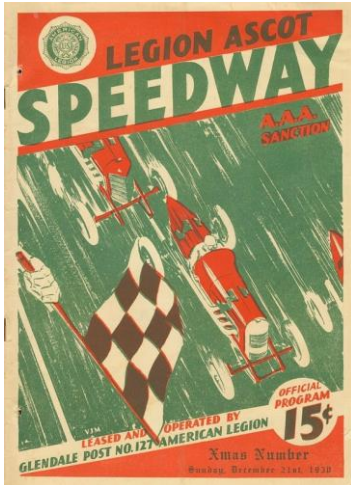

Big car races. The purse for the meeting was \$525, with the winner getting \$325, but this compared with a purse for a similar meeting earlier in the year of \$750. The drivers were unhappy with this, and William "Shorty" Wolfe attempted to persuade the track owners to increase the money on offer. When the feature was called, none of the drivers moved, and as the drivers met with officials in the judges stand, the heated words were heard track-wide as the public address system was left on for some time. Over two hours later, and the argument was still not solved, and restless fans started to chant, followed half an hour later with bottles being thrown onto the track. A group of spectators who had demanded a refund advanced across the track, toppling the judges stand and setting it alight, followed shortly after by the grandstand.

Drivers and crews hurriedly loaded their race cars and fled the track together with the officials. Witnesses identified racer Mauri Rose as the man who threw the first bottle - he had been at the track as a spectator. Rose was charged for his participation in the events, and pled guilty to a single count of malicious destruction of property and was fined \$175 with \$24.35 added for court costs - a charge of rioting was dropped.

Dynax



Dynax was the racing fuel for Evinrude Elto outboard motors, so was used for motorboat racing as well as outboard powered midgets. Made by DuPont, Dynax was 70% synthetic methanol (a byproduct of making synthetic ammonia), a small amount of benzol to increase flammability of the lean mixture, and a blend of castor oil for crankcase lubrication and higher alcohols to generate lubrication on burning. Dynax was considerably more expensive than gasoline but Evinrude company tests show it gained an extra 125 r.p.m. in an "F" motor and about a 7% increase in horsepower. It was of a heavier consistency than most fuel and required bigger fuel lines, bigger jets and even weighted carb floats to be most effective.

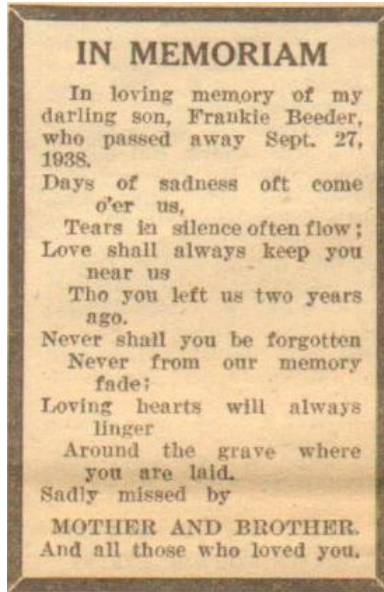
