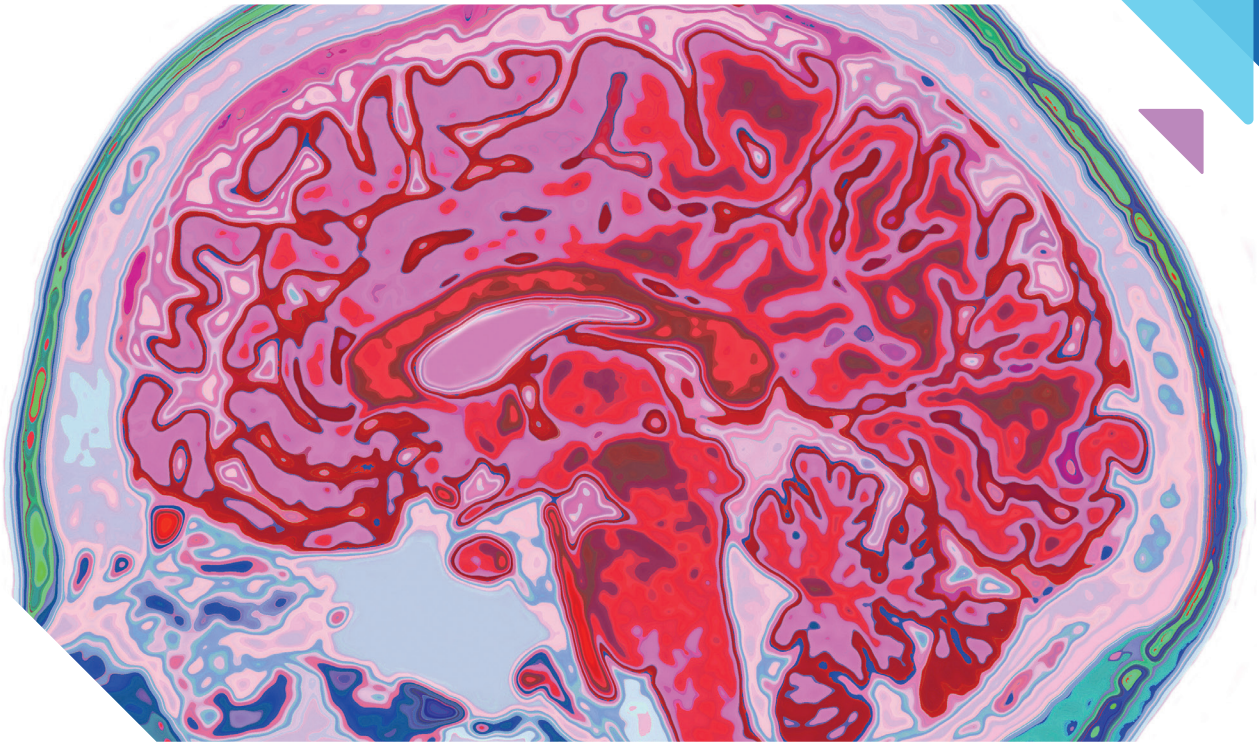

Statement of Need: Knowledge deficits continue to exist in the evaluation, treatment and post-care of neuroscience patients. This activity brings together physicians from various specialties to discuss best practice analysis, breakthroughs and current advances.

New technologies and multimodality treatments will be discussed, allowing participants of all disciplines to integrate evidence based protocols into clinical practice in the management of patients with brain tumors, cerebrovascular disease and spinal disorders.

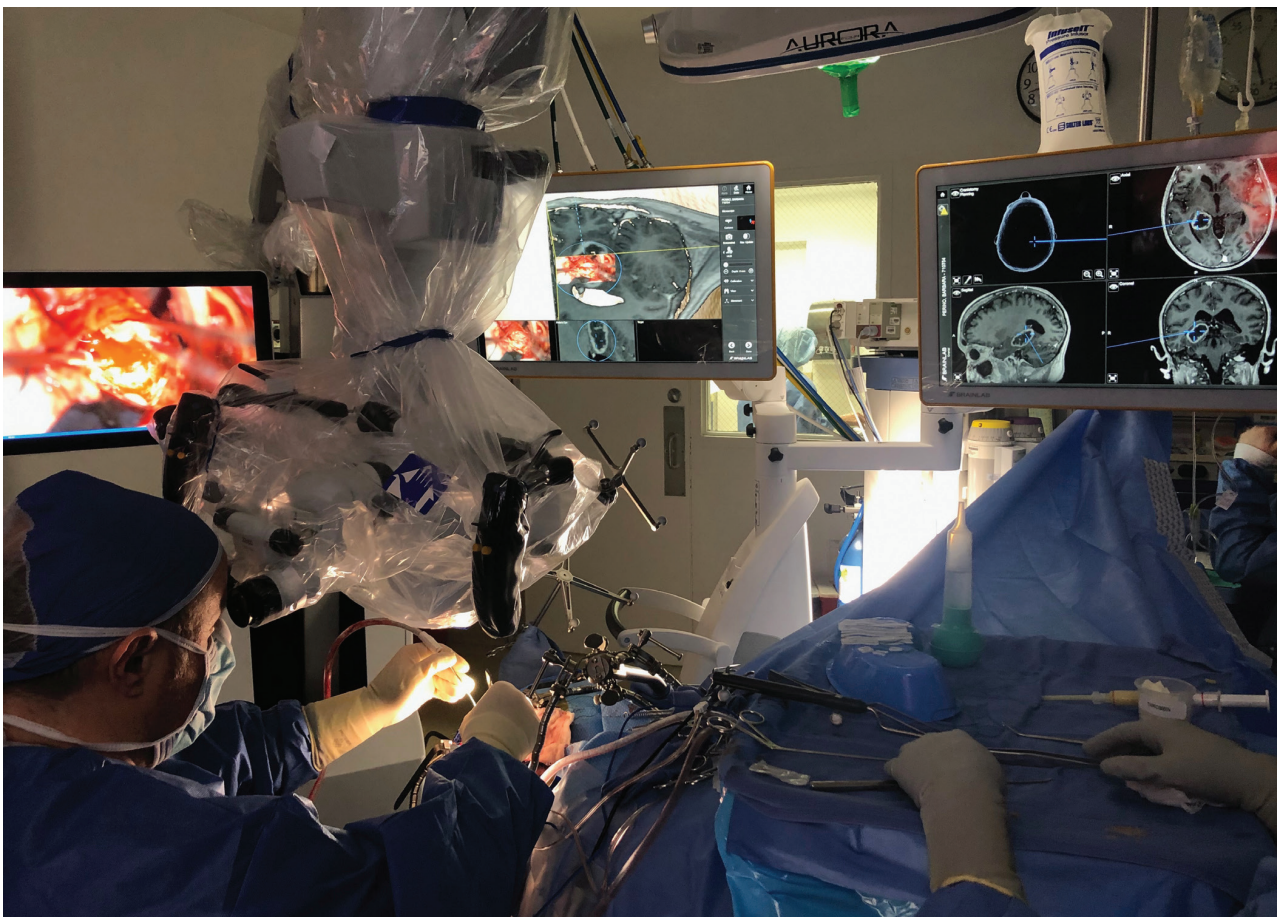
