- Complete and verify, through the Counseling Department, any additional credits needed from Adult Education and/or college classes by May 28, 2021
- Financial Aid: Complete FAFSA or Dream Act
- Complete college applications (deadlines vary)

#### You will need:

- FSA ID
- Student/Parent Social Security Number
- 2019 Taxes and W2's
- Parent and Student e-mail addresses
- Student/Parent(s) Date of Birth
- Parent(s) Marriage/Divorce Date


