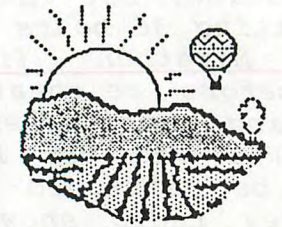

#### CANINE COMPANIONS

Pete Gorman, director of Canine Companions for Independence explained how working for Diane Finstein was excellent training to work with dogs. Seriously, for the last 15 years Canine Companions has trained dogs to compensate for a human's disability. The dogs learn 89 commands, which may be linked in a series to accomplish very complicated tasks.

A disabled person must learn to be assertive. During Boot Camp (aka Assertive Training) the potential masters work with several dogs and are later

matched with the best dog for their personality and needs at graduation. Some are elated, while others who are not suited to be masters are disappointed. Demand is much greater than supply as there are 10 applicants for every available dog.

Funding for this program comes from donations and fundraisers. None of the \$2,000,000 dollar budget comes from any government. Offices are located in Ohio, NY, Florida, San Diego in addition to the main office is in Santa Rosa. Another tribute to this organization is the fact that 67% of disabled people in this country are unemployed, while those with CC dogs are gainfully employed.

We watched Fraiser, a trainee dropout, demonstrate his expertise. He did very well. You can learn more about Canine Companions for Independence and how you can help by contacting their Santa Rosa office at 528-0830.

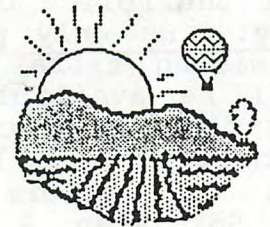

**CRIME AND COMMUNITY GROWTH;  
DRUGS AND WHAT WE CAN EXPECT**

Santa Rosa Police Chief **Sal Rosano** explained how growth has affected the crime rate in Santa Rosa. Santa Rosa has grown steadily since 1977 and projections are that Santa Rosa will be 150 to 175,000 citizens by the end of the decade. How can our police deal with the increase in growth?

The fact is our police are doing an excellent job. To illustrate his point, Chief **Rosano** explained the number of calls requesting police services, have declined on a per capita basis. When compared to other cities of like size, Santa Rosa's Crime rate per capita is much lower. However, Santa Rosa spends less per capita on police services than other cities. This will change as our city becomes less rural and more urban.

Drugs are the main problem facing our nation. The problems we see in the "Big" cities now will be here in the future. In the "Big" city, kids in kindergarten are coming to school with hearing aids in both ears, which points to parents drug abuse prior to birth.

We can fight drugs in two ways. First is to jail users and small pushers. This will drive the price up and cause increased crime as users try to support their habit. We can legalize drugs. This didn't work in England where they are now trying to reillegalize drugs. The key is to reduce demand, which takes many years of education and hard work.

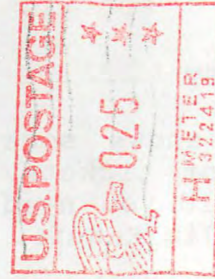

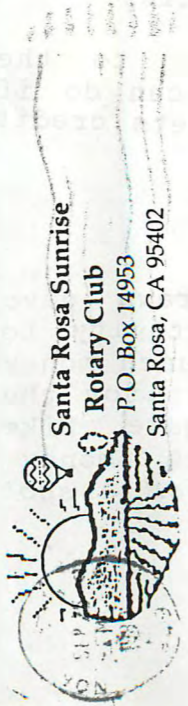
