FROM THE OUTINGS CHAIR

Happy New Year! Here is my summary for the PV-SB Outings program for 2008.

PV-SB has more outings than any other entity in the Angeles Chapter. Why does the Sierra Club have so many outings when we are basically an environmental/conservation organization? Sierra Club Purpose #1 "To explore, enjoy and protect the planet." Outings are the "explore and enjoy" on the way to "protect."

PV-SB has 55 leaders including three who were newly certified in 2008. What does it take for a volunteer leader to become and remain "Certified"? An initial CPR and first aid class, plus a written test to pass, plus a trial hike while being evaluated. Then every four years all leaders must again take first aid and leadership training. Angeles Chapter requires that there be two certified leaders on all hikes except conditioning hikes. All of these leader requirements are in the interest of your health and safety.

PV-SB has five weeknight conditioning hikes, ranging from beach walks to strenuous workouts. Some of the strenuous ones separate into two to five hikes, with your choice of pace.

PV-SB has about six weekend local hikes every month, plus several in our regional mountains.

PV-SB leads 6 or 7 bus/motel trips each year with a total of about 45 participants on each trip. We even conduct international tours. Look for details in each issue of the *Foggy View*.

PV-SB Outings had a very good year. We hope you did too!
