### SERIES HISTORY

Boise State leads the all-time series against New Mexico, 13-8, and have won seven-straight against the Lobos. The Broncos' last loss in Albuquerque came on May 3, 2015.

### SCOUTING REPORT

Among players who have taken at least 50 at-bats, New Mexico is led at the plate by the duo of Cameryn O'Grady (.355) and Bailey Klitzke (.337). Both have batted in 23 runs this season, while O'Grady's 13 doubles leads the team.

In the circle, Kennedy Ferguson (4-12) and Kianna Spencer (5-13) have logged the majority of innings for the Lobos. Despite a record of 11-29, the combined winning percentage of New Mexico's opponents this year, .589, leads the conference.

### A SIMILAR TREND

Despite being at .500 in conference play, Boise State is following a similar trend that led them to the 2018 Mountain West title. Against conference opponents the team has played thus far this season (UNLV, San Diego State, San José State and Utah State) the Broncos are trending only a game behind last season's 7-5 mark, with an additional loss to the Spartans being the difference.

### FIVE CHEERS FOR THE MOUNTAIN WEST

One of the largest deciding factors between the 2018 season and the 2019 season has been the overall strength of the Mountain West. In Monday's release of the RPI, the conference placed five teams in the top 64 of the metric used to help determine at-large bids to the national

championship. The Broncos still lead the pack, checking in at 28th in RPI.

Colorado State (31st), UNLV (37th), San José State (50th) and Fresno State (56th) bolsters the conference's attempt to become a multi-bid league this season, as the Mountain West currently ranks as the seventh-best league in the nation.

### GETTING IT DONE AGAINST WINNERS

The Broncos are currently 23rd nationally in winning percentage with a 26-8 record (.765). What's most impressive about the team's 34-game start to the season, is Boise State's success against teams with a winning record. The Blue and Orange are 10-6 (.625) against teams with a record of .500 or better this year. The combined winning percentage of Boise State's opponents this season is .539, a mark that is third in the Mountain West, and best of program's with a winning record.

### MAKING PETER BRAND PROUD

Alongside leading the lineup with a batting average of .417, Kora Wade has reached base in 26-consecutive games, currently the longest streak on the team. Her on-base streak dates back to a 2-1 win over Yale, Feb. 23, while she has successfully reached base in 32-out-of-34 games this season. Wade would no-doubt catch the eye of the fictitious MLB executive Peter Brand from the film Moneyball.

Her streak is also the third-longest on-base streak in program history, behind only Devon Bridges (35 games) and Tara Glover (37 games).



**ADAMS NEARS RECORD**

Sophomore Ashlyn Adams has quietly putting together a .402 batting average on the season – a strong reversal after opening the first 10 games of the season seven-for-30. The outfielder has recorded a hit in 16-consecutive games which ties the longest hitting streak in program history.

**BUT WHO HAVE THEY PLAYED?**

Heading into the Stacy Winsberg Memorial Tournament, the Broncos had the opportunity to make a statement on the national scale, as four of their five opponents were appearing in at least one of the two major polls. Despite the game against No. 2/1 UCLA being cancelled due to rain, Boise State was still able to notch wins over Loyola Marymount, Long Beach State and Ole Miss – three teams that were receiving votes in the latest polls.

The win over Ole Miss is also the first win over an SEC team in program history.

**CERVANTES NAMED PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

Following a record-breaking performance, senior Rebekah Cervantes was named the Mountain West Player of the Week on March 26. Cervantes batted in a school-record eight runs in the final game against San Diego State. For the week, she hit a double, a triple and four home runs, while batting in a total of 12 runs. This is the third-time Cervantes has garnered conference player of the week honors.

**AT LAST, WE'VE REACHED THE POLLS**

Since the program's inception in 2009, Boise State has never been ranked in any of the three major polls: USA Today/NFCA Coaches' poll, ESPN.com/USA Softball poll, and the Softball America poll. All that changed on March 5, 2019 with the release of the Week 4 Softball America Poll, currently in its inaugural season, which pegged the Broncos as 24th in the nation.

In Week 5, Team XI held steady in that publication, but also moved into 24th in the USA Today/NFCA Coaches' Poll – the first time Boise State has been ranked by that respective outlet. The Broncos were also the first team in the receiving votes category of the ESPN.com/USA Softball poll. This marks the second-consecutive, and second all-time, week that Boise State has appeared in all three of the major polls in a given week.

Currently, Boise State is receiving votes in both the NFCA and USA Softball Polls. The Softball America Poll does not feature a receiving votes category.

**LIVRERI ERA STARTS WITH A BANG**

At 26-8 on the season, Boise State is off to the best 34-game start in program history. Currently 23rd in the NCAA in winning percentage, first-year head coach Maggie Livreri led the Broncos through the best non-conference season in program history, and has posted a better winning percentage than any other first-year head coach in the country this season.

**THREE CHEERS FOR ADAMS**

With five triples on the season, Ashlyn Adams has already established a new single-season record for triples in a season. Adams broke the record with a triple in the second game of the series against UNLV (March 16). The sophomore is currently tied for third, with Kora Wade, on the Boise State career record book with five triples.

**BRONCOS SWEEP MW AWARDS**

Boise State swept the Mountain West weekly awards for games played Feb. 11-17. Jessica McKay was named the Player of the Week, while Gianna Mancha was named the Pitcher of the Week. This is the first time this season a Boise State player has received a weekly recognition from the conference, and the first time the Broncos has swept both honors since doing it in back-to-back weeks last season (April 16-22 and April 23-29).

This is the first time McKay or Mancha has received a weekly honor from the conference.

**THE LIVRERI ERA BEGINS**

The Texas Classic marked a new era for Boise State softball, as they played the first games under the direction of head coach Maggie Livreri – the third head coach in program history. Boise State went 2-2 at the Texas Classic.

Livreri was hired in July to replace head coach Cindy Ball, who took the head coach job at UCF. Livreri spent the past seven years on staff at Utah, with the final two being as the associate head coach. The Utes made three NCAA tournament appearances, including two Super Regional appearances.

**RESPECT IS EARNED**

A year after proving the coaches of the conference wrong, Boise State received respect from their peers with the release of the Mountain West preseason poll. The Broncos were picked to win the conference, receiving eight of the nine first-place votes (coaches aren't allowed to vote for their own team). Boise State was followed by Fresno State in second, and San José State in third.

## SENG, CERVANTES RECEIVE NATIONAL RECOGNITION

Both Rebekah Cervantes and Alison Seng were named to Preseason All-America teams leading up to the season opener. Both were named to Fastpitch News' honorable mention team, while Seng was also named to the fourth team of Justin's World of Softball.

Seng was also named to USA Softball's Player of the Year Top 50 Watch List, becoming only the third player in program history to appear on the watch list (Devon Bridges- 2012, Tara Glover- 2013).

## TOP OF THE MOUNTAIN

Boise State won the first conference title in program history in 2018, claiming the Mountain West with an 18-6 record in league play.

Following losses in the first two games of the series against UNLV (April 13-15), the Broncos closed the regular season with a 13-1 record, sweeping three of their final four seasons. During that stretch, the Broncos outscored opponent 105-46 to close out the season.

## GOING TO NEED A BIGGER TROPHY CASE

The 2018 season brought plenty of recognition for the Boise State softball team. Along with the program's first Mountain West title, Boise State:

- Had the Mountain West player (Rebekah Cervantes), pitcher (Kelsey Broadus), freshman (Alison Seng) and coach (Cindy Ball) of the year for a perfect sweep.
- A record six on the All-Mountain West teams (First- Madison Anthony, Kelsey Broadus, Rebekah Cervantes, Alison Seng; Second- Shaelee Pearson, Makenzie Sullivan)
- A record six named to the NFCA All-Region teams (Second- Kelsey Broadus, Rebekah Cervantes; Third- Ashlyn Adams, Alison Seng, Makenzie Sullivan, Kora Wade)

## CRASHING THE PARTY

In its 10th year in existence, Boise State is made the first-ever appearance at the NCAA Tournament in program history, by virtue of securing the Mountain West's automatic qualifier. The Broncos also set program records with their first-ever conference title, and setting program records for wins in a season (40), and conference wins in a season (18).

## PTOLEMY WAS WRONG TOO

Boise State proved the coaches of the Mountain West wrong, just as famed Greco-Roman astronomer Claudius Ptolemy was proven wrong for his geocentric beliefs.

The Broncos finished six spots ahead of their preseason conference ranking in the coaches' poll (No. 7) - the largest outperformance for any conference champion in MW softball history. The last time a Mountain West team won the conference after being predicted to finish in the bottom half of the coaches' poll was BYU in 2001, when they were predicted to finish fifth out of six teams.

## RECORD SETTING OFFENSE

The nation's number one offense resided in Boise, Idaho during the 2018 season. The Broncos led the nation in both batting average (.354) and scoring (6.77 runs per game). Both marks set school records, and rank second in the history of the Mountain West.

Entering the season, Boise State had only had two players bat over .400 in a single season. In 2018, the Broncos had four players finish the season batting over .400:

- Alison Seng- .439
- Rebekah Cervantes- .427
- Madison Anthony- .409
- Ashlyn Adams- .402

## STARTING TRIO EMERGES IN THE CIRCLE

With the graduation of Christina Washington at the end of the 2017 season, Boise State turned to a trio to handle the majority of the workload in the circle in 2018. Of the team's 358.1 innings pitched in the season, 83.1-percent was handled by Kelsey Broadus (123.2 IP), Gianna Mancha (113.0 IP) and Micaela Leal (61.2 IP). Leal transitioned from a relief pitcher to having two starts under her belt by the end of the season (8-1 record).

# The Livreri Era Begins

Third head coach in program history begins first season at the helm

Maggie Livreri was hired as the third head coach in Boise State softball history, Director of Athletics Curt Apsey announced on July 5, 2018.

Livreri (luh-VARE-ee) spent the previous seven seasons at Utah, her final two as associate head coach. She helped lead the Utes to the NCAA Tournament in three-consecutive seasons (2015-17), including back-to-back Super Regional appearances in 2016 and 2017.

three-consecutive Pac-12 All-Defensive Team nods at the position from 2015-17.

“I can’t picture a better scenario for my first head coaching opportunity,” Livreri said. “Boise State is a national brand that young women want to be part of – a place that can consistently compete for conference championships and has the resources to consistently be in the NCAA Tournament conversation. I feel incredibly honored to be the new head coach for the Boise State softball program, and want to thank Curt Apsey for believing in my abilities to lead. There has been a great foundation laid here by the previous two head coaches and I look forward to building upon it. I cannot wait to get to work!”

Prior to joining the Utes, Livreri spent five seasons at her alma mater, UNLV. Following two seasons as a volunteer assistant coach (2007-08), she spent 2009-11 as a full-time assistant, helping lead the Rebels to the NCAA Tournament in 2009.

Originally from Las Vegas, she began her collegiate career at Colorado State University-Pueblo before transferring to UNLV for her final two seasons (2005-06).

She earned a bachelor’s degree in university studies in 2006, and a master’s in higher education leadership in 2008, each from UNLV.
