

Thanks goes to Wagon Masters, Bob & Karen Taylor for doing an outstanding job at the June Lake campout. This being their first time, they handled it like veterans. Thanks also goes to all the members who helped out with different assignments: clean up detail, fire marshal, setting up the tables, and most important for all the women who helped with the food preparation. This made it a very enjoyable time up there. We couldn't ask for better weather- the day temp 70's and eve 40's, one day with light showers. While up there we all had to be careful due to several bear sightings. One member came across a bear while walking her dog. Another came across a bear walking a trail from June Lake to his car after fishing. All of a sudden there was a bear, and the club member didn't know what to do with his stringer of trout, either give it to the bear or just stand there? The bear chose to take off in another direction. The member walked back to his car in total shock. (He also had to check his pants.) We also had a bear sighting at the campground. I had more fun watching the members running for their cameras, trying to take a photo of the bear than watching the bear.

We had a total of 17 rigs show up, with a total of 34 members attend this campout. Fishing overall was good. Not many large fish were caught, but we did catch our share. We had a total of 248 trout caught, not counting the ones we released. The largest was a 4 lb. 2oz. trout caught by our freshwater veteran, Ross Granados. Second place went to our club president, Ron Parker with a 2lb. 7oz. trout. These trout were all caught at Grant Lake. Grant Lake was one of our most productive lakes this year, with good size trout averaging about a pound. Other lakes and streams were not that productive.
