia Coach.

X STATE COACHES OF THE YEAR (CAREER) AWARDS

During the July meeting of the VHSCA Legislative council, the Sports Interest Groups select fifteen coaches and one athletic director as State Coaches of the Year (Career) and Virginia's nominees for National Coach of the Year. The fifteen sports are football, boy's basketball, girl's basketball, boy's track, girl's track, baseball, wrestling, swimming, volleyball, cross country, softball, soccer, golf, tennis, and special sports (gymnastics). The nominees enter competition for Regional and National Coach of the Year (Career) honors. These coaches are also honored at the Awards Banquet at our summer clinic with a State Coach of the Year (Career) Plaque.

XI ALL-STAR COACHES AWARDS

At our summer clinic Awards Banquet, our football, boy's basketball, girl's basketball, baseball, softball, volleyball and boy's soccer All-Star coaches are presented a plaque.

XII COACHES CAREER AWARD

Coaches are recognized after 10, 15, 20, 25, 30 (and so on) years service in the coaching profession. Combined head and assistant coaching experience is considered. To be considered for these awards, a coach must be an active or lifetime member of the VHSCA. Five years of service must be in a Virginia High School League member school.

- Step 1 The 10 year award is a certificate.
- Step 2 The 15 year award is a pin and certificate.
- Step 3 The 20 year award is a 7" x 9" plaque.
- Step 4 The 25 year award is a 8" x 10" plaque.
- Step 5 The 30 year award is a ring or plaque or engraved serving tray (recipients choice).
- Step 6 The 35 year is a 12" x 15" plaque.
- Step 7 The 40 year award is a desk or mantle walnut clock.

***NO RETROACTIVE AWARDS WILL BE GIVEN BEFORE STEP 5.**

***Awards for state champions, all ring recipients, steps four and above for milestone, and 25 year and up for career awards will be presented annually at the VHSCA Banquet held during the summer clinic. Failure to attend and receive the award will result in a charge (\$10.00 for plaques and \$25.00 for rings and trays) unless the Awards Chairman is notified before July 1.**

- 1) For sports such as baseball, basketball, football soccer, softball, tennis, volleyball, and field hockey; all wins in regular season, district playoffs, regional playoffs, and state playoffs may be counted.
- 2) For sports such as cross country, golf, gymnastics, indoor track, swimming, outdoor track, and wrestling; the procedure is different. Team victories in dual, tri, and quad meets can be counted. For regular season invitational meets or tournaments involving five or more teams, district championships, regional championships, and state championships; only the first place team will have one victory or win. A second place team finish or lower will not count as a win for this award.

* All wins must be as a head coach of a specific varsity sport at a Virginia High School League Member School.

* Criteria established so it is possible to reach a new level in approximately six years.

* Boys and girls sports are considered separately. (example: If you coach boys and girls tennis, you are technically coaching **two** sports.)

* To be considered for the "Victory Milestone Award," a coach must be an active member or lifetime member of the VHSCA and must send a written request for the award to the VHSCA Awards Chairman. Certification of wins by your principal is required.

* Award will not be retroactive. (Example: If first request is after you have achieved Step 3, you will receive only the award for Step 3—Step 1 and Step 2 awards would not be given).

* Awards beginning with Step 4 will be presented annually at the VHSCA Banquet held during the summer clinic. Failure to attend and receive the award will result in a charge (\$10.00 for plaques or \$25.00 for rings, pendants, and trays) unless the Awards Chairman is notified before July 1.

3) For sports such as golf that has a season running tournament the entire season counts the number of wins and losses by the way they finish at the end (accumulation).


