Fee creations of modern authors have become more widely known or achieved greater popularity than that of Sherlock Holmes. The fertility of Dr Conan Doyle's inventive powers has endowed his great detective with a perennial attractiveness, and it was only natural that before long versions of his adventures would be presented on the stage. The story of some of the experiences of Sherlock Holmes, which was produced for the first time in Sheffield at the Alexand Theatre last evening, is not the version in which Mr Gillette was so successful at the Lyceum Theatre, London. It is a melodrama of a strong type, with an abundance of sensation, and is from the pen of the late Mr Charles Rogers. In the main the story flows easily and naturally, and it was received with appreciation by a large house yesterday evening. Of course the central figure is the familiar Sherlock Holmes, fighting his never ending battle with criminals, coolly awaiting his opportunities and maturing his plans, and striking swiftly and wisely at the moment of action. Then, too, is Dr Watson, and it is in his chambers that the story opens. Holmes is on the track of an unknown murderer - Michael **Hurwich**, alias Professor **Moriarty**. **Moriarty** enters and searches the friends' lodgings, but is interrupted by Dr Watson, whom he stabs and leaves as dead. Dr Watson's child daughter, who also came in the room, is kidnapped by **Moriarty**. Sherlock Holmes builds the structure of facts, which leads to the recovery of the child. Then the tale tells of the struggle between Holmes and **Moriarty** for supremacy - a battle of brains, in which first one and then the other seems on the point of triumph. Helen **Katides**, a charming young woman known to Holmes, is decoyed from her home by **Moriarty** and Anarchist associates, in order to force her into marriage with a ruffian. How Holmes bears these men in their headquarters, and rescues her from their power by an uplifted hand containing a bomb, forms one of the most exciting situations in the play. In the end, Holmes is successful, and the **Moriarty** gang is destroyed. A striking presentation of the character of Sherlock Holmes was given by Mr Henry S. **Dacre**, whilst the part of Dr Watson was adequately filled by Mr J. **LAWSON** Hawkins, who is not unknown in Sheffield. The subtle criminal (**Hurwich**) is excellently portrayed by Mr Harold West, as is his Anarchist associate, **Seville**, by Mr Cowell Clark. Of the ladies, Miss Evelyn Oyle, as Helen **Katides**, was well received. They were capably supported by the other members of the company, and the dresses and scenery were tasteful and effective. 'Sherlock' Sad Finale At Lake

"We scheduled this show at the end of our season as you'll have all winter to forget about it," Will Disney told the audience prior to the new play at the Little Lake Theater.

He was only joking, but it might as well have been a true confession. "The Very Great Grandson of Sherlock Holmes" is by far the worst production I've ever seen staged at the Little Lake. And it also serves as a sad footnote to one of the Lake's better seasons.

The Little Lake Theater has tried miserably before and succeeded to the point where it is almost their forte. But they have never really attempted the madcap comedy of Will Disney or Carl Nelson neither, apparently, has author Bill Majewski. And when the various clunk or slips, the result is less than successful.

Majewski's Holmes is supposed to be a fiend, but with the exception of two short sequences there isn't any indication that he is less intelligent than his famed grandfather. Disney, portraying the title character, seems slipped by his role. One minute he is the dignified detective, the next he is a dead ringer for Inspector Clouseau.

Majewski, in great wheelbarrow style, has a large red bow which is chosen repeatedly for the murder. All have motives, and, more importantly, distinct personalities for the cast to draw upon. Thus, however, have any depth. Death, the croak, the when and where, Amanda, the wheelbarrow-ridden mad, is super staid, and the murder states make for death. The traits are funny the first time, acceptably the second time, and unamusing the third, fourth, fifth and each time they're shared on us.

The real show what it is, but ultimately gives up, and even seems embarrassed for submitting the audience to this wretched nonsense.

The book need certainly falls on the author. "Sherlock Holmes" does indeed have its moments, especially. Each of the brilliant around which Majewski pushed together a script of sorts.

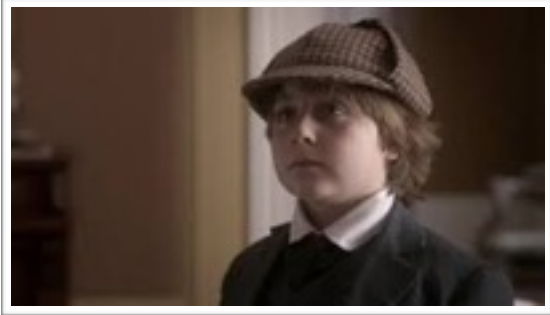

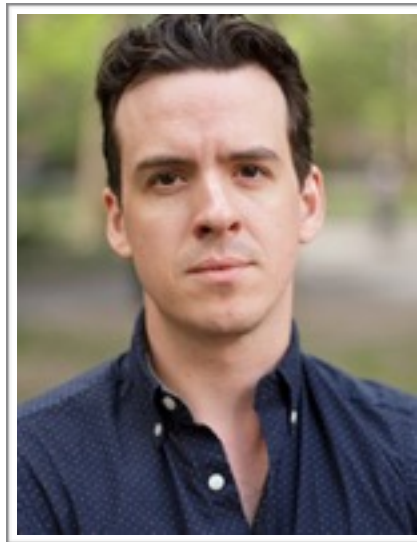

A MOST CREDITABLE PERFORMANCE.

THE SCENE IN "NANCY."
MR ORR IN "SQUIRE PEARDROP."

AMONG the repertory list of the principal attractions presented in a very clever original sketch performed at Hospitalfield last Friday evening before a large gathering of invited guests. The piece, described in the programme as a "sensational medical drama," was entitled "Gladys' Revenge; or What made the Horse Reel," and, as the title indicates, the plot

clined. Mr Orr, as old Squire Peardrop, was a very skillful get-up, and he made a splendid personation of a distressed old gentleman. The consistent deportment and acting all through would have been no discredit to a professional star. The still more difficult rôle of his daughter "Nancy," so admirably sustained by Mr Scott, merits special commendation. Whether in the grief-stricken maiden or the indignant rebuff of the Captain's amorous advances, she acted and spoke her part with fine restraint. The part of the dissolute, swaggering ex-Captain was taken by Mr John Hay, and carried throughout with a dash and daring fitting the character. Mr F. Dobson in his varied rôles, was also quite successful. His burlesque of the infallible "Sherlock" was very amusing, and the patter by which he sought to cover his observations and get his cast of the incriminating footprint applied was specially good, and drew forth hearty congratulations. Mr Harcourt as the shady lawyer and Mr Bernard Adams, the clever author of the sketch, performed their less exacting parts with commendable insight.

No small share of the appropriate setting of the piece throughout was due to the piano accompaniments of Mr David Ingles—or, to use the dignified title of the programme—"Professor Ingles, M.U.S., I.C.," who with the "assistance" of a derelict lay figure as the "cello, and a still more antiquated creation as harpist constituted the "orchestra" for the evening.
