Sew & Tell News

Block of the Month— Christy Bengston

February's block is called "Spools"

Please use a polka dot fabric for the spool. From this print fabric :

Cut one rectangle: 4 1/2" X 12 1/2"

Cut four 4 1/2" X 4 1/2"

From white background fabric:

Cut two background rectangles: 4 1/2" X 12 1/2"

Draw a line from corner to corner on the four print 4 1/2" squares. Place one square on each end of background solid 4 1/2" X 12 1/2" rectangle with right sides together. Sew on the drawn line. Leave a scant 1/4" seam allowance and trim excess. Press. Repeat on the other side of the rectangle to create Unit A. Repeat twice.

Quilt Block Assembly

Referring to photo for fabric placement, sew 1 Unit A to the top of the print 4 12" X 12 1/2" strip and one to the bottom to create the block.

Round Robin— Rebecca Scroggins

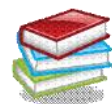

MEETING MINUTES

Ladies of the Lake Quilt Meeting Minutes, January 12, 2019

General Meeting

The meeting was called to order by President Terry Phelps at 10:01 a.m.

Members and Guests: We welcomed three guests: Sharon Burger, Renee Schultz Hein and Barbara Peebles. It was announced that membership dues for 2019 is now due and payable. A limited number of membership forms are available here today. Forms can also be downloaded from our website, www.llqg.org.

Treasurer Report: Treasurer Kitty Jones reported that for the month of December we had a profit of \$176.00 and expenses of \$1,160.38 for a net loss of \$984.38.

Announcements:

President Terry Phelps announced that the guild still has some chairman position updates: Web Editor and Opportunity Quilt Promo chairs are still needed. Jane Alameda will chair the 2020 Opportunity Quilt Design Committee and asked for volunteers. Several members signed up. Betty Fessler and Mary Ann Riley will chair the Treasure Chest. Pat Dandy will chair Secret Pal.

Barbara Haddon, Quilt Show Chairman, announced that Christy Bengston has volunteered to be Judging Chairman and Reba Chavez will be the Printing Chairman. Positions still needing to be filled are quilt setup/takedown. Renee Schultz Hein has volunteered to be Secretary.

Hospitality Signups: please sign up to bring snacks for the February meeting

LakeWorks: Gayle Coyle is not present to provide a report on this activity

Betty Fessler announced that for disaster quilts the guild will provide the batting and backing. Members just need to provide quilt tops which must be bed-size. Jane Alameda will bind the quilts. All quilts will be taken to Kerrie's Quilt Shop to be delivered to those in need. We have already sent 30 quilts to Paradise for Camp Fire survivors.

Program: Jane Alameda introduced Colleen Granger of Sew Little Time Quilting with "Playing with Pre-cuts". Colleen's humorous talk showed many quilts created using various types of pre-cuts. She also had available for purchase many patterns, pre-cuts and kits. The class tomorrow will be all about what kind of patterns can be used for each individual's choice of pre-cuts.

Upcoming Programs:

February will be Sheila Collins and "Creative Journey from Fashion Designer to Graphic Designer to Fabric Artist". There will be a class on Sunday but we need more people to sign up for the class.

March will be Marjorie McGraw with and "Mistakes I Have Made and How to Correct Them". There will be no class that Sunday.

April Lisa McKissick will be the speaker. The class on Sunday will be a beginner friendly and easy quilt.

Jill Schumacher will be conducting a 2-day class sponsored by Grapevine Quilters in Ukiah on how to free motion quilt on your domestic machine. A show of hands indicated a number of guild members will be attending this class.

BOARD MEETING MINUTES

Call to Order: Terry Phelps, President, called the meeting to order at 12:04 pm

Present: Terry Phelps, Jane Alameda, Kathy Pratt, Kitty Jones, Linda Morrison, Marj Sweeney, Shirley Viada, Betty Fessler, Barbara Haddon, Connie Cracraft, Dottie Kauffman, Mary Ann Riley, Rebecca Scroggins

Old Business: There was no old business

New Business:

Marj Sweeney wanted to discuss the poor turnout of members at the December meeting and possible changes. It was discussed that we have a report from the Membership committee at each meeting of the number of members present. This number must be reported to the Secretary to be included in the minutes for each guild meeting so we can see the trends in membership attendance. This has been tracked in prior years but not recently.

Audit Committee: a committee needs to be formed to audit the books for the guild for 2018. Jane Alameda and Kathy Pratt will do this along with the Treasurer for 2018 Sandra Redshaw and the 2019 Treasurer Kitty Jones.

Opportunity Quilt: there is still a need for someone to do the promotions for the 2019 Op Quilt. Dottie and Mary Ann have suggested that we use postcards advertising the Op Quilt. These postcards would be provided to the membership to distribute along with the sales of Op Quilt tickets. Mary Ann will research pricing to have these postcards printed. Also discussed was the fact that it isn't profitable to travel to other guilds out of the area to promote the Op Quilt. Another concern is the low number of members who purchase Op Quilt tickets at a reduced price providing them the opportunity to resale the tickets to be reimbursed for the tickets purchased. Betty reported that approximately 50% of the members purchased tickets for the 2018 quilt.

Rebecca will chair the Round Robin project for 2019 and presented some ideas to the Board for approval. Her ideas were approved. She will have signups at the February guild meeting for a start in March. There will be two groups doing two different design types.

Marj said that there is a need for more fat quarters to be used for the monthly membership drawing. We need to see if we can get donations or will need to purchase some.

A stamp needs to be made to make labels for the disaster quilts donated by LLQG. Jane will investigate pricing for a stamp like the one currently used for baby quilts. The stamp will say "Comfort quilt from Ladies of the Lake Quilt Guild" with our PO Box on it just like the one for the baby quilts.

It was brought up that the guild still has not had the position of Parliamentarian filled. This needs to be done.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:49 pm
