Qualification Summary

IAW MILPER Message 18-180

- Interested personnel must review the current SFAB recruitment MILPER Message charts to ensure they are the correct skill and grade (E4-E9) to fill an authorized SFAB position.
- Obtain and maintain a secret clearance (minimum).
- Score at least 240 points on the APFT with a minimum of 70 points in each event.
- Have a PULHES of 111221 or better.
- Maintain your deployable status.
- Demonstrate exceptional moral aptitude by upholding Army values.
- SSG and above must have completed key developmental assignments in their current grade.
- Pass a background screening with no derogatory information.
- After you volunteer, pass a rigorous two-day assessment or a command interview and be selected for service in an SFAB.
