

There were 19 sorors and 12 guests including students and their family members in attendance. Guests enjoyed a presentation highlighting the HBCU students and their accomplishments. The committee participated in the Backpack/School Supply Drive hosted by Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Incorporated held on Friday, July 27, 2017. 


