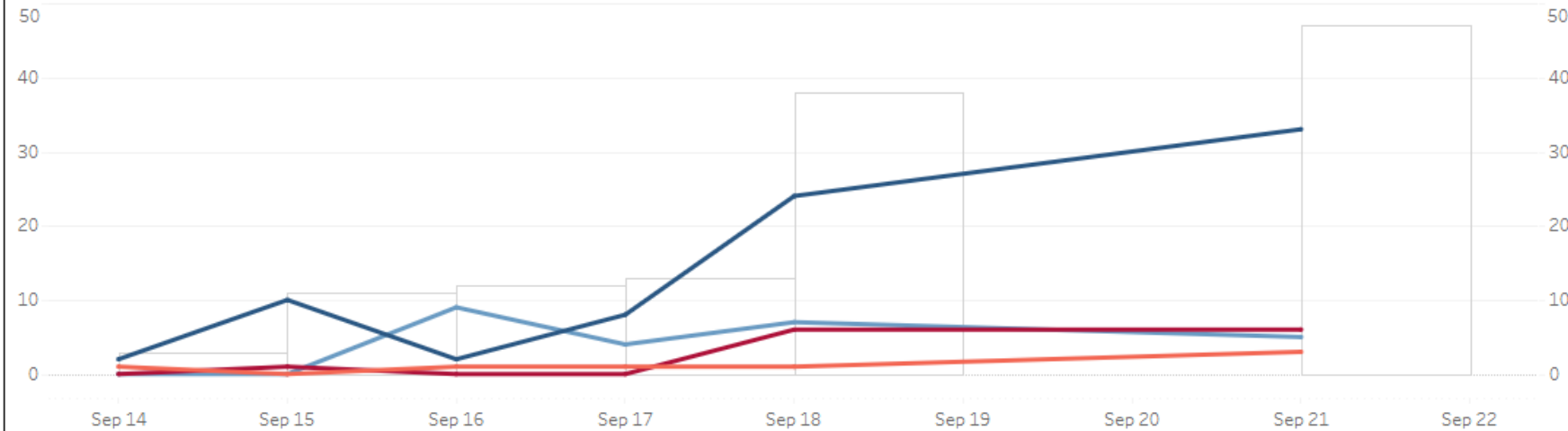
Pursuant to state law and regulation, parents and guardians are required to notify a student's school within 24 hours if the student tests positive for COVID-19. Each school will determine its own reporting process. In turn, all public and private K-12 schools must report this data to inform communities as they make decisions during the pandemic. Schools must make good-faith determinations and there will be uncertainties outside their control. Schools are only required to report persons quarantined due to exposure that has occurred through school related activities, including extracurricular and athletic activities.

Schools report this data Monday through Friday for every day their school is in session whether in-person, virtually, or hybrid in-person/virtually. Due to varying lengths of quarantine periods, this data is likely to over-estimate the actual number of persons in quarantine, particularly for longer periods of time.

The Kentucky Department for Public Health (KDPH) also reports information [here](#) as compiled by epidemiologists communicating with schools; this data takes longer to collect and will differ from this dashboard report.

COVID-19 Current Incidence Rate in Kentucky

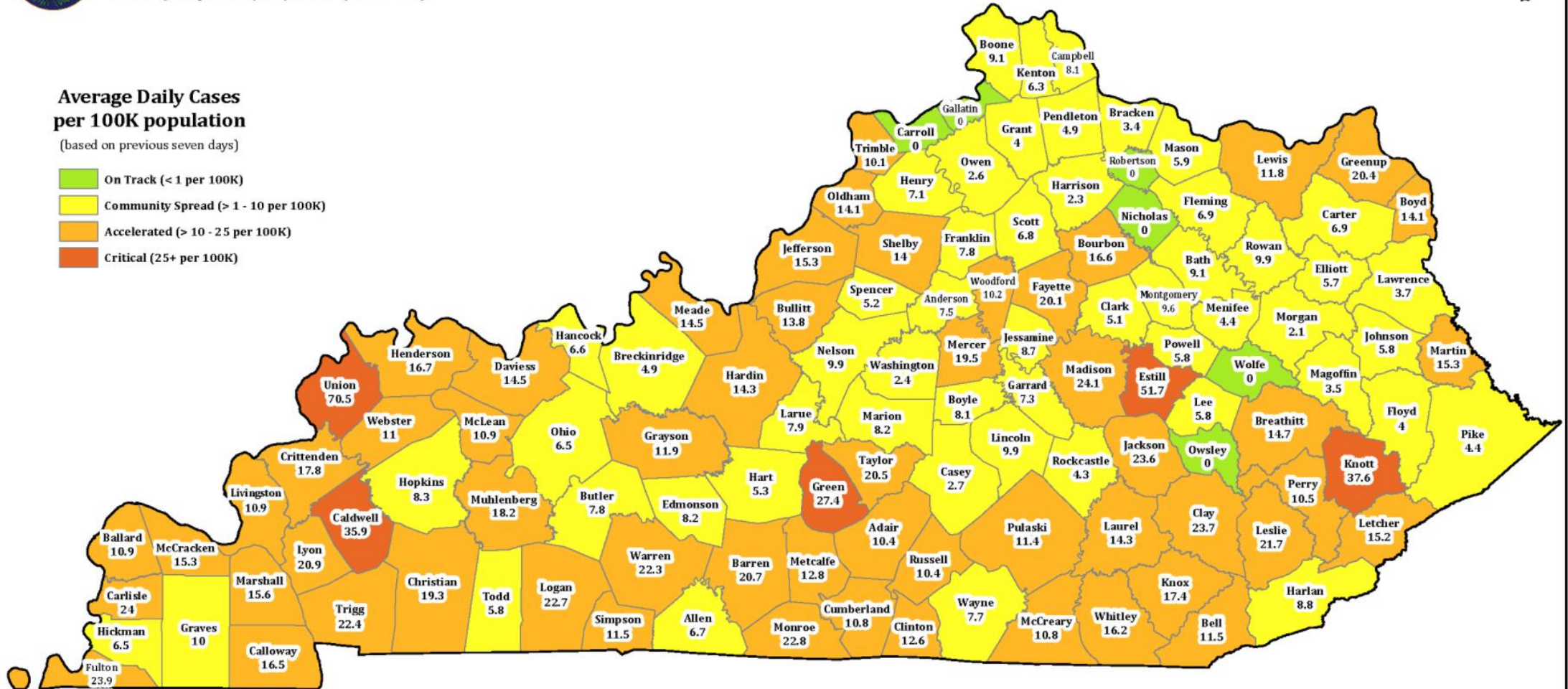

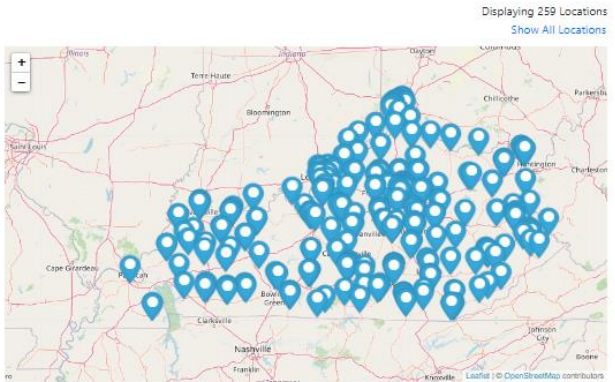

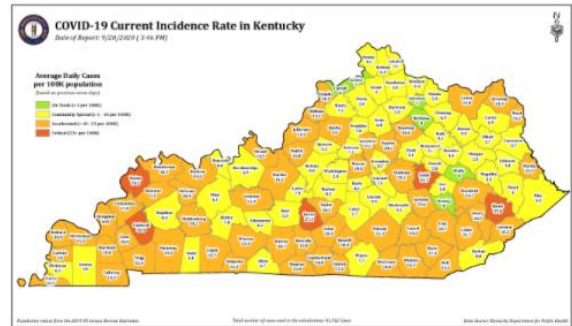

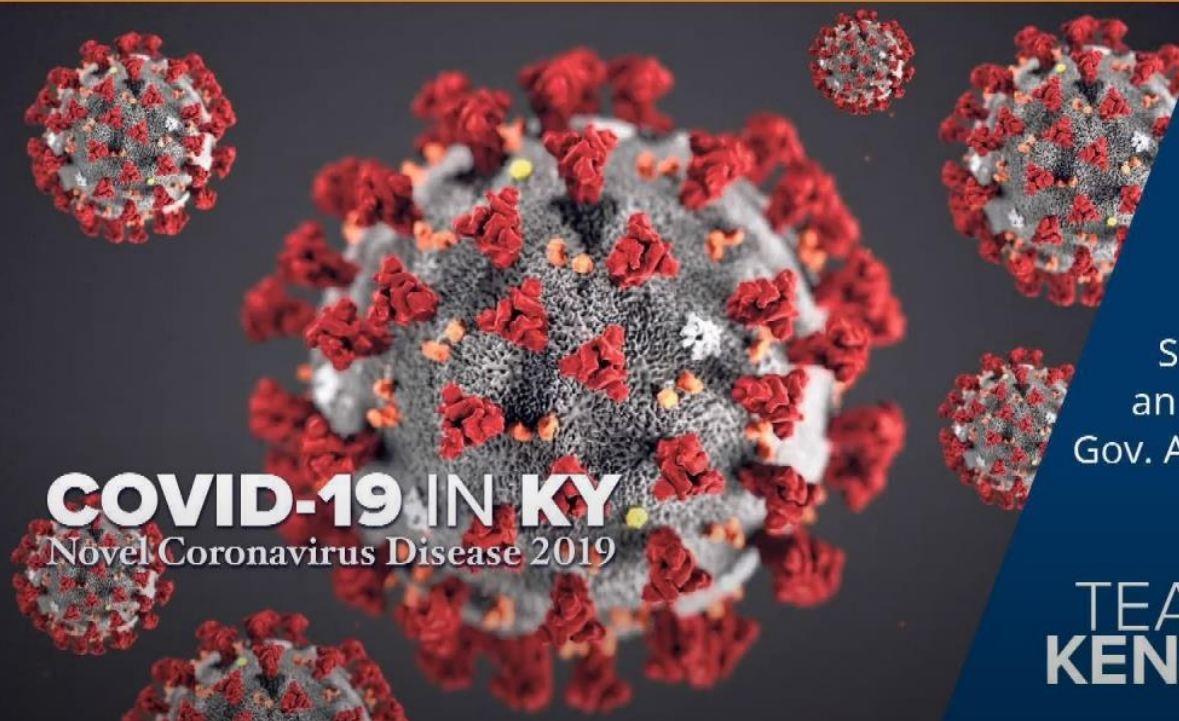
