This is part of a larger Wesley initiative aimed at providing technological support to our neighbors. We have a volunteer willing to teach classes and have received a \$1,500 grant from the West District. Now, we just need to figure out if/what we can do to serve our neighbors. Might we offer classes for adults? Or could we offer tutoring/mentoring or a computer lab at the church for students? We will work to figure out what the community needs, but let us know what you might be interested in doing. Hopefully we can get creative on how we serve our neighbors.

FIVE MONTHS.....AND COUNTING

At the end of each month, Wesley's Financial Secretary, Betty Martin, produces a financial statement for the latest month and the year to date. The Finance Committee examines each statement in detail, then authorizes publication of multiple copies, and provides copies on the table in the narthex for anyone who wants a personal copy.

You may -- or may not -- have an interest in the eight pages of information about our church but each report almost statistical certainly contains some facts and figures that should be of interest to anyone who has any concern about the financial health and wellbeing of our institution. For example, in the latest report (for the first five months of this year, through May), you will see ---- the total budgeted expenses for this year, as approved by our church council, come to \$213,450 which the church must raise through the offering plates and other sources to meet these expenses. so, for the first five months, we should have put in the bank 5/12 of \$213,450, or about \$89,000, -- but, at the top of the report for May, we see we have collected only \$76,100, or about \$13,000 less than what we need, --looking at the sources of expected income (top of page 1), one obvious source of the shortfall is fundraisers. To meet our needs, our budget estimates that about \$14,000 will have to come from events and programs and income-producing money-makers by the church and its committees and ministries....and less than \$1,400 (10%) has been raised to date this year.

Obviously, this is a call for every group and committee and ministry of the church to consider ways to raise funds to supplement what comes in from offerings and other sources. The Finance Committee raised about \$1,100 from its recent "garage sale", and has already scheduled another one in November. What are you planning?

We Connect Callers to a Powerful Prayer Network. Our ministry is dedicated to fulfill the mission of Galatians 6:2 Bear one another's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ. Funding for the toll-free line is provided by The Upper Room, United Methodist Men groups, and individual gifts.

Intercessory prayer groups across the world are a vital part of the prayer ministry. Upper Room Covenant Prayer Groups, chartered after a minimal study period, receive prayer requests weekly or monthly from The Upper Room by mail or by phone. There are now over 255 Covenant Prayer Groups across the United States and abroad.

How The Center Works:

Each day, hundreds of people request prayer by calling the Living Prayer Center's toll-free number (1-800-251-2468) (available 7 am - 11 pm). This is more than our staff can handle, so we rely on the assistance of about 200 volunteers around the country. For example, our incoming calls can be forwarded to your home or church phone number.

You might choose to receive calls for just two hours a week. Even small commitments of time make a real difference! If you're led to participate in this ministry, contact us.

As your heart connects with callers, you make notes about their specific needs before praying with them. This information is then shared with our Covenant Prayer Groups around the world, who will continue to pray for the caller.

To become a phone volunteer, all you need is a vital Christian experience out of which to share with persons who call, and a desire to grow in your own prayer life

Christian Alliance is also sending a Healthcare Clinic to Belize that was built by A & M United Methodist Church. This clinic is being loaded with medical supplies and will be sent out in the next few weeks.

Thanks to volunteers like your church and Mr. Andy Sloat, who brought the rice and beans to Christian Alliance, we are able to help families in need. Working together we make a difference.
