Battery Recycling at Barunga West

Barunga West Council have joined with Ecocycle to provide options for recycling batteries. Ecocycle recycles all types of batteries to safely recover mercury, lead, silver, nickel, cadmium, steel, lithium and plastic. The Port Broughton and Bute Offices now have a 20 Litre tube for staff and customers to dispose of batteries. Both Waste Transfer Stations also have 'nally bins' for larger batteries that are deposited, this includes car batteries.



E-notices now available for Barunga West Council Ratepayers

Council have initiated a service which now allows you to receive rate notices via email. If you wish to enrol, you will need to enrol with your email address and your unique reference number which has been added to your notice (new this Quarter). This can be accessed by any ratepayer with a current email address.

Rainbow Bee Eater

The Rainbow Bee Eater is a spectacularly coloured bird with a thin curved beak and distinctively long tail feathers.

The bee eater is found throughout Australia and is migratory, arriving in our district around September and October. They are ground dwelling, building their nest in a burrow which may be in the ground or a sandy bank. The burrow is not dissimilar to a mouse hole but will have drag marks each side where the bee eater drags its wings on its way in and out of the burrow. The bee eater has a distinctive call and you may hear them before you see them.



So watch for this stunning bird arriving soon to breed and then fly north again for the winter. Watch this space for an update on The Rainbow Bee Eater coming to Port Broughton soon. Exciting times are ahead.....

Update on Port Broughton Coastal Protection Issues

Council has applied for funding from the Coast Protection Board to complete the next stage of upgrading the protection of properties along the foreshore at Port Broughton, namely detailed design drawings for an appropriately sized seawall. This work builds upon the Port Broughton Coastal Hazard Adaption Plan completed in 2018.

Council is also waiting to apply for funding to address sand erosion issues along the Port Broughton and Fisherman Bay foreshore under the newly announced Regional SA Coastline grant program that will provide \$4 million in funding over the




next 4 years for coastal councils to help repair, restore and sustain the state's regional coastlines.


Aussie Backyard Bird Count 21st-27th October 2019

Block clearing

Now is the time to arrange for the clearing and mowing of any blocks located in and adjoining townships. Council emphasizes the importance of undertaking necessary fire prevention measures for the safety of your family, pets and property. Preparation of your property (or vacant block) includes but is not limited to the following:

- Cut grass (to approx. 10cm / 4 inches) within 20 metres of all buildings
- Cut grass (to approx. 10cm / 4 inches) within 5 metres of all structures
- Remove dead branches, leaves and undergrowth from around your home
- Prune tree limbs less than two metres above ground
- Prune branches overhanging your home
- Remove bark, heavy mulch, wood piles and any other flammable materials close to your home and sheds
- Clean out your gutters
- Spark Proofing your home
- Vacant Blocks shall be cut to a maximum height of 10cm to ensure compliance

Burning Green Waste is NOT permitted within Township Boundaries. Please use your Green Waste bin or Dispose of your green waste at the Waste Transfer Station in Port Broughton or Bute where there is no fee for the disposal of Green Waste.
