INVOCATION, CONFESSION, AND ABSOLUTION

Stand.

M: In the name of the Father 🖶 and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, Amen.

We have come into the presence of God, who created us to love and serve him as his dear children. But we have disobeyed him and deserve only his wrath and punishment. Therefore, let us confess our sins to him and plead for his mercy.

- C: Merciful Father in heaven, I am altogether sinful from birth. In countless ways I have sinned against you and do not deserve to be called your child. But trusting in Jesus, my Saviour, I pray: Have mercy on me according to your unfailing love. Cleanse me from my sin, and take away my guilt.
- M: God, our heavenly Father, has forgiven all your sins. By the perfect life and innocent death of our Lord Jesus Christ, he has removed your guilt forever. You are his own dear child. May God give you the strength to live according to his will.
- C: Amen.

We always begin our worship in the name of our Triune God: the Father who created us, the Son who redeemed us, and the Spirit who lives in us.

To confess is to admit we're far from perfect and so, without Jesus, shouldn't be with a perfect God.

The pastor **absolves** us of our sins, that is, reminds us we're forgiven because of Jesus' death and resurrection.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

M: Let us pray: We praise you, O God, for the great acts of love by which you redeemed us through your Son, Jesus Christ. As he was acclaimed by those who scattered their garments and branches of palm in his path, so may we always hail him as our King and follow him with perfect confidence; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

FIRST LESSON

Zechariah 9:9-10

God promises through his prophet a king who comes humbly, yet with righteousness.

Rejoice greatly, Daughter Zion! Shout, Daughter Jerusalem!
See, your king comes to you, righteous and victorious, lowly and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey.
I will take away the chariots from Ephraim and the warhorses from Jerusalem, and the battle bow will be broken.
He will proclaim peace to the nations. His rule will extend from sea to sea and from the River to the ends of the earth. We believe that the Bible is the source of all spiritual truth, and so we read lessons from it to learn who God is and what he's done for us throughout history and still today.

SECOND LESSON

Philippians 2:5-11

Paul tells us how Jesus was equally Lord of the universe with God, yet humbled himself as a human to serve us. And now he reigns once again as the highest of kings.

In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus:

Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage; rather, he made himself nothing

by taking the very nature of a servant,		
being made in human likeness.		
And being found in appearance as a man,		
he humbled himself		
by becoming obedient to death—		
even death on a cross!		
Therefore God exalted him		
to the highest place		
and gave him the name that is above		
every name,		
that at the name of Jesus every knee		
should bow,		
in heaven and on earth and under		
the earth,		
and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus		
Christ is Lord,		
to the glory of God the Father.		

VERSE OF THE DAY

M: The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified.

The congregation stands.

GOSPEL

We see Jesus fulfilling God's promise of a king, coming to save.

As they approached Jerusalem and came to Bethphage on the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them, "Go to the village ahead of you, and at once you will find a donkey tied there, with her colt by her. Untie them and bring them to me. If anyone says anything to you, say that the Lord needs them, and he will send them right away."

This took place to fulfill what was spoken through the prophet:

"Say to Daughter Zion, 'See, your king comes to you, gentle and riding on a donkey, and on a colt, the foal of a donkey.""

The disciples went and did as Jesus had instructed them. They brought the donkey and the colt and placed their cloaks on them for Jesus to sit on. A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, while others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. The crowds that went ahead of him and those that followed shouted,

"Hosanna to the Son of David!"

Matthew 21:1-11

Gospel means "Good News," and so this is a reading from the historical biographies of Jesus that tells us the good news of how Jesus came into this world to save us.

John 12:23

"Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!"

"Hosanna in the highest heaven!"

When Jesus entered Jerusalem, the whole city was stirred and asked, "Who is this?"

The crowds answered, "This is Jesus, the prophet from Nazareth in Galilee."
