QUICKLY...

◆ The South Carolina Gamecocks (2-3, 1-3 SEC) play game two of a five-game homestand when they host the Georgia Bulldogs (3-2, 1-2 SEC) on Saturday, October 8 at Williams-Brice Stadium.

◆ Game time is set for 7:30 p.m. with the SEC Network televising the contest. Brent Musburger and Jesse Palmer will be in the booth with Kaylee Hartung working the sidelines.

◆ The South Carolina-Georgia game is traditionally played very early in the season. In fact, the October 8 date for this year's contest is the latest the teams have met since the 1980 season when they played on November 1. Next year, the teams will meet even later, as the November 4, 2017 encounter will be the second-latest in history, surpassed only by the November 18 game in 1939.

◆ This week's game marks the first time since South Carolina and Georgia became SEC rivals in 1992 that both teams are coming into the contest on a losing note. South Carolina dropped a 24-13 decision to Texas A&M last week, while Georgia was defeated by Tennessee in the final seconds by a 34-31 score.

CAROLINA VS. GEORGIA: This is the 69th alltime meeting between these two bordering flagship state schools. Only Clemson (113) has faced the Gamecocks more often than Georgia. The Bulldogs lead the all-time series over South Carolina by a 48-18-2 margin. Georgia holds a 19-10-2 advantage in games played in Columbia, a 28-8

lead in games played in Athens, and won the only game played at a neutral site. Since becoming SEC Eastern Division rivals in 1992, UGA owns a 15-9 advantage in the series.

ADVANTAGE CAROLINA: The Gamecocks have won four of the past six meetings with Georgia including three-straight from 2010-12 (17-6, 45-42 and 35-7). Georgia won in Athens in 2013 by a 41-30 count, but the Gamecocks bounced back with a 38-35 win in Columbia in 2014. The Bulldogs won last year's meeting by a 52-20 count. The Gamecocks have won each of the last three times the two schools have met in Columbia, with Georgia's last win here coming in 2008. In their last nine trips to Columbia dating back to 1998, Georgia has tallied more than 20 points just once.

MUSCHAMP VS. GEORGIA: South Carolina head coach Will Muschamp owns a 1-3 record as a head coach against his alma mater. The 1994 Georgia grad lost by a 24-20 count in 2011, by a 17-9 score in 2012 and by a 23-20 margin in 2013 before posting a 38-20 win in 2014, all as the head coach at the University of Florida.

GEORGIA ON MY MIND: This week's game is one that Carolina co-offensive coordinator/wide receivers coach **Bryan McClendon** had to have circled on his calendar. A 2005 Georgia graduate, McClendon spent his entire coaching career with the Bulldogs prior to joining Will Muschamp's staff on December 23, 2015. During his time in Athens, McClendon served as the Bulldogs' interim head coach and led his team to the 2016 TaxSlayer Bowl win over Penn State.

RECRUITING THE PEACH STATE: The Peach State is well-represented on Carolina's roster, as 26 players claim Georgia as their home. That represents nearly 23 percent of the 115-man roster.

MAKING A POINT: After playing 34 times from 1971-2008 without scoring 30 points in any single contest, Carolina has tallied 30-plus points in five of the last seven meetings with the Bulldogs.

WELL THAT'S DIFFERENT: After an 11-year stretch from 1998-2008 in which the teams did not score more than 38 points *combined*, the offense have had the better of it lately. In the last seven meetings, the winning team has scored at least 35 points six times and the teams have combined for over 70 points in five of those seven contests, including a record 87 points in the 2011 game that Carolina won by a 45-42 score.

A South Carolina win over Georgia would...

◆ Give the Gamecocks their fifth win in the last seven meetings against the Bulldogs. That would represent Carolina's most successful seven-year stretch against Georgia in a series that dates back to 1894 and covers 69 meetings.

♦ Give the Gamecocks' their second conference win of the season, surpassing their SEC win total from 2015, and matching their overall win total of last season at three. South Carolina went just 1-7 in SEC play last season and 3-9 overall during the 2015 campaign.

YOU ARE LOOKING LIVE: The South Carolina Gamecocks (2-3, 1-3 SEC) play game two of a five-game homestand when they host the. Georgia Bulldogs (3-2, 1-2 SEC) on Saturday, October 8 at Williams-Brice Stadium. Game time is set for 7:30 p.m. with the SEC Network televising the contest. Brent Musburger and Jesse Palmer will be in the booth with Kaylee Hartung working the sidelines.

A HISTORY LESSON: 2016 marks the 123rd season of intercollegiate football at the University of South Carolina, dating back to 1892. It is the 110th-consecutive year in which South Carolina has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team in either 1893 or 1906. Carolina is 23 games over the .500 mark with an all-time record of 588-565-44.

SEC HISTORY: The 2016 season marks South Carolina's 25th year in the SEC. South Carolina and Arkansas joined the league prior to the 1992 campaign. The Gamecocks earned the SEC Eastern Division title in the 2010 season. The Gamecocks are 84-111-1 (.431) all-time in SEC regular-season play, but are 29-24 (.547) in conference action since the start of the 2010 season.

ABOUT LAST WEEK: The Gamecocks held ninth-ranked Texas A&M well below its season average in both points and yards, but came up on the short end of a 24-13 decision last Saturday in Columbia. **A.J. Turner** gave the Gamecocks an early lead when he took the first snap from scrimmage 75 yards to paydirt. Turner finished with 113 yards on 10 carries for the first 100-yard rushing game of his career. Tight end **Hayden Hurst** continues to produce, catching five passes for a career-high 90 yards. **Perry Orth** gave the Gamecocks a late spark, connecting on 11-of-18 passes for 138 yards, all in the fourth quarter. Safety **D.J. Smith** led the defense with nine tackles.

FAST ATTACK: The Gamecocks needed just 13 seconds to get on the board against Texas A&M when **A.J. Turner** dashed 75 yards to paydirt on the first play from scrimmage. Turner's carry was the fastest score for Carolina since Nov. 20, 2010, when Marcus Lattimore ran 17 yards for a TD 13 seconds into the contest against Troy. It was the second time in five games this season that the Gamecocks tallied in the game's first minute, as **Brandon McIlwain** scooted 11 yards for a score just 17 seconds into the ECU game. Turner's burst was the longest run from scrimmage by a Gamecock since 2013 when Mike Davis had a pair of 75-yard carries (vs. UNC and vs. Georgia).

REACHING THE CENTURY MARK: Redshirt freshman **A.J. Turner** carried 10 times for 113 yards against Texas A&M, the first 100-yard rushing game of his career. His previous high was 70 yards at Vanderbilt and he entered the A&M contest with just 157 rushing yards through the season's first four games. It was the Gamecocks' first 100-yard rushing game since Brandon Wilds went for 128 yards against A&M in 2015.

SOME OFFENSIVE LIFE: Despite being held to 13 points, the Gamecock offense showed some life against the Aggies. Carolina logged offensive season highs in first downs (21), rushing yards (161), passing yards (217) and total yards (378). The Gamecocks averaged more yards per play (5.4-5.3) than did the Aggies.

FOUR ON THE MONEY: The Gamecocks had four different players complete passes against Texas A&M - quarterbacks **Brandon McIlwain** and **Perry Orth**, tight end **Hayden Hurst** and punter **Sean Kelly**. It was the first time since November 23, 2013 against Coastal Carolina (Connor Shaw, Dylan Thompson, Perry Orth, Austin Hails and Brendan Nosovitch) that South Carolina had four or more players complete a pass.

BETTER THAN AVERAGE: The Gamecock defense has held all five of its opponents to fewer points than that team has averaged this season. The Gamecocks rank sixth in the SEC and 23rd in the country in scoring defense, allowing just 18.6 points per game. Georgia comes into this week's game averaging 26.4 points per game

FORCING TURNOVERS: After forcing just one turnover in the season's first two games, the Carolina defense has forced eight turnovers in the last three contests, including four in the win over ECU. Carolina is tied for third in the SEC in turnover margin at +0.6.

CLOSING IN: Elliott Fry has scored 317 career points, just 13 shy of the school record of 330, held by Collin Mackie (1987-90). Fry is tied for 19th on the SEC list of career points scored with Tennessee's John Becksvoort, one point behind LSU's Kevin Faulk. Fry needs four more field goals to move into the SEC's career top-10 for field goals made. He has 60 career field goals. Tenth on the list is Georgia's Marshall Morgan with 64.

YOUTH WILL BE SERVED: Seventy-eight of the Gamecocks' 115-man roster, or 67.8 percent, are either freshmen or sophomores. Twelve true freshmen have seen game action this season.

17 NEW STARTERS OVERALL: Carolina had seven players make their first career start in the season opener against Vanderbilt, seven more who started for the first time against ECU, and three more get the call against Texas A&M. Of the 17 first-time starters, five are true freshmen: Randrecous Davis, Chavis Dawkins, Bryan Edwards, Brandon McIlwain, and Keir Thomas.

FEELS LIKE THE FIRST TIME: When he got the call against East Carolina in week 3, Brandon McIlwain became just the fourth true freshman to start at quarterback for the Gamecocks since they joined the SEC. Steve Taneyhill (1992), Mikal Goodman (1999) and Lorenzo Nuñez (2015) were the others.

EVERY TIME OUT: The Gamecocks have had eight players start each of the first five games of the season, four on offense - Zack Bailey, Cory Helms, Hayden Hurst, and Mason Zandi. and four on defense - Darius English, Chris Lammons, Marquavius Lewis and Taylor Stallworth.

HAPPY TO BE HOME: The Gamecocks opened the season with three road games in their first four contests, including three SEC road contests, all at night. The Gamecocks are 25-8 in their last 33 home games (.758) and 41-11 (.788) in their last 52 home games, including a school-record 18game game home winning streak. The school's previous longest home winning streak was 15 games, set from 1978-80.

NOW THAT'S A HOMESTAND: The Gamecocks are in the midst of a five-game homestand. Between October 1 and November 5, Texas A&M, Georgia, UMass, Tennessee and Missouri will venture to Williams-Brice Stadium, with a bye week scheduled for October 15. Auburn is the only other school in the country with fiveconsecutive home games on its slate this season. The last time South Carolina had five-straight home games on its schedule was in 1988 when the Gamecocks opened the season against North Carolina, Western Carolina, East Carolina, Georgia and Appalachian State.

QUARTERBACK SHUFFLE: The Gamecocks have split time at the quarterback position in three of the first five games. Senior Perry Orth came into the season as the only experienced signal-caller, while Brandon McIlwain, a true freshman, enrolled in January and went through spring drills. Orth made the start in each of the first two contests and McIlwain has started each of the last three games.

FEELING THE ORTHQUAKE: Senior signalcaller Perry Orth was the Carolina starting QB when the season began and came up with his second career win in the season-opener at Vanderbilt. After a shaky start, the veteran got things going in the second half, rallying the Gamecocks with 13 points after being blanked through the first 30 minutes. He finished the night 11-for-19 for 152 yards, hitting 6-of-7 passes in the fourth quarter. That performance earned him the start at Mississippi State. He played the entire first half and completed 9-of-17 passes for 83 yards with a pick. After sitting out the next 13 quarters, Orth returned in the fourth quarter against Texas A&M and provided a spark, hitting 11-of-18 passes for 138 yards. He is 2-8 in his 10 career starts.

MAC ATTACK: True freshman quarterback Brandon McIlwain has appeared in all five games and has started each of the last three contests. For the season, he is 56-for-106 (52.8 pct.) for 567 yards with two touchdowns and one interception. He is 1-2 as a starter, completing 40-of-73 (54.8 pct.) for 406 yards and two scores with one pick. He is also Carolina's third-leading rusher with 98 yards and a pair of scores.

WHO ARE THESE GUYS ?: Carolina's wide receivers had limited experience entering the season, combining for just 28 catches and 356 yards, and now it has been decimated with injuries. Arguably the squad's top three wideouts - Deebo Samuel, Bryan Edwards and Randrecous Davis - all sat out the Texas A&M contest with hamstring injuries. Samuel, who was expected to be the top deep threat this season, has been limited to just two games and four catches thus far. Last week, true freshman Chavis Dawkins made his first start and caught five passes, and walk-on Javon Charleston moved back to wide receiver after having spent the previous six weeks working at safety, and caught his first career pass. AND NOW WE KNOW WHY: True freshman Bryan Edwards showed why he earned the starting nod in his first collegiate game. The 6-3, 210-pounder from Conway, S.C., hauled in eight passes for 101 yards in the win over Vanderbilt. He was the only freshman receiver in the country to log a 100-yard game in the season's first week.

THE BEST IS HURST: Tight end Hayden Hurst, a 6-5, 250-pound former professional baseball player, has been a consistent go-to guy this season. The 23-year-old sophomore leads the team with 24 catches for 302 yards, including an eight-catch, 68-yard effort at Mississippi State, a seven-catch, 84-yard performance at Kentucky, and a five-catch, 90-yard outing against Texas A&M. He ranks tied for eighth in the league with 4.8 receptions per game.

THE QB'S ARE TIGHT WITH THEM: With injuries and inexperience hampering the Gamecock wideouts early in the season, the tight end trio of **Hayden Hurst, K.C. Crosby** and **Jacob August** has become a big part of the offense. In addition to Hurst's team-leading 24 catches for 302 yards, Crosby is third on the team with 12 receptions and 102 yards, nd August has added four catches for 44 yards. TURN UP: Redshirt freshman **A.J. Turner** earned the starting nod at running back during fall camp. The 5-10, 195-pounder got off to a strong start, carrying 13 times for 70 yards at Vanderbilt in the season opener. He had his best game against Texas A&M, rushing 10 times for 113 yards, including a 75-yard TD run on the first play from scrimmage. After five games, he is the Gamecocks' top rusher with 57 carries for 270 yards and two touchdowns, and has added 11 catches for 87 yards and a score. Turner, who is 19th in the country averaging 28.4 yards per kickoff return, ranks tied for fourth in the nation among freshmen with 111.2 all-purpose yards per game.

A DOWDLE SIGHTING: After undergoing surgery for a sports hernia in the offseason, then suffering a groin injury early in fall camp, true freshman **Rico Dowdle** made his first appearance for the Garnet & Black against Texas A&M. The 5-11, 211-pounder from Asheville, N.C. who now dons No. 23, was impressive in limited duty,

rushing nine times for 47 yards, averaging 5.2 yards per carry.

DISTRIBUTING THE WORKLOAD: Redshirt freshman **A.J. Turner** has done the bulk of the work from the running back position, as he has garnered 57 of the 90 carries (63 pct.) by the running backs. Here's how the Carolina running backs have performed:

WHERE HAVE ALL THE SENIORS GONE: The Gamecocks list just four seniors on the offensive side of the ball in Matrick Belton, Perry Orth, Darius Paulk and Mason Zandi. All four are redshirt seniors. Zandi is the only one of the four to begin his collegiate career at South Carolina and the only one who came to Columbia as a scholarship player. Only Minnesota (3), Old Dominion (4), Florida (4) and Troy (4) have as few seniors on offense as do the Gamecocks.

ZANDI STANDS ALONE: Redshirt senior Mason Zandi is the only senior on the offensive side of the ball on the 2016 roster that came to South Carolina as a scholarship player. Zandi, a 6-9, 315-pound local product from Chapin, S.C. was named preseason third-team All-SEC by the league's coaches. He is also just one of six players in Gamecock history with the last name starting with "Z" to earn a football letter. The most recent prior to Zandi was Zip Zanders, who lettered in 1986. Mason's father, Ali, is a native of Iran who fled his home country during its 1970s revolution.

CORY AT THE HELMS: Cory Helms, a 6-4, 310-pound junior from Alpharetta, Ga., is a welcome addition to the offensive line. Helms, who earned Freshman All-America honors in 2013 at Wake Forest, spent two seasons with the Demon Deacons before sitting out 2015 as a transfer. He started the season opener at center, but moved to right guard at Mississippi State and has started every game at that position since.

IT'S A WONDERFUL LIFE: Zack Bailey was the only Gamecock named to the 2015 SEC All-Freshman team, as selected by the league's 14 coaches. The 6-6, 315-pound true freshman from Summerville, S.C., played in all 12 games in 2015, making five starts, with three at center and two at left guard. He has started each game this season at left guard.

KNOTT YOUR STARTING CENTER: Junior **Alan Knott**, a preseason Rimington Award candidate, has made 21 career starts, most among the active players on the squad. **Skai Moore** actually has the most starts (24), but is taking a redshirt this year while rehabbing an injury.

MANNING UP IN THE RED ZONE: The Gamecock defense ranks fourth in the SEC and 12th in the nation in red zone defense, allowing points just 66.7 percent of the time (14-of-21). In 21 opportunities this season, the Carolina defense has allowed just eight touchdowns and six field goals, while forcing four turnovers in the red zone.

EVERY GAME QUA: Defensive lineman Marquavius Lewis has started all 17 games since his arrival on the Columbia campus. He owns the longest current consecutive streak of starts on the squad.

TAKING ENGLISH LESSONS: Senior defensive end **Darius English** is putting together his finest campaign. The 6-6, 245-pounder from Powder Springs, Ga., leads the Gamecocks with 5.0 of the squad's 10 sacks, including a careerbest 3.0 sacks against Kentucky. That was the most sacks by a Gamecock player since Jadeveon Clowney finished with 4.5 at Clemson on Nov. 24, 2012. English is tied for second in the SEC and 14th in the country in sacks.

GETTING IN THE SACK: The Gamecocks are averaging two sacks per game this season, producing a season-high four sacks against both East Carolina and Kentucky. **Darius English** is the top sack-master on the squad with 5.0 this season and 11.0 in his career. Here are the individual sack numbers:

THE SKAI TURNED RED(SHIRT): Skai Moore will take a redshirt and miss the 2016 season following offseason surgery to address a herniated disk in his neck. The 6-2, 220-pounder from Cooper City, Fla., was the Gamecocks' leading tackler in 2015 with 111 stops, tying for third in the SEC with 9.2 tackles per game. He also led the team with 6.5 tackles for loss and with four pass interceptions, tying for fourth in the SEC. Moore became the first Gamecock to reach the century mark in tackles since 2006, while his 111 tackles was the second-highest total recorded by a Carolina player in the last 25 years. He led the team in tackles for a third-consecutive season, becoming the first player to do so since 1992-94. In addition, Moore has 11 career picks, tying for third on the all-time list.

THE FRISCO KID: Senior Elliott Fry is 7-for-10 in the field goal department this season. He has connected on a school record 131 consecutive extra points and has hit 74.1 percent (60-of-81) of his career field goal attempts. That average jumps to 80.3 percent (57-of-71) when attempting from under 50 yards out. He holds the school's career records for extra points made and attempted and is second in points scored with 317, behind only Collin Mackie (330).

FRY BURNS THE 'DORES: Elliott Fry connected on a 48-yard field goal in the third quarter, then hit on a career-long 55-yard field goal in the final minute to provide the margin of victory in the season opening win at Vanderbilt and earn him SEC Special Teams Player of the Week honors. It tied for the second-longest field goal in Gamecock history, matching Ryan Succop's 55-yarder against Vandy in the 2006 season.

FRY FEATS:

• When **Elliott Fry** booted the game-winner at Vanderbilt in the season opener, he became the first SEC kicker to make a field goal of 55+ yds with less than one minute to play in 4th quarter (or in OT) in the last 10 years.

• Elliott Fry's 55-yard field goal matches Hawaii's Rigoberto Sanchez for the longest field goal made this season.

A NEW SHERIFF IN TOWN: Will Muschamp

was introduced as the 34th head football coach at the South Carolina on December 7, 2015. A 21-year coaching veteran, Muschamp, a 1994 graduate of Georgia, has spent 13 years in the SEC, including four as the head coach at Florida, where he posted a 28-21 record from 2011-14. He was recognized as the SEC Coach of the Year in 2012 after an 11-win campaign. Last season, he served as the defensive coordinator at Auburn. Muschamp has coached in the SEC Championship Game twice and once in the Big 12 Championship Game, winning all three. He has also coached in two national championship games, helping LSU win the national title in 2003.

AND HE BROUGHT HIS POSSE: With the exception of holdover offensive line coach Shawn Elliott, Coach Muschamp brought an entirely new coaching staff to Columbia. Bobby Bentley (Running Backs), Coleman Hutzler (Special Teams Coordinator/Linebackers), Bryan Mc-Clendon (Co-Offensive Coordinator/Wide Receivers), Mike Peterson (Outside Linebackers), Travaris Robinson (Defensive Coordinator/Defensive Backs), Kurt Roper (Co-Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks), Lance Thompson (Assistant Head Coach - Defense/Defensive Line), and Pat Washington (Tight Ends) are the newcomers.

TOTING THE SHEEPSKIN: The Gamecocks have five players on their roster who have already earned their undergraduate degree. Included in the list are **Jordan Diggs, Chaz Elder, Abu Lamin, Chris Moody** and **Mason Zandi**.

Notes of Interest from the Palmetto State's Flagship University

◆ In the inaugural Palmetto Series of 2015-16, the South Carolina Gamecocks took the title, 10-5, over Clemson.

• During the 2015-16 academic year, South Carolina had its best Learfield Sports Directors' Cup finish (all-sports standings) since 2002-03. The Gamecocks had 680 points, which was 31st in the nation and seventh in the SEC.

PALMETTO SERVES

◆ South Carolina has finished higher than Clemson in 18 of the last 23 years in the Director's Cup Standings, including 16 of the past 18 years. South Carolina's highest finish in that time is 11th, which was set during the 2001-02 academic year. The Gamecocks have never finished out of the top 50 in the Director's Cup Standings.

• The combined men's and women's basketball records of 58-11 (84.06%) during the 2015-16 season was the second-best of any school in NCAA Division I (Connecticut, 63-11, 85.14%). The two teams opened their seasons with a combined 30-0 record, which is the best combined start in SEC basketball history.

◆ South Carolina was one of two schools (along with Nebraska) to finish its 2015-16 regular seasons in the Top 25 in average attendance this year in the sports of football, men's and women's basketball and baseball.

• South Carolina was one of three programs (and the only one in the SEC) in 2015-16 to have both its men's and women's golf teams make the match play portion of the NCAA Golf Championships.

◆ South Carolina student-athletes continually lead the SEC in community service hours. In 2015-16, Gamecock student-athletes performed a record 11,153 hours of community service. The volleyball team was named the Community Outreach Team of the Year at the 2016 Gamecock Gala.

◆ South Carolina led all SEC schools by placing 381 student-athletes on the 2015-16 SEC Academic Honor Roll. Included in that total were a leaguehigh 94 members on the Fall Honor Roll, which led the conference for the 10th-straight year.

◆ Carolina student-athletes combined to post a 3.278 GPA for the Spring 2016 semester, which was a departmental record and marked the 19th-straight semester in which student-athletes combined for a 3.0 GPA or better.

• South Carolina Football has three endowed scholarships. Recipients for endowed scholarships are selected each year by the head coach. The 2016 scholarships and recipients are:

- Marcus Lattimore Endowed Football Scholarship T.J. Holloman
- Tommy Suggs Endowed Quarterback Scholarship Perry Orth
- Wraellen and Larry Winn Endowed Tight End Scholarship Hayden Hurst

◆ Gamecock radio analyst **Tommy Suggs** is one of the longest tenured radio voices in college football. The former standout quarterback who led the Gamecocks to the 1969 ACC Championship, is in his 44th season as part of the radio crew.

• South Carolina has won three NCAA Championships (2002 Women's Outdoor Track & Field, 2010 Baseball, 2011 Baseball) and three National Champions (2005 Equestrian, 2007 Equestrian, 2015 Equestrian).

• South Carolina will be hosting the 2017 SEC Outdoor Track & Field Championships next May at its newly-renovated track & field complex in the Athletics Village.

◆ South Carolina is in the process of building a new \$50 million Football Operations Center. The proposed facility will be located adjacent to the Jerri and Steve Spurrier Indoor Football Facility. The state-of-the-art facility will provide the coaches and student-athletes with the ability to train and compete at the highest level. It will feature: coaches' offices, locker room, meeting rooms, weight room, training room, dining room, players' lounge and equipment room. Construction is expected to begin in January 2017.



• South Carolina has several other fall sports currently in season:

Cross Country: Finished in the middle of the pack (14th of 28 teams) at the Notre Dame Invitational last week. This week, they are competing in the Gamecock Invitational on Tuesday, October 4.

Equestrian: Dropped a tight 10-8 decision to Texas A&M last Friday to even its record at 1-1. They host Georgia on Friday, October 7 at 2 pm.

Men's Soccer: Has won six in a row to run its record to 7-3 overall and 2-0 in Conference USA. They travel to Miami to play FIU on Saturday, October 8.

Women's Soccer: Is ranked 5th in the nation with an 11-0-1 record, including a 5-0 mark in the SEC. They travel to Mississippi State for a match on Thursday, Oct. 6, then host Arkansas on Sunday, October 9, at 2 pm.

Volleyball: Is 13-2 overall and 1-2 in SEC play. They host Georgia on Friday, Oct. 7 at 7 pm, then Florida on Sunday, October 9, at noon.





ATHENS, GA .- Greyson Lambert was 24-for-25 in the air for 330 yards and three touchdowns and Nick Chubb carried 21 times for 159 yards and two touchdowns as No. 7/8 Georgia (3-0, 2-0 SEC) defeated South Carolina (1-2, 0-2 SEC) 52-20 on Saturday at Sanford Stadium.

South Carolina junior quarterback Perry Orth went 6-for-17 in the air for 66 yards and also carried for a 4-yard touchdown in his first career start for the Garnet & Black. In his first significant action of the season, freshman quarterback Lorenzo Nuñez came on to carry 10 times for 76 yards and scored his first career touchdown with a 7-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter. He finished 4-for-5 in the air for 18 yards.



Both teams would trade field goals in the first quarter. The Bulldogs would go 71 yards on their first drive of the game and break ahead 3-0 on a 30-yard field goal by Marshall Morgan. South Carolina answered on the next drive. Orth would move the ball with a couple big plays as he connected on a 10-yard reception to Perry Orth and a 15-yard pass to D.J. Neal to break into Georgia territory. The Gamecocks would tie it at 3-3 after a 45-yard field goal by Elliott Fry.

Georgia scored on consecutive possessions in the second quarter to build a 17-3 lead. The Bulldogs regained the lead with an 82-yard drive in the second quarter capped by Nick Chubb's 2-yard touchdown run. Chubb would carry six times for 35 yards on the drive with Lambert connecting on a pair of big passes with a 17-yard completion to Terry Godwin and a 20-yard pass to Jay Rome. After forcing the Gamecocks to punt the Bulldogs would use seven plays to go 88 yards with Sony Michel scoring on a 21-yard touchdown run.

The Gamecocks fought back on the next possession with a steady dose of the ground game on the way to a 4-yard touchdown run for Orth, his first career TD run as Carolina cut the deficit to 17-10. The Gamecocks would bring freshman quarterback Lorenzo Nuñez in and he would start the drive off with a 17-yard gain on the ground. An 11-yard gain by Pharoh Cooper would break the Gamecocks into Georgia territory and Brandon Wilds followed with a 13-yard rush. Orth would come up big on a key 3rd & 6 on the UGA 23 as he connected with tight end Jerell Adams for a 15-yard completion. Two plays later, Orth went around left end on a quarterback keeper to score from four yards out for the Carolina score.

With 2:10 remaining in the second quarter, Georgia put together eight plays for 78 yards with Lambert going 5-for-5 in the air including a 5-yard touchdown pass to Malcolm Mitchell to give the Bulldogs a 14-point lead.

Despite little time remaining in the quarter, Shon Carson gave the Gamecocks a spark with a 51-yard kickoff return with 15 additional yards tacked on after the play on a face mask penalty by Georgia's Reggie Davis. With seven seconds left, Elliott Fry knocked a career-long 51-yard field goal through the uprights to cut the Gamecocks' deficit to 24-13 as time expired for the first half.

Georgia would strike on the first drive of the second half with Lambert completing an 11-yard touchdown pass to Sony Michel. After a Carolina interception, they would connect again on an 11-yard score to build a 38-13 lead on the Gamecocks. The Bulldogs scored three touchdowns in the third quarter. Nuñez would drive the Gamecocks in the fourth quarter with a 7-yard run. The Bulldogs followed that up with one more scoring drive.

The Last Time They Met in Columbia #24/23 South Carolina 38 GM #6/6 Georgia 35 3 September 13, 2014 Williams-Brice Stadium Columbia, S.C.

COLUMBIA, S.C.- After inclement weather caused an hour and 26-minute delay to the start of the game, lightning struck as No. 24 South Carolina took down No. 6 Georgia, 38-35. After Georgia kicker Marshall Morgan missed his second field goal of the night with 4:24 left, the Gamecocks were able to run out the clock as Dylan Thompson narrowly converted on a fourthand-inches at midfield to secure the win.

The Gamecocks took the first possession of the game 75 yards to paydirt, climaxed by a Thompson to Shaq Roland 10-yard score. It only took Georgia two plays to respond though as quarterback Hutson Mason connected with Isaiah McKenzie for a 36-yard pass down the right side. On the

ensuing play, Mason dumped off a short pass to Sony Michel for a 33-yard touchdown to tie the game at 7.

A Carolina fumble led to a 36-yard field goal from Morgan to give the Bulldogs a 10-7 advantage.

The Gamecocks drove the field agaain on their next possession. Thompson found Pharoh Cooper on the left side where the receiver put a quick left-to-right move on his defender before racing into the end zone for an eight-yard score to put the Gamecocks up 14-10.

Morgan was able to pull the Bulldogs within one at 14-13 with a 26-yard field goal, but Thompson continued to find open receivers as he marched the Gamecocks down the field, finding Damiere Byrd for a 24-yard completion and Jones for a 20-yard pass, before connecting in the back of the end zone with Anderson for an 18-yard touchdown to give Carolina a 21-13 lead with 5:34 remaining in the first half.

With just over two minutes left, Cooper and Byrd rushed for back-to-back first downs as the Gamecocks tried to put together a scoring drive before the end the of the half. Jones came up with a big 25-yard reception along the sideline before taking a big hit to put Carolina at the 22-yard line. An eight-yard run from Davis set up Elliott Fry for a 32-yard field goal to give the Gamecocks a 24-13 lead heading into the half.

Georgia struck on its opening drive in the third quarter as Gurley got loose for a 40-yard run to get to the South Carolina 25-yard line. The Georgia tailback eventually punched in a two-yard touchdown run, bringing the Bulldogs' deficit to 24-20. South Carolina continued to have its way with Georgia's defense on the following drive as Thompson went two-for-two and Davis and Wilds combined for 43 yards on the ground. Thompson capped off the drive with a one-yard touchdown rush to push the lead back to 11.

With 2:13 remaining in the third quarter, a personal foul on a Carolina punt put Georgia in good field position. Six plays later, Mason found Jay Rome in the end zone. The two-point conversion cut the deficit to three.

On the ensuing kickoff, junior tailback Shon Carson found space on the left side and picked up a career-long return of 42 yards to put Carolina on the Georgia 42-yard line. Davis picked up 19 on the first two plays of the drive before Wilds finished off the drive by breaking runs of 15 and 24 yards to extend the Gamecocks' lead to 10 at 38-28 with 13:01 to play. Nearly six minutes later, Georgia responded with a one-yard touchdown run from Quayvon Hicks on an 11-play drive.

Four plays into the Gamecocks' following drive, Thompson was intercepted across the middle by Georgia's Damian Swann. With the ball on the Carolina three-yard line, Mason was called for intentional grounding as sophomore defensive end Gerald Dixon came at him unblocked. The Gamecock defense held Georgia to a 28-yard field goal attempt, but the Georgia kicker missed his second attempt of the night.

South Carolina was able to run out the final 4:24 of the game to hold on for the three-point win in front of the fifth-largest crowd in stadium history at 84,232.

Head Coach Will Muschamp



Will <u>MU</u>SCHAMP

HEAD COACH First Year at South Carolina



Will Muschamp was introduced as the University of South Carolina's 34th head football coach in a press conference held at Williams-Brice Stadium on Dec. 7, 2015.

Regarded as an outstanding defensive mind, Muschamp, 45, is a 21-year coaching veteran, including 13 years in the Southeastern Conference. He has previous head coaching experience, posting a 28-21 record (.571) at the University of Florida from 2011-14. He led the Gators to three bowl games in his four seasons in Gainesville and was recognized as the SEC Coach of the Year in 2012 after guiding Florida to an 11-2 record and a Top-10 finish.

The Rome, Ga., native has coached in two national championship games (2003 and 2009), winning with LSU in 2003, and coached in a pair of BCS bowl games, following the 2008 and 2012 seasons. Muschamp has coached in the SEC Championship Game twice and once in the Big 12 Championship Game, winning all three. In addition, he was a finalist for the 2007 Broyles Award presented to the nation's top assistant coach.

Muschamp most recently served as the defensive coordinator at Auburn University in 2015, his third stint as an SEC defensive coordinator. He also held that title with Auburn from 2006-07 and at LSU from 2002-04. In his six seasons as an SEC defensive coordinator, Muschamp's units ranked among the nation's Top-10 in total defense and in scoring defense five times.

Prior to taking the reins at Florida, Muschamp served as the defensive coordinator at the University of Texas from 2008-10. Under his guidance, the Longhorn defense ranked No. 1 in the nation with 119 sacks, and ranked in the Top-10 nationally allowing 2.9 yards per rushing attempt (third), 96.7 rushing yards per game (fourth), and 297.4 yards per game (seventh), all Big 12 bests during that span. In 2009, the Longhorns played in the BCS National Championship game. Under Muschamp's tutelage at Texas, Brian Orakpo won the 2008 Rotary Lombardi, Bronko Nagurski and Ted Hendricks awards. In the 2009 and 2010 NFL Drafts, Muschamp had a combined eight players drafted, seven in the first four rounds, including first-rounders, Brian Orakpo and Earl Thomas.

Muschamp served with the NFL's Miami Dolphins as Assistant Head Coach for Defense in 2005 under Nick Saban.


Muschamp's first full-time coaching experience in the SEC came at LSU. He was the Tigers' linebacker coach for one season before being elevated to defensive coordinator from 2002-04. His 2003 defense helped the Tigers to the national championship by leading the nation both in scoring defense (11.0 points per game) and total defense (252.0 yards per game), while finishing second nationally in pass efficiency defense (89.8) and third in rushing defense (67.0 yards per game).

In four of his nine seasons as an FBS defensive coordinator, his teams have allowed less than 100 rushing yards per game and twice led the nation in rushing defense. His 2003 LSU defense led the country by allowing 67 yards per game on the ground, the best mark by an SEC team in the 2000s, while Texas gave up just 73.1 yards on the ground in 2009 to pace the nation.

The 1994 Georgia graduate moved immediately into coaching, working as a graduate assistant at Auburn from 1995-96, earning his master's degree in 1996. He served as a secondary coach at West Georgia (1998) and Eastern Kentucky (1999) before moving on to his first defensive coordinator position at Valdosta State for the 2000 season, where he helped the Blazers to a 10-2 record and the Gulf South championship.

During his playing career at Georgia, Muschamp earned his way from walk-on to scholarship player by the spring of his redshirt freshman season and eventually was named co-captain his senior season. A safety on the gridiron, he earned a spot on the SEC Academic Honor Roll in 1993.

Born August 3, 1971, Muschamp and his wife, the former Carol Davis, have two sons, Jackson and Whit.



NASHVILLE, Tenn. — In head coach Will Muschamp's first game at South Carolina (1-0, 1-0 SEC), the Gamecocks posted the final 13 points to claim a 13-10 road win in South-eastern Conference play at Vanderbilt (0-1, 0-1 SEC) on Thursday night at Vanderbilt Stadium.

After a 16-yard reception by freshman Bryan Edwards from senior Perry Orth and a 17-yard run by freshman A.J. Turner set him up, senior Elliott Fry stepped up and hit a career-long 55-yard field goal to give South Carolina the lead with 35 seconds remaining in the opener.



South Carolina broke onto the scoreboard midway through the third quarter when Fry hit a 48-yard field goal to cut Vandy's lead to 10-3. Orth connected with sophomore Deebo Samuel for the big play of the drive, as the duo's pass went for 30 yards to get the Gamecocks into Vanderbilt territory.

The Gamecocks tied the contest with 7:30 to go when Samuel swept around the left end and touched the pylon for the eight-yard scoring run. Orth completed five passes to start the drive and ran for a nine-yard gain, while Turner rushed twice for 25 yards, including the 20-yard scamper to set up Samuel's score.

Vanderbilt opened the scoring with a 36-yard field goal from Tommy Openshaw after the Commodores took advantage of a muffed punt by the Gamecocks, setting up the 13-yard scoring drive. That lead grew to 10-0 32 seconds into the second quarter when Khari Blasingam punctuated the 13play, 67-yard drive with a one-yard touchdown run.

The Gamecocks looked like they would draw within one score as they drove inside Vanderbilt's 20-yard line later in the second quarter. But the Commodores' Oren Burks forced a fumble after a five-yard SC run, and Charles Wright covered it up to give Vandy back the ball.

With less than four minutes remaining in the game, Vanderbilt drove into Gamecock territory and set up a 45-yard field goal from the middle of the field, but the chance hooked left, giving South Carolina the chance to drive the field and claim the win.

On Vanderbilt's last possession, Gamecock defensive linemen Taylor Stallworth and Darius English combined for a sack of Commodore quarterback Kyle Shurmur to help close out the victory.

STARKVILLE, MISS. — South Carolina (1-1, 1-1 SEC) looked stronger in the second half for the secondstraight week, but it couldn't overcome Mississippi State's first-half tally, as the Bulldogs claimed a 27-14 win on Saturday night at Davis Wade Stadium.

Mississippi State (1-1, 1-0 SEC) claimed a 24-0 lead in the first half, using a trio of three-minute-or-less drives to take the lead. Fred Ross had a hand in the first two scoring plays, as the running back caught a six-yard pass to end the first drive before throwing a 17-yard pass to Donald Gray for the second touchdown.



Bulldog quarterback Nick Fitzgerald tossed the first and third scores, the latter to Jordan Thomas for a three-yard strike late in the second to make it 21-0. Westin Graves ended the first half with the first of his two field goals, the first coming from 27 yards out.

Freshman Brandon McIlwain engineered the Gamecocks' first scoring drive of the game late in the third quarter. The 12-play, 80-yard drive saw McIlwain run for 22 yards and throw for 58, including an 18-yard toss to A.J. Turner for the score. On the drive, the freshman was 4-for-6 from the air.

After the Bulldogs' Graves made it 27-7 with a 28-yard field goal early in the fourth quarter, the Gamecocks cut the lead to 27-14 after a 13-play, 83-yard drive led again by McIlwain. The freshman again accounted for every yard for South Carolina, ending the drive with a four-yard completion to K.C. Crosby.



On the Pirates' next possession, they drove to the Gamecock 8. The attempted 25-yard field goal was blocked by junior Ulric Jones, negating another ECU scoring chance.

Both teams hit field goals in the fourth quarter, Plowman a 45-yarder and Fry a 39-yarder. East Carolina drew within five points after a late four-yard touchdown pass from Phillip Nelson to Devin Anderson. The two-point conversion failed, and Hayden Hurst recovered the onside kick to get the ball and the win for South Carolina.



LEXINGTON, Ky. — South Carolina (2-2, 1-2 SEC) fell in a close contest at Kentucky (2-2, 1-1 SEC) on Saturday night at Commonwealth Stadium.

Kentucky retook the lead with 10:21 to play when Benny Snell capped an 11-play, 65-yard drive with a one-yard score. Snell ran for 50 of the drive's 65 yards on the drive on nine carries.

The Gamecocks had one last chance, getting the ball with 4:23 to go. Freshman quarterback Brandon McIlwain led the Gamecocks to three first downs, but Kentucky buckled down and stopped the drive.

Kentucky finished a drive that took the final third of the first quarter early in the second with Austin McGinnis' 30-yard field goal. Stanley Williams had three passes of over 10 yards as part of the 12-play drive, two coming on third down.

The Gamecocks answered on redshirt freshman A.J. Turner's 12-yard run with 5:44 left in the second quarter, taking a 7-3 advantage. The running back ran it five times on the drive, breaking free on the right side to cap the drive. Sophomore tight end Hayden Hurst set up the score with his 30-yard reception of McIlwain's pass.

The Wildcats started the second half fast, taking the 10-7 lead after Stanley Williams scampered for a 43-yard touchdown. Stephen Johnson completed two passes for first downs on the five-play drive, both to Jeff Badet for 28 and 11 yards, respectively. He also recovered his own fumble on the play before Williams' score.

South Carolina knotted things at 10-10 with seconds left in the third quarter on senior Elliott Fry's 35-yard field goal. McIlwain connected with tight ends Hurst and Jacob August on the drive, the latter hauling in a 29-yard pass to get the Gamecocks deep into Kentucky territory.



Both teams got off to a hot start, the Gamecocks striking first on freshman A.J. Turner's 75-yard run on the first play from scrimmage. The Aggies answered just over two minutes later when Knight capped the 75-yard drive with a four-yard run. Knight went 5-for-5 on the drive in the air, including hitting Jeremy Tabuyo for receptions of 33 and 18 yards.

Neither team scored the rest of the half, however. The Gamecocks did control the ball for nearly 17 minutes in the first half.




LAST WEEK vs. TEXAS A&M: Served as South Carolina's long snapper.
