America's ground war in Vietnam began on March 8, 1965, when 3,500 Marines were deployed. We're reading Richard Currey's novel *Fatal Light*, which follows a young man from pre-draft days to his time "in country" to post-tour challenges as he begins to readjust to civilian life. 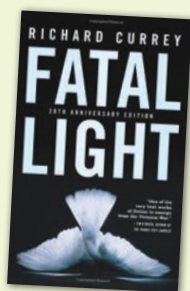

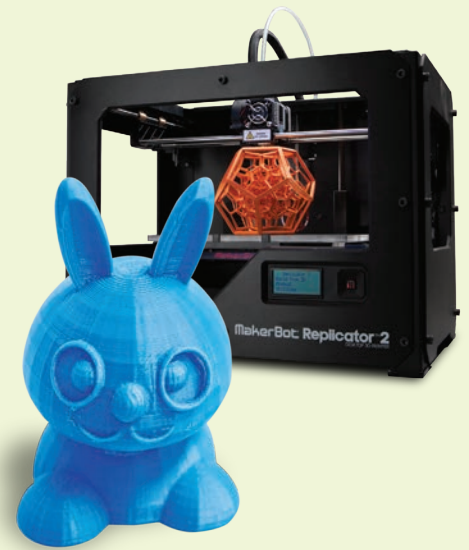

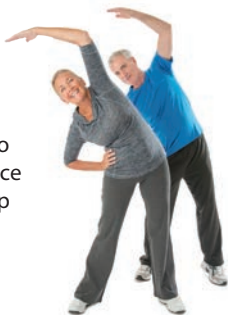
