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## Checking-In to Camp

-Units will be scheduled for a check-in time 2 weeks prior to your arrival at camp. We'll call you or you can call us.

-Please be ready with preliminary Pipestone/Dining Hall numbers.

## Tips to Stream-line Check-Ins

- -Check for dates, parent/physician signatures on medicals BEFORE arriving at camp. (No Sheet Protectors, Consider turning in a copy instead of original)
- -Send Adults through Medical Check-in first to assist with youth. (order of med check does not matter)
- -Will attempt to do med/financial check-in at the same time.

We know the check-in process is often times one of the most stressful experiences of the week.

We are working to try to stream-line this process, and welcome any <u>feedback</u>.

The Leader's Guide outlines the classic check-in process; however, we will be experimenting with new ideas throughout the summer and reserve the right to change this process.



# Visitor-in-Camp Policy Changes

- 1) A gov't issued photo ID is required when visitors sign into camp. (see leader's guide for details)

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## 2013 Summer Camp Theme

#### Purpose Statement:

This summer's theme is based upon a national initiative by the Boy Scouts of America, which emphasizes the value of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) in preparing youth to become productive adults.

Our theme, coined as "Prepared. For Life.," will use the camp setting to stimulate scout and scouters interest in STEM-related fields and shows how Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics apply to everyday living and the world around them.

The staff has worked hard to develop a program which showcases how STEM is just the beginning of the many ways in which scouting prepares America's youth for the challenges of tomorrow.



The Boy Scouts of America's NOVA Awards program incorporates learning with cool activities and exposure to STEM for Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, and Venturers.

During their week in camp, scouts and scouters will be introduced to the BSA NOVA Award and given the tools needed to continue the program after leaving camp; eventually earning the award.







## No More Badge Tracker

## Notes from the Advancement Committee

-Class size is strictly enforced for quality control purposes. Scouts can be added to a "standby list" for each badge after the Sunday leader's meeting.

-Prerequisites are due on the first day of class. Unprepared scouts will lose their spot to the next on the standby list.





-All prerequisites are listed in the Leader's Guide. Make sure scouts have prerequisites done before leaving for camp.


