GETTING TO VIENNA

BY AIR TRAVEL

Vienna's central position in Europe makes it a hub offering optimal transportation connections to the whole world. 205 destinations across 71 countries are regularly served from Vienna by 74 airlines.

Many guests use the non-stop offers of international airlines to come to Vienna. The Austrian airline **Austrian Airlines** also offers several direct flights per day to the capital city. Book online and secure a low-cost ticket with Austrian Airlines.

AIRLINES AND DESTINATIONS

Austrian Airlines has the strongest presence at Vienna International Airport. Thanks to its large network, you can reach almost anywhere in the world with just one transfer. Most of the major European airlines also connect Vienna with their bases.

The Vienna Tourist Board's tourist information office is open daily from 7:00 am to 10:00 pm in the arrival hall (level 0). Here you can get free city maps and numerous brochures, buy the Vienna City Card or redeem a Vienna Card voucher.

ACCESSIBILITY

Vienna Airport is 100% accessible. Pictograms and control systems make it easier to orient yourself, while monitors at eye-level make flight information easier to read. If you require assistance, you can request this with your travel company 48 hours before departure. More information about this free service can be found at www.viennaairport.com. Tips for guests with special needs can be found at www.vienna.info.

VIENNA AIRPORT APP

The free app offers up-to-date status reports on arrivals and departures as well as information about the airport. It can be downloaded in German and English from the App Store or Google Play. To use the service, an internet connection must be available.

VIENNA AIRPORT SERVICE

The airport's information desk is located in the departure lounges in terminals 1 and 3, and in the arrival hall in terminal 3. Information can be obtained 24/7 over the telephone by calling +43-1-7007-222 33.

WiFi

Free WiFi is available throughout the airport for all mobile devices equipped with a WiFi compatible Wireless-LAN card. Power sockets are available in all lounges and in the waiting areas at gates B, C, D, F and G.

GETTING FROM THE AIRPORT TO THE CITY

From Vienna Airport, there are various ways of getting to the city. By train, which costs 16 Euros and departs every 30 minutes; by taxi, which costs 35-40 Euros and takes around 20 minutes; or by bus, which costs 8 Euros and departs every 30 minutes. Follow signs at the airport for public transport and taxi areas.

EXPLORE THE LOCAL CUISINE

A TRIP TO THE MARKET - NASCHMARKT

Vienna's best-known market has around 120 market stands and restaurants for a colorful culinary offering ranging from Viennese to Indian, from Vietnamese to Italian. The Naschmarkt has developed into a meeting point for young and old. The Flea Market on Saturday is already a cult event.

On the **Naschmarkt**, a colorful crowd buys fruit, vegetables and various delicacies from every country from dawn till dusk. Increasing numbers of trendy „in“ places are also finding somewhere to set up in the more than 120 market stands, and even offer **free Wifi**.

CULINARY HAPPENINGS AT THE NASCHMARKT IN VIENNA
Do-An and **Naschmarkt Deli** were gastronomic pioneers who managed to make the Naschmarkt interesting for a young, urban crowd. Since then, numerous old market stands have become popular places to meet thanks to their modern architecture. DJs also provide entertainment here on the weekend.

There is something at the Naschmarkt for everyone's taste: organic cuisine at **Tewa**, oriental flavors at **Neni** or at **Orient & Occident**, and fish at **Umar**, **Fischviertel** and **Nautilus**.

UrbaneK and **Krawall** offer delicacies, you can have pizza at **Trattoria Pulcinella** or taste traditional Viennese cuisine at **Eiserne Zeit**, **Café Amacord** or **Drechsler**.

There's a lot going on at the Naschmarkt, especially on Saturdays, due to the **weekly flea market**. The colorful throng is worth seeing even if you don't want to buy anything. It is particularly pleasant to sit outdoors at the Naschmarkt in summer, eating, drinking and watching people go about their business.

TRADITION - THE VIENNA BISTRO

The bistro, or beisl, is a typical Viennese dining establishment. Down-to-earth, cozy and traditional, it makes its mark on a booming restaurant scene and offers authentic Viennese cuisine.

The term ‚beisl‘ probably comes from the Yiddish word ‚bajiss‘, meaning ‚house‘. The classic Viennese bistro has a spacious bar, where wine is chilled and beer is poured, dark-painted wood paneling, simple tables and chairs and a mixed crowd. The kitchen is dominated by tradition: soup with pancake strips or dumplings, schnitzel and

offal, goulash, and tasty pastries like Palatschinken and Kaiserschmarren set the tone of the menu. If you want to have a traditional Viennese experience you won't go wrong with any of the following: **Steman** (6th district), **Rebhuhn** (9th district), **Gasthaus Wild** (3rd district), **Ubl** and **Gasthaus Wolf** (4th district), **Beim Czaak** and **Ludwig van** and **Pichlmaiers zum Herkner** (1st district).

Skopik & Lohn, located in the trendy district at Karmelitermarkt, and Glacis Beisl both bridge the gap between modernity and tradition in their own ways.

IN THE VINEYARDS - VIENNESE WINE & HEURIGER

Vienna is the only metropolis that grows enough wine within its city limits to make it worth mentioning. 700 hectares of Viennese vineyards leave their mark on the cityscape and its culture of pleasure. Wine growing has a long tradition in Vienna. White wines are grown in around 80 percent of the vineyards, with the Wiener Gemischter Satz being a specialty. Nowadays, Vienna presents itself as a city with a lively wine scene. Viennese wine is enjoyed in the city's many bars and restaurants or on the edge of town in wine taverns that offer wine from their own vineyards and buffet tables piled high with home-made delicacies. Since 2019, Viennese heuriger culture has also been considered an intangible cultural heritage by UNESCO.

POPULAR EUROPEAN CITIES NEAR VIENNA

AUSTRIA

1 Salzburg

Salzburg is one of the most renowned cities in Austria and Europe and has possibly the best-preserved old town center full of beautiful baroque architecture. The old town is listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. This charming Austrian town is known for being the birthplace of the classical composer Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart, and is home to Mozart's residence and Mozart's birthplace, now a museum. But Salzburg has much more in terms of historical sights and fun attractions, from museums and gardens to churches and mountains!

SLOVAKIA

2 Bratislava

Slovakia's capital oozes style, culture and history. Until 1919, Bratislava was part of Hungary. From the 16th century on the Hungarian crown jewels were kept at Bratislava Castle, and eleven kings and queens of Hungary were crowned in the city's cathedral. The city's position on the Danube and at the nexus point of trade routes helped it grow into a center of commerce and power in that time. The city's deep layers of history are all exposed, so be prepared for palaces, castles, churches and outlandish Soviet megastructures.

GERMANY

3 Munich

Bavaria's capital is filled with beloved sights, opulent Baroque churches and museums of the highest order. Munich's Kunstareal contains a cluster of art museums with so many masterpieces it's difficult to know where to begin. These invaluable collections were assembled by the Wittelsbach monarchs who ruled Bavaria up to the 20th century. Visit their two palaces in the city, or view the Alps from the top of the Rathaus (City Hall) and St. Peter's Church.

HUNGARY

4 Budapest

Hungary's capital city of Budapest is actually made up of three unified cities, with Buda and Óbuda on the west bank of the Danube and Pest on the east bank. Much of the city has been granted UNESCO World Heritage Site status, and many visitors consider the city to be amongst the most beautiful cities in Europe. Budapest mixes its fascinating history with a laid-back contemporary artistic style. The city offers a wide range of activities for visitors, from museums to thermal spas.

CZECH REPUBLIC

5 Prague

Prague's history dates back over a thousand years and rivals any other European city in terms of sheer beauty, but has much more to offer than just a pretty face. Bisected by the Vltava River, Prague will astound even the most well-traveled tourist with its Gothic grace and Renaissance architecture, its many world-class museums and baroque style churches and bridges. Explore the medieval streets, meander down the riverside and if the sightseeing becomes too tiring you can always relax with some of the finest lagers in the world.

ITALY

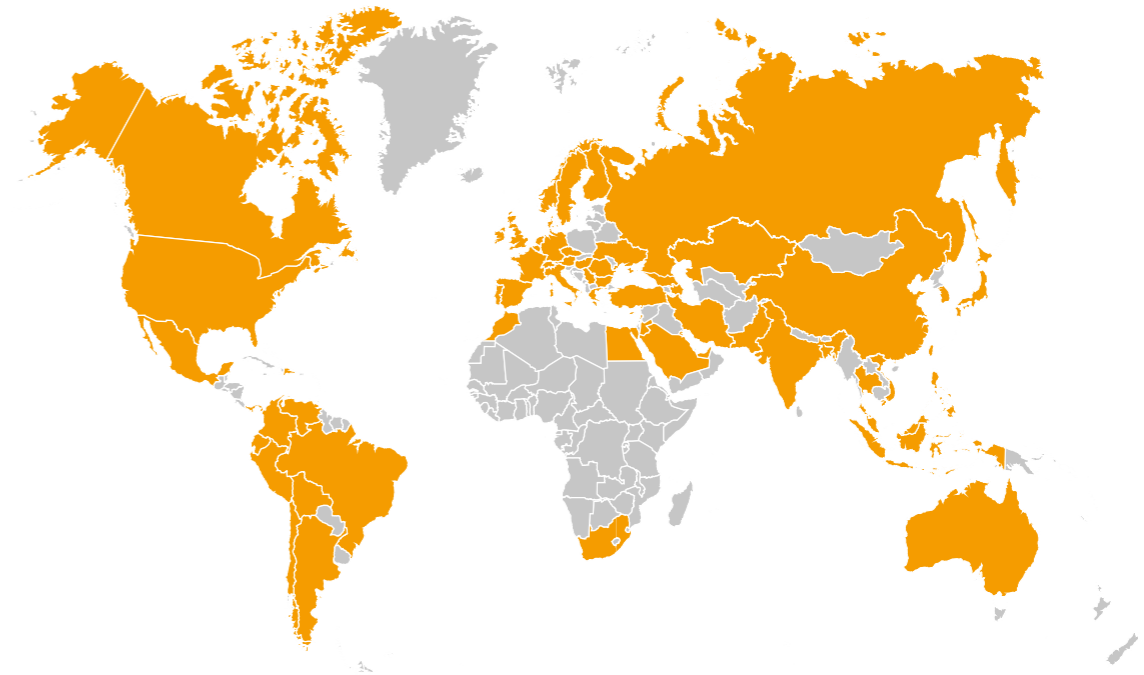
6 Venice
