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Our Lady of Assumption Feast

A Dogma of the church

We celebrate our parish titular feast of our Lady of Assumption on 15th August. The dogma of Assumption was declared by Pope Pius XII on November 1st 1950 when he wrote 'Munificentissimus Deus'. Dogma says: "Mary, the immaculate perpetually Virgin Mother of God, after the completion of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into the glory of heaven."

Mary - a universal Mother

TIME magazine in a cover story on Mary of Nazareth said, "Among all the women who ever lived, the mother of Jesus Christ is the most celebrated, the most venerated, the most portrayed, the most honoured..." She is mentioned only on selected occasions in the Gospels, yet she has dominated the art, the music and the faith of the world for centuries. Catholics and Orthodox unite in calling her Mother of God. Protestant Christians recognise her importance in the Christian story. Even the Quran devotes several chapters to her. Yes, indeed, she is a universal Mother!



Prayers & Spiritual Resources

Prayers and Reflections 20th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A

God's plan of salvation is for all people. The loving Spirit of God is poured into the whole of creation and rests within everyone. This truth is revealed throughout Scripture and is a message of hope for all times.

The prophet Isaiah (**First Reading**) calls us to act with integrity and justice, recognising that a time will come when true faith in the Lord of love and compassion will find expression in people of all faith and none.

This universal vision is echoed in both the response and the verses of the **Psalm**. The light of God's love shines on all people of every tribe and nation. This is a text that speaks to our times, reminding us of our common humanity, bound together by the love and blessings of God.

In the letter to the Romans (**Second Reading**), Paul teaches that God is faithful to his promises and will never take back the gifts he has so lovingly and freely given to all people. God's mercy is for all of humanity.

In the **Gospe**l, we witness what at first seems an uncharacteristically harsh response from Jesus to a desperately worried mother. In this exchange, a foreign pagan woman with a daughter troubled by an evil spirit approaches him directly for help. She has so much faith in Jesus that she even reveals a truth about him that his own disciples have yet to recognise. Jesus's initial rebuff to her cry for help, and her unwavering faith in him, offers an opportunity for him to teach his disciples that God's healing love is available for all people, no matter what their race or religion may be.

Clean or Unclean?

The concept of personal cleanliness as both a prerequisite of holiness and an aid to physical fitness. Cleansing with water for physical as well as spiritual purity was commanded in the Old Testament.

Moses bathed Aaron and his sons before their ordination as priests. (Leviticus 8:6)

A diseased, unclean person had to be quarantined outside the camp until the infection ceased. (Leviticus 13:45,46)

When the disease was gone, the person had to "wash his clothes, shave off all his hair and bathe with water." (Leviticus 14:8)

By the time of Christ, ceremonial cleanliness by water had become institutionalized into a purity ritual involving full immersion in a *mikveh* (or *migveh*), a "collection of water."

To be clean outside was a metaphor for inward, spiritual purity.

Baptism promotes this cleansing for spiritual purity and in these times of pandemic we are reminded that washing is also important for physical health.

August 11 the feast day of John Henry Newman - his daily prayer inspires many.

May God support us all the day long, till the shades lengthen and the evening comes, and the busy world is hushed, and the fever of life is over, and our work is done.

Then in mercy may God give us a safe lodging and a holy rest and peace at the last.

the priests who absolved me from my sins;


the priests at whose Masses I assisted and who gave me your Body and Blood in Holy Communion;

and bless them abundantly in time and in eternity. Amen.





