FALL - JUNIOR YEAR	 Compile a list of your top ten schools based on your areas of interest. Investigate financial aid options: fellowships, assistantships, and loans. Become familiar with admissions requirements—they vary by school.
WINTER - JUNIOR YEAR	 Narrow your list to top five schools for your area of interest. Visit campus of top five schools, and meet faculty and students.
SPRING - JUNIOR YEAR	 Send for application materials. Register for graduate tests required for your area of study. Begin preparing for graduate tests. Request letters of recommendation. Write draft statement of purpose.
SUMMER	 Obtain letters of recommendation. Request grade transcripts –send directly to schools. Finalize statement of purpose.
FALL - SENIOR YEAR	 Check application deadlines for schools to which you will apply. Take graduate admission (standardized) tests. Apply for national fellowships. Submit application materials.
	Schedule confirmation visits to schools.

SPRING - SENIOR YEAR

• Notify chosen college of your acceptance.

• Make plans to move to new school—housing, banking, etc.

• Notify other colleges and financial aid providers if you are declining their offers.





Applying to Graduate School

- Four items get you started:
 - 1. Fill out the online application: http://graduate-recruitment.uark.edu/applying/index.php
 - 2. Pay the application fee.
 - 3. Submit transcripts from all colleges and universities attended since high school. There is no need to submit transcripts for course work taken at the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville.
 - 4. Submit GRE scores. School code is 6866.





Application Review

- Your application is reviewed by the Graduate and International Admissions office. If you meet the requirements for admission into graduate school, your file will be forwarded to the department for an admission decision.
 - Minimum requirement for admission into graduate school is an earned baccalaureate from an accredited school with a 3.0 GPA on the last 60 hours of the degree, or a cumulative 3.0 GPA
- The program may have additional admission requirements:
 - Letters of recommendation, a personal statement, a resume





How GRE Scores Are Used

- As part of the admission review
 - Some programs have established minimum scores that students must earn in order to be admitted into the program
 - Check with the graduate coordinator for the program, or
 - Check the program's web site
- When deciding which students to nominate for a Distinguished Doctoral Fellowship or Doctoral Academy Fellowship
 - There are minimum GPA and GRE score requirements
 - The fellowships provide a supplemental stipend of either \$22,000 per year for 4 years or \$12,000 per year for four years
 - Added to the graduate assistant package that includes monthly stipend, tuition waiver and health insurance premium discount





GRE Not Required For:

- MS and PhD* applicants to Electrical Engineering if the student holds a BSEE from the University of Arkansas
- Applicants to the online MS in Engineering
- MS and PhD* applicants to Microelectronics-Photonics
- Applicants to the MSOM in Operations Management if the student received a 3.0 GPA or above on bachelor's degree

*...unless you are hoping to be nominated for a doctoral fellowship

What is the GRE?

the **GRE** exam is a broad assessment of your critical thinking, analytical writing, verbal reasoning, and quantitative reasoning skills — all skills developed over the course of many years.

Registration Checklist

- Check the test fees.
- Read the reschedule and cancellation policies.
- Read and understand the <u>ID requirements</u>. You are responsible for bringing valid and acceptable ID when you report to a test center, and it must match the name you used when creating your account and registering for your test.
- Decide when you would like to take the test.
 - Computer-delivered Tests: The computer-delivered test is offered year round on a first-come, first-served basis. View <u>seat availability</u> for your preferred date and location.
 - Paper-delivered Tests: See test dates.
 - Be sure to allow sufficient time for <u>score reporting</u> when scheduling your test so you can meet the admissions deadlines for the schools to which you are applying.
- Create an ETS Account to get the most up-to-date test center information. Not all test centers are open on all dates.
- Determine which graduate institutions or fellowship sponsors (PDF) you want to receive your scores. As part of your test fee, you can designate up to four score recipients.
- If you prefer to send score reports later or want to send score reports to more than four recipients, you can <u>send additional score reports</u> for a fee.
- Learn about the FREE <u>GRE®</u> <u>Search Service</u> and how graduate and business school recruiters around the world use it to find prospective students. You will have the option to sign up for the Search Service when you register for the GRE General Test.

Before you can register for a GRE® General Test, you need to create an ETS Account. In addition to using your account to register for a test, you'll also use it to:

- Sign up for the free GRE® Search Service
- View your scores
- View, change or cancel your registration
- Order Additional Score Reports
- Access the free GRE Diagnostic Service
- Purchase test preparation materials
- Choose to receive important notifications concerning your test and scores through text messages in addition to email

Note: If you already have an account for the *TOEFL®* or *Praxis®* programs, you can enter that user name and password as a returning user for your ETS Account.

The Name You Use

You can create an account at any time, regardless of whether or not you plan to register for a GRE test. However, the name you use when you create your account will also be the name you use when you register for your GRE test, so it's important to make sure that it exactly matches the ID you plan to present on the day of your test. If it doesn't, you may be prohibited from taking the test or your scores may be canceled. Learn more about The Name You Use.



GRE Breakdown

Structure of the Computer-delivered GRE General Test

Section	Number of Questions	Time
Analytical Writing (One section with two separately timed tasks)	 One "Analyze an Issue" task One "Analyze an Argument" task 	30 minutes per task
Verbal Reasoning (Two sections)	20 questions per section	30 minutes per section
Quantitative Reasoning (Two sections)	20 questions per section	35 minutes per section
Unscored or Research Section*	Varies	Varies

^{*}An unidentified unscored section may be included and may appear in any order after the Analytical Writing section. Additionally, an identified research section that is not scored may be included in place of the unscored section, and it is always at the end of the test.





GRE Score Overview

Verbal Reasoning

- Score scale 130-170
 - 170 = 99%
 - 151 = 51%
 - 145 = 26%

Analytical Writing

- Score scale 0.0-6.0
 - 6.0 = 99%
 - 5.0 = 93%
 - 4.5 = 82%
 - 4.0 = 59%
 - 3.5 = 42%

Quantitative Reasoning

- Score scale 130-170
 - 170 = 97%
 - 153 = 51%
 - 147 = 24%


<u>Verbal and Quantitative</u> scores are scaled in 1point increments

Analytical Writing scores are scaled in ½-point increments





What is a good score?







A good score is the score that gets you where you want to go!

For top graduate programs in engineering:

- Princeton reports that its average GRE scores for admitted students are 161 V and 162 Q.
- Harvard showed that its average scores for successful applicants to the engineering program are 161 V, 165 Q, and 4.3 AW.
- USC's averages in engineering are 155 V and 159 Q.

Some Tips From a Student

- Used Barron's GRE Prep book, Manhattan Prep Books, and Kaplan GRE Prep notecards
- Take diagnostic tests in Barron's books. Then study weakness. Then take another test.
- Barron's book comes with CD and 2 practice tests.
 - Take test on computer because this is how it will be done and is different than paper test
 - Use only the materials you will have on the day of the test
- Manhattan Prep books are subject specific. Get the ones associated with your weak subjects.
 - Register your book and get access to 6 practice computer GRE exams and a calculator similar to what is allowed on the exam
 - You might look at their practice GRE book (thousands of questions)
- Kaplan GRE Prep notecards gets you access to an App
- Look for online databases of GRE writing prompts
- Lynda.com has a GRE prep video series. Free for UA students.





What's Next?

- 1. Writing English proficiency test: (international students only)
- 2. Shortlisting universities: select universities based on **your** profile, area of interest, budget, reputation, market value etc. (6-10 universities to be safe)
- 3. Undergraduate transcripts: The schools you are going to apply to will ask for you academic records from the institution you received/pursuing your under graduate degree from.
- 4. Writing a statement of purpose: Graduate schools usually require an essay outlining your interests and reasons behind pursuing graduate studies. This is considered a pivotal aspect of your application and calls for investing time.
- 5. Getting letters of recommendations: You might be asked to provide letters of recommendations (usually three) from either your professors during you under graduate studies or from your colleagues if you are a working professional.
- 6. Completing the online application process: You might be asked to upload your statement of purpose and the scanned copy of your transcripts during online application process.
- 7. Sending GRE scores to the university via ETS: (TOEFL if you are an international applicant)
- 8. WAIT!: It usually takes one to three months for the universities to make a decision regarding your application.
