Building on the joy of our Easter celebration, the vestry and I are committed to a regathering plan for St. Andrew's that offers safe opportunities for in-person worship and fellowship. Though some opportunities may remain virtual indefinitely, such as compline, our goal is to slowly incorporate more in-person gatherings into the life of our church. You'll notice that some of our upcoming events, such as the *Your Faith*, *Your Life* series I am leading, will be held outdoors (weather permitting, with masks and distancing protocols in place). If you are part of a ministry that currently meets virtually and would prefer to meet outdoors, please contact your vestry liaison for more information.

We will hold another outdoor service on **Sunday, May 2.** This time, our worship will take place on the east lawn of the church. Please read all information and <u>register in advance for</u> <u>the service on our outdoor worship sign-up page</u>. May 2 is also Annie Jung's last day with us as our seminarian. Annie will return to St. Andrew's next fall to support liturgy and continue to develop her skills for ministry, but she will do so in an unofficial capacity. I hope you'll join us for worship and stay for fellowship as we give thanks for Annie's presence with us this past year.

This mix of online and outdoor gatherings will be part of our life for a while, at least until we are able to resume indoor gatherings. Even then, we will likely continue to rely heavily on Zoom as we ease our way into the next phase of the pandemic. You'll see in the vestry summary note below that the vestry is working on our application to the diocese for permission to gather indoors. The application requires that we have certain processes and procedures in place to ensure safety, and we may be turning to all of you for assistance. We will need volunteers who can attend trainings and adapt to changing guidelines. As our needs and expectations become clearer, expect to hear much more from your vestry.

I give thanks for all the creative, varied ways we are able to be the Church these days. Your resilience and joy shine through your video screens and your masks, and it is an honor to navigate these strange times with you. Thank you.

# April Vestry Meeting Summary

The Vestry met Tuesday night and discussed the following areas:

**Outdoor Worship:** Vestry reviewed and critiqued Outdoor Easter celebration with livestreaming and plan to host outdoor in-person services the first Sunday in May and June. The plan is to move to the church lawn by the Nave to take advantage of the shade with the increasing temperatures.

**Regathering inside the Church:** A dedicated group of volunteers led by Mark Seip are working a plan to submit to the diocese to allow regathering indoors for worship. Dates to resume indoor worship are still to be determined and will require approval of the Diocese. Volunteers will be needed to help as ushers, greeters, and guides to navigate safety requirements.

**Finance Report:** Pledge fulfillments are on track...thank you! Great news, we ended 2020 with a substantial surplus.

**Memorial Garden:** Vestry agreed to review the space and look at potentially hiring a landscape architect to examine updating and refreshing the space.



# Garden of Hope

On Thursday April 8, Annie and Doris watered a thirsty garden. And on Saturday April 10, 5 volunteers (including 1 student from Marymount University and 1 Arlington high school volunteers) worked in St. Andrew's Garden of Hope despite the wet weather. Doris, Annie, Allison, Christine and Dave planted romaine lettuce

seedlings and weeded. No need to water although we did fill the watering bags around the new Pear trees that are in full Bloom! Most of the work was completed just under an hour and the garden is looking great!

We will have another work day next **Saturday, April 17** starting at 9:00am (Sunday April 18 at 11:30am if delay due to rain).

1. A maximum of 20 people may be in the garden at a time

Volunteers must sign up through <u>Sign Up Genius</u>, in order to ensure that we are under our volunteer limit. Please contact <u>Emily Blecksmith</u>, Parish Administrator, if you have questions.
Volunteers must wear a face covering that covers the mouth and nose

4. Volunteers must maintain 6' of distance from other volunteers while in the garden (exceptions made for volunteers from the same household)

5. Volunteers must bring their own gardening gloves

6. Other general materials volunteers should bring as needed: a water bottle, sunscreen, sun protection (e.g. hat, sunglasses, etc.)
