

Uncle Sam needs you for 2020 elections

It takes a village, or in this case a city, to run an effective election. There are three elections in Shorewood in 2020. Serving as an election judge at one or all of the elections is a great way to learn about elections and is a great service to the community. Shorewood City Council and staff are grateful for the service of the residents who play such an important role in the election process. It really could not be done without them or YOU! Please consider working the 2020 elections.

Judges must be eligible to vote in Minnesota and be able to read, write, and speak English. Your employer is required by law to provide you time off from work to serve with no reduction in pay. Students in good academic standing that are ages 16 and 17 may be election judge trainees with permission from their parents. City of Shorewood election judges are paid \$12 per hour, head

election judges are paid \$13 per hour and student judge trainees are paid \$10 per hour. Judges are assigned to morning, afternoon, or all-day shifts as desired and are required to take at least two hours of paid training. The Presidential Nomination Primary Election is March 3, 2020. Absentee Voting begins January 17, 2020. One hour of additional training is required for all election judges working the Presidential Nomination Primary. The Primary Election is Tuesday, August 11, 2020 and the General Election is Tuesday, November 3, 2020.

Private well water testing encouraged

Residents with private wells are encouraged to routinely have their well checked for arsenic and other contaminants. A Shorewood resident recently informed the city that they are suffering from arsenic poisoning due to well water

contamination. They did have a reverse osmosis system installed and were unaware that the system had malfunctioned.

Residents with private wells are responsible for water testing. According to the Minnesota Department of Health, water should be tested for a variety of contaminants, including arsenic, nitrates and bacteria. Professionals at the department say

that it is up to well owners to have their water tested and, although it is quite important, many well owners are either unaware or do not think there is a problem with their water. It is recommended that tests be repeated every one to two years because changes occur in the groundwater due to various environmental factors.

City of Shorewood tests municipal water, but

there is not city testing of private wells. The city does have testing kits available for collection of water samples that you can send to a health department certified lab for testing. Testing costs range between \$35 and \$140.

Create dirt not waste

Compost is organic material that can be added to soil to help plants grow. Food scraps and yard waste together currently make up about 30 percent of what we throw away, and should be composted instead. Making compost keeps these materials out of landfills where they take up space and release methane, a potent greenhouse gas. In Hennepin County it keeps it out of the burner, which makes the burners more effective creating energy and by reducing the

amount of ash created.

Composting Basics

Composting requires three ingredients:

- Browns: Includes materials such as dead leaves, branches, and twigs.
- Greens: Includes materials such as grass clippings, vegetable waste, fruit scraps, and coffee grounds.
- Water: Having the right amount of water, greens, and browns is important for

compost development.

Your compost pile should have an equal amount of browns to greens. Alternate layers of organic materials of different-sized particles in the pile. The brown materials provide carbon for your compost, the green materials provide nitrogen, and the water provides moisture to help break down the organic matter. It's a complete science experiment!

Fall deer management program

City of Shorewood will work again this year with the Metro Bowhunters Resource Base to provide a deer management program. The scheduled dates of the hunt are:

September 20 - 22October 4 - 6October 18 - 20November 1 - 3

November 15 – 17 (if needed)

The city has contacted land owners who have participated in the program in past years, or who have expressed interest in being a site location. If your property has not been a site in the past, but you are interested, please contact the city at 952.960.7900. Your site will be evaluated to determine if it is a suitable location, and program representatives will answer any

questions you have about the program. As a courtesy, property owners adjacent to the lots that are part of the management program will be notified of neighboring property's inclusion in the program.

Primary election 2020

The Presidential Nomination Primary (PNP)Election is March 3, 2020. Absentee voting begins January 17, 2020. The

Primary Election is Tuesday, August 11, 2020.

All polling places will be open just as in the Primary and General Elections. Only

presidential candidates from major political parties will participate and each major party will have a separate ballot. The chair of each party will submit a list of candidates by December 31, 2019, that will appear on the ballot. The PNP will determine who is on the Primary ballot in January. Voters may vote

in person at Shorewood City Hall Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. or request

a ballot be

sent to them. Absentee ballot (AB) applications are available on the city's website, www.ci.shorewood. mn.us. The application is sent to the county. A ballot will arrive at

your residence during the PNP AB Voting period. A voter must request the ballot of the party of their choice. If a voter refuses to select a party, they will not be able to vote in the Presidential Primary. A voter's choice of party ballot will be recorded and is private data; however, a list of all who voted in the presidential nomination primary and the political party each voter selected will be provided to the chair of each major political party. How a voter voted is secret. The presidential primary results must bind the election of delegates in each party. Precinct caucuses are still held on February 25, 2020, to conduct other party business.



Managing ash trees

merald ash borer, an invasive tree pest that attacks and kills ash trees, is the biggest current threat to our tree canopy. There are over 1 million ash trees in Hennepin County, and 100 percent of them are threatened by the emerald ash borer.

Most residents live within 15 miles of an infested ash tree. which means you should be taking steps now to determine if you have ash trees on your property and how you are going to manage them.

Take the following steps to decide how to manage ash trees on your property from the threat of emerald ash borer:

- · Identify and inventory ash trees: figure out if you have ash trees, how many you have, and where they are located.
- · Determine if your ash trees are worth saving: they should be healthy, at least 30 inches in circumference or 10 inches in diameter at chest height, show no or few signs of emerald

ash borer infestation, in a good location, and valuable to the property owner.

 Work with a certified arborist to treat trees that are worth saving: use a trunk injection

> of ememectin benozoate (commercial name Tree-age) every two to three years in late spring; cost is typically \$100 to \$200 depending on the size of the tree.

 Monitor and make a plan for removal for trees that aren't being treated: monitor your trees for signs of emerald ash borer, work with a certified arborist to remove your trees when necessary between October 1 and April 30 to avoid the season when emerald ash



borer is active, and consider planting a tree or two to replace any you remove.

- Make sure dirt stock piles have adequate protection around the base. Small piles can be covered for extra protection.
- Silt fences should be secured. They must be rechecked in the spring, but a fall check will result in fewer spring repairs.
- Check your construction entrance if the drive is not complete and make sure there is plenty of rock to cover open dirt.


