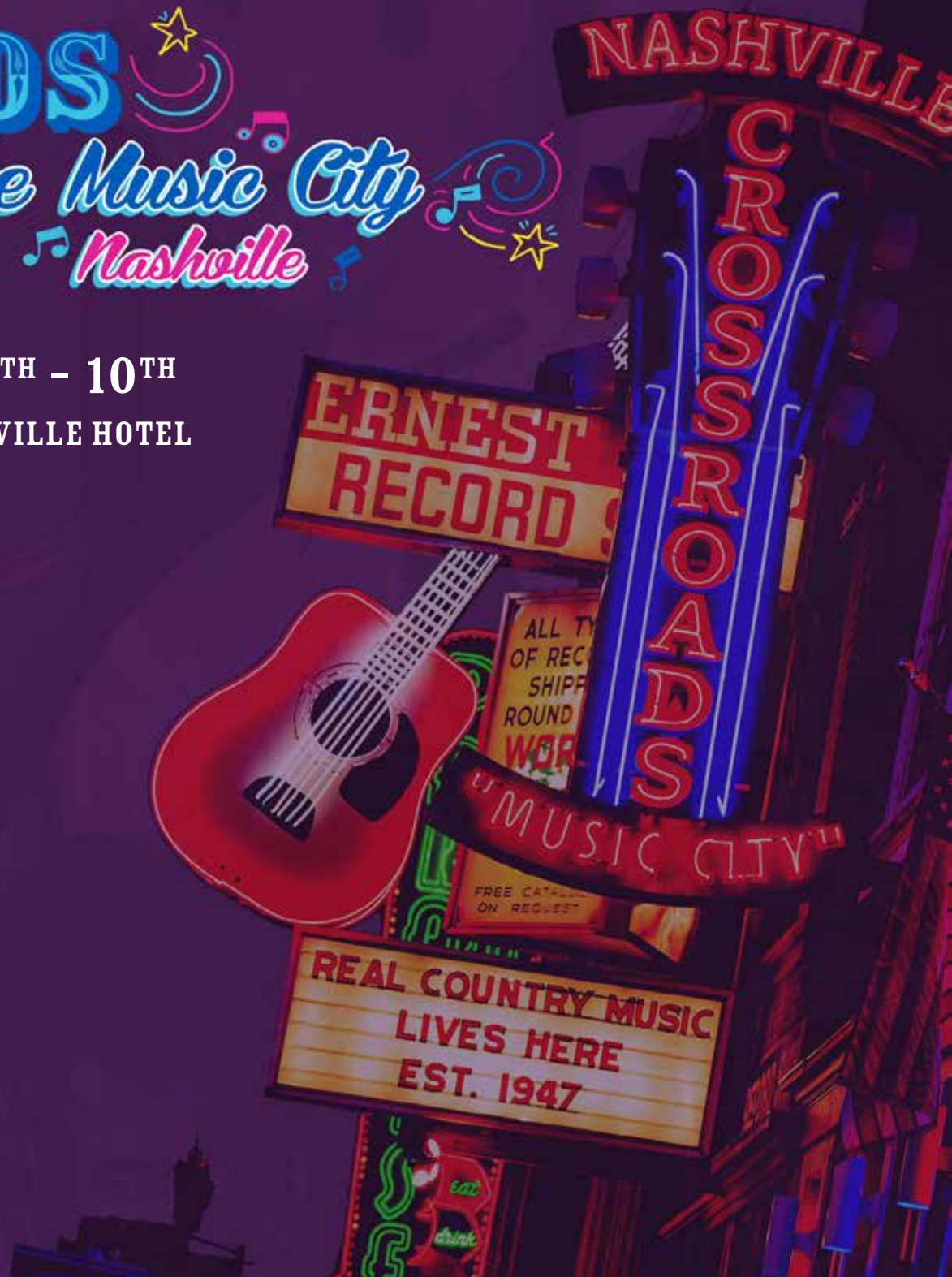

Taxi Service
