What are Keywords | Skill Words

 Keywords | Skill Words are the words typed into the ATS by employers and recruiters to find appropriate resumes or used by screeners to determine your qualifications

 Regardless of how well-qualified you are, if your resume doesn't contain the words used by the employer, you will not make the connection to the job via the ATS or human screener







Big Data

- Employers are using more and more data analytics to source of potential hires
- ATS programs are getting more expensive and not delivering 100% of the results that employers are demanding
- Social Media sourcing (LinkedIn, Twitter, Facebook, etc.) is growing







Understanding Big Data

- ATS
 - Three parses of your application
 - Via the ATS (Yes/No)
 - Via a Recruiter if analytics aren't viable
 - Via HR if compliance is required







Understanding Big Data

- Social Media
 - Specifically LinkedIn
 - First parse is your Headline
 - Second parse are your Skills
 - Third parse is your Summary

TOP BASELINE SKILLS

The table at left shows a ranked list of top baseline skills by career area, highlighting those skills which are more commonly requested, and thus more valued, for each particular group of jobs. For example, Relationship Building is the third-mostrequested baseline skill in external-facing Sales and Marketing jobs, but falls to 19th overall in Design and Media roles, behind even more STEM-intensive fields.
