Draft Food for Peace Information Bulletin 14-01 for Comment

The draft Food for Peace Information Bulletin (FFPIB) 14-01, Eligible Uses of Section 202(e), ITSH, Community Development Funding, and Monetization is <u>now available</u> for your review and comment. A copy of the draft FFPIB will also be made available on the Food for Peace <u>website</u>.

This document is an update to FFPIB 12-03 and reflects changes in authority made by the Agricultural Act of 2014. A Food for Peace Budget Matrix, similar to the matrix included in FFPIB 12-03, is currently undergoing revision and will soon be shared for public comment with the FACG.

FFP would greatly appreciate receiving consolidated comments on draft FFPIB 14-01 from the representative groups of the FACG. The comment period will last for 45 days from the date materials are released. Therefore, comments are due no later than noon Wednesday, June 24, 2014. However, please

<u>Apply for a grant</u> **through the TOPS Small Grants Program - Awarded on a rolling basis.** The two types of grants inculude Micro Grants (maximum per award \$50,000) and Program Improvement Award (PIA) (maximum per award \$100,000).

<u>Submit a proposal</u> on policy-relevant priorities in South Asia with Leveraging Agriculture for Nutrition in South Asia (LANSA) - Due June 28, 2014. LANSA is a research partnership that sets out to answer the central question: "How can South Asian agriculture and related food policies and interventions be designed and implemented to increase their impacts on nutrition, especially the nutritional status of children and adolescent girls?"

<u>Submit a paper</u> to the Journal of Gender, Agriculture and Food Security (Agri-Gender) - for the August 2014 issue. The journal publishes research papers in the fields of agriculture including livestock, fisheries, crop sciences, agriculture economics, rural development, food security and nutrition as they relate to gender.
