- Provides a career ladder you can use to advance in the field from assistant, to cook, to manager, to director.



# **INITIAL APPLICATION FEE**

**NOTE:** This is an nonrefundable application fee. You will be notified if you are missing information. You will have 30 calendar days to respond. If your documents are not received within 30 calendar days, you will have to re-submit a new application, documentation, and fee.

# **CERTIFICATION RENEWAL**



- You have to maintain your certification by renewing annually and paying an annual renewal fee.
- Three months prior to your certification expiration date, SNA will mail you a letter and renewal application.
- You are only required to submit CEU documentation if you receive an audit notice from SNA.

## TRAINER CERTIFICATION RENEWAL



Once you become a Certified Trainer, you have to maintain this certification by **paying an annual maintenance fee and renewing every 3 years.** Three months prior to your Trainer Certification expiration date, SNA will mail you a letter and renewal application.

- Certification and Credentialing Governing Council will review the Certification Program in the Fall 2010.




- The SNS Credentialing Exam tests candidates on the knowledge and skills required to perform specific job activities related to school nutrition.

#### **SNS CREDENTIAL**

Key Area Requirement Additional 30 college credits in any of the four Key Areas:

(Operations, Nutrition, Administration or Communications/Marketing.)

#### <u>OR</u>

Supervisor/Director-level work experience in child nutrition programs may be substituted for the 30 college credits.

(**NOTE:** 1 year of work experience equals 10 college credits, therefore, 3 years of additional work experience may substitute the additional 30 college credit requirement.)



- The Credentialing Exam Handbook contains the exam application forms and requirements.
- The handbook is available by contacting SNA's Service Center or online at www.schoolnutrition.org
- You must:
  - Submit a copy of your transcript
  - Submit the application (page 11), work verification form (page 13), appropriate fee and SNA will verify that you meet the eligibility requirements.

# **CREDENTIALING FEES**

**NOTE:** Individuals who don't meet the eligibility requirements or cancel the exam will have the processing fee of \$45 deducted from their refund. Those who do not reschedule or are "no-shows" on exam day will not receive a refund for the exam fee. Individuals who fail the exam will have to re-apply and pay the exam fee again.

# PREPARING FOR THE EXAM

- Use the Credentialing Handbook as your main resource to prepare for the exam. It contains the Content Outline for the exam and provides a comprehensive list of resource materials.
- The SNS Study Guide is one of several resource tools that addresses broad topics essential to school nutrition programs; however, *it is not intended to be the sole source* for preparing for the SNS exam . It may be purchased for \$40 through the SNA Emporium toll Free at 800-728-0728.

# **EXAM CONTENT OUTLINE**



The 8 core content areas covered in the SNS Credentialing Exam are: *(note specified percentage weights for each area)* 

- Nutrition & Menu Planning 20%
- Food Production 15%
- Marketing of Nutrition Programs 10%
- Safety and Sanitation 15%

Facilities Management – 5%
Personnel Management – 10%
Financial Management – 20%
Operations/General Management – 5%

# **CREDENTIALING EXAM**



- Those who take the exam will receive results six to eight weeks after taking the exam.
- Individuals who pass will receive an SNS Certificate and are able to order the SNS Pin.
  - To renew, you must complete 45 CEUs within the three year credentialing period.
- Those who fail will receive a letter and Diagnostic Report showing the areas of weakness in the exam.

# MOST FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



### How Long Does It Take To Process My Application?



- Initial applications and renewals take 4-6 weeks for processing.
- Payments first go through SNA's bank.
- Applications then go to SNA Headquarters for processing.
- SNA mails out notice letters for certification and credentialing.

### I'M BEING AUDITED FOR CERTIFICATION! I HAVE A 3 YEAR PERIOD, HOW MANY CEUS DO I SEND ?

Level 3	45 CEUs during 3 year period	

#### WHAT TYPES OF CEU DOCUMENTATION WILL SNA ACCEPT ?



- Certificates of Completion
- Copies of Rosters
- College/University Transcripts
- Program Agendas
   Program Books/Brochures
  - Registration Confirmation Letters
  - Badges
  - Payment Receipts



### I HAVE A I YEAR CERTIFICATION PERIOD. WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

- Under the new annual program.
- Renew annually by paying the renewal fee and submitting the renewal form.
- Required to submit documentation of CEUs if audited.
- Follow these CEU requirements:

LEVELS	CEUs
Level 1	6 CEUs during 1 year period
Level 2	12 CEUs during 1 year period
Level 3	18 CEUs during 1 year period

#### I JUST GOT CERTIFIED OR CREDENTIALED! WHEN WILL I RECEIVE MY PAY INCREASE?

- SNA is not responsible for any monetary awards.
- Pay increases or bonuses are unique agreements between you and your employer.
- Check with your supervisor or human resources department about documentation requirements and timelines.

#### I FAILED TO RENEW BY MY CERTIFICATION EXPIRATION DATE. SCHOOL SSOCIATION WHAT DO I DO?

- You need to re-apply for your Level.
- Complete the application form.
- Submit required documentation for initial certification.
- Pay the initial certification fee.

### I LOGGED-IN TO MYSNA AND Don'T SEE ALL MY COURSES LISTED. WHY IS THAT?



- SNA stopped processing CEUs beginning September 1, 2008.
- SNA only tracks CEUs for SNA sponsored activities (ANC, LAC, CNIC, NLC, SNA Webinars)
- *NOTE:* Please do not send CEUs to SNA to input in your record.

### It's TIME FOR ME TO RENEW. Can I Take A Course Twice To Count As CEUs?



- Courses <u>cannot</u> be repeated twice during your certification or SNS renewal period.
- CEUs must be job related growth experiences.
- A course in basket weaving will not count for CEUs.

#### CAN I USE CEUS I EARNED OUTSIDE MY CERTIFICATION OR CREDENTIAL DATE RANGE?



- No. CEUs must be earned and can only be counted during your renewal period.
- They cannot be rolled-over from one period to the next.

#### Do I Have To Take Healthy Edge In Order To Become A Trainer?



- No. You do not have to take Healthy Edge.
- Any 10 Hour Nutrition Education Course will suffice.
- A 1 college credit course in Nutrition will also meet this requirement.
