The program opened with a Taste of Mississippi Dinner. The program featured a program introducing the participating states. A silent auction was held throughout the conference and many brought home nice items.

On Friday, we departed from the hotel and headed to the home of Tennessee Williams, which has now become a visitors center in Starkville. Remembering Former State 4-H Specialist C. Dean Allen

Dr. C. Dean Allen, former State 4-H Specialist with Virginia Cooperative Extension, passed away on Friday, August 18, 2006 at the Montgomery Regional Hospital. He was 77.

A native of Michigan, Dr. Allen earned his bachelors degree from Michigan State University and began his career as 4-H agent in Gratiot County, Michigan following his military service in the Korean Conflict. During this time, he received his master's degree from Michigan State University and Ph.D. from the University of Chicago, and then worked on the state 4-H staff in Michigan and Washington State. In 1967, Dr. Allen joined the state 4-H staff at Virginia Tech where he served until his retirement in 1992, having achieved Professor Emeritus.

He is survived by his wife, Darlene F. Allen and four daughters and their families. Dean Allen was well known throughout the Commonwealth of Virginia and especially in the world of 4-H. Among his many accomplishments and active participation, he was active for over 20 years with the Virginia-Santa Catarina (Brazil) Partners of the Americas, serving in various leadership positions, including four years as Virginia President and six years on the International Board of Directors.

At his request, there was no funeral. A private memorial service will be conducted in Michigan at a later date. In lieu of flowers, those wishing to make a memorial contribution might consider the Virginia 4-H Foundation. (Robert Ray Meadows)

Editors Note—Dean Allen was a devoted 4-H All Star and served our organization as Liaison for many years. He will be missed. Our Treasurer tells us our organization has received several donations to honor his memory.
