



NECESSITY, FUNCTION, AND CONFORMITY: KRS 158.160(1) authorizes the 9 10 Cabinet for Health and Family Services to promulgate an administrative regulation to define medical conditions that threaten the safety of students or others in a school setting. 11 KRS 211.180(1)(e) authorizes the cabinet to formulate, promote, establish, and execute 12 policies, plans, and comprehensive programs relating to all matters of public health, 13 including the protection and improvement of the health of infants, preschool, and school-14 age children. This administrative regulation establishes the school notification standards 15 for reporting students and staff diagnosed with Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome 16 Coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2) (the virus that causes COVID-19). 17 18 Section 1. Definitions. (1) "Instructional style" means the primary method of learning utilized by the school and includes in-person only, virtual only, or a hybrid of in-19 20 person and virtual.







Labs providing COVID-19 services in KY




