HOLT CAT

On March 26, 1993, a group of 22 investors purchased the San Antonio Spurs. The group currently numbers 20 investors who are members of a limited liability company known as San Antonio Spurs, L.L.C. The ownership group has a seven-person governing and decision-making body and Peter M. Holt serves as the Chairman of the group. Listed below are the current members of San Antonio Spurs, L.L.C.:

PETER M. HOLTCHAIRMAN AND CEO
SPURS SPORTS & ENTERTAINMENT

Now in his 19th season as Chairman and CEO ... he and his wife, Julianna Hawn Holt, bought into the Spurs ownership group in 1996 ... since that time the organization has enjoyed unprecedented growth and success ... four NBA championships, a successful campaign for a new arena and two new San Antonio-based sports franchises are among the accomplishments achieved during Holt's tenure ... thanks in part to the AT&T Center – which opened in November of 2002 – the organization is now known as Spurs Sports and Entertainment ... with over 250 fulltime employees, Spurs Sports & Entertainment runs four professional sports franchises – the Spurs (NBA), Silver Stars (WNBA), Rampage (AHL Hockey) and the Austin Toros (NBA Development League) – while also managing the day-to-day operations of the AT&T Center ... over the last 17 seasons (since Tim Duncan joined the team in 1997–98) the Spurs have posted a regular season record of 888-376 ... the team's winning percentage of .703 during that span is the best of any team in the four major sports (MLB, NBA, NFL and NHL) ... during the Duncan era the Spurs have captured four NBA championships (1999, 2003, 2005 and 2007) ... the Spurs organization has twice been named the best franchise in professional sports (2003 and 2005) and been ranked the top NBA franchise six times in the annual ESPN The Magazine Ultimate Standings survey (each year the Ultimate Standings ranks every professional team in a formula using analysis of team financial data combined with fan feedback in which over 55,000 fans judge teams by eight factors including players, bang for the buck, ownership, and stadium experience ... the Ultimate Standings debuted in 2003 and the Spurs are the only franchise to have been named the top overall team twice among the four major sports since ESPN introduced its annual survey) ... Holt was ranked as the "Ultimate Boss" among all sports owners in the 2012 standings based on the criteria of honesty, commitment to their communities and loyalty to their core players ... in June of 2007 SS&E purchased the Austin Toros of the NBA Development League, the first NBA team to have sole ownership over its NBA D-League affiliate (the Spurs are one of six NBA teams – Cleveland (Canton Charge), Philadelphia (Delaware 87ers), L.A. Lakers (L.A. Defenders), Golden State (Santa Cruz Warriors), Oklahoma City (Tulsa 66ers) – to own and operate their own D-League team) ... the great-grandson of Benjamin Holt, developer of the first practical track-type tractor and one of the two predecessor companies that formed Caterpillar Inc. ... serves as the CEO of San Antonio-based HOLT CAT (the firm still displays several of Ben Holt's early tractors outside its headquarters) which is the largest Caterpillar dealership in the United States ... born in Peoria, Illinois ... lived in San Antonio as a child before moving to Corpus Christi, where he graduated from high school ... served two years in the U.S. Army during which time he earned a Silver Star, three Bronze Stars and a Purple Heart from his one-year tour of duty in Vietnam ... ended his military service as a Sergeant E5 ... actively involved in an effort to construct an education center under the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington D.C...a staunch believer in community service ... is proud of the Spurs commitment to South Texas and its residents (in 2000 the Spurs earned the Pro Team Community Award presented by the World Sports Humanitarian Hall of Fame, an award presented annually to the professional sports franchise that best illustrates exceptional community involvement and fosters community pride and spirit) ... among the Spurs community efforts are the Spurs Youth Basketball League, the annual countywide United Way campaign and a variety of educational outreach programs which service over 85 percent of the elementary schools in Bexar County (during the 2010–11 season over 200,000 area students were touched by the various SS&E education programs) ... Holt's own efforts include a lengthy list of community service positions ... appointed to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission by Governor Rick Perry in 2003 and served as chairman from 2007 – 2011...a member of the World Presidents' Organization, the Free Trade Alliance San Antonio and the San Antonio Economic Development Foundation ... is the Business Chair of the Consortium of Partners for San Antonio's 2012 No Kill initiative ... 2009 recipient of Woodrow Wilson Award for Public Service ... serves as board member of the Bexar County Performing Arts Center Foundation ... serves on the advisory board of the McCombs School of Business at the University of Texas ... past chairman of the United Way of San Antonio and Bexar County ... named to the Texas Business Hall of Fame in 2004 ... Texan of the Year Award in 2010...he and Julianna have been Spurs season ticket holders since 1988.

PRESIDENT OF BUSINESS OPERATIONS

Now in his 20th season ... leads the business operations for all four sports franchises owned and operated by Spurs Sports & Entertainment which includes the San Antonio Spurs (NBA), the San Antonio Rampage (AHL Hockey), the San Antonio Silver Stars (WNBA), and the Austin Toros (NBA Development League) as well as the operations of the AT&T Center ... includes marketing, corporate partnerships and ticket sales, finance and administration, communications, corporate development, community relations, and facilities management as well as all corporate business and player planning and new initiatives on behalf of the organization and ownership ... over 35 years of financial and business management experience in public accounting, banking, real estate, and sports and entertainment ... named the Spurs chief financial officer in 1993 ... promoted to executive vice president in 2000 and president of business operations in 2008 ... in 1995 started a development, financial and operating study for a new multi-purpose arena that would eventually be the new home to the Spurs ... was named in 1999 as the chief development officer for the AT&T Center ... oversaw the successful county referendum campaign in 1999 that provided public funding to build the AT&T Center and again in 2008 a second referendum that will provide funds for additional improvements to the AT&T Center starting in 2015 ... directed all aspects of the AT&T Center development project ... led negotiations with Bexar County in finalizing the arena's development and operating agreements ... negotiated and arranged adequate credit capacity to provide funding for construction as well as ongoing franchise funding ... oversaw the design and construction of the AT&T Center which opened on time and on budget in October 2002 ... led the organization's efforts to bring hockey to the AT&T Center ... in 2002 negotiated the purchase of an American Hockey League (AHL) affiliate and then entered into a joint venture and affiliation with the Florida Panthers to play in San Antonio ... in the summer of 2005 led SS&E's effort to become the sole owner of the San Antonio Rampage ... past chairman of the AHL Executive Committee and is a current member of Board of Governors... in the summer of 2007 led the negotiations to purchase the NBA Development League team in Austin, Texas, the Austin Toros ... a past member of the Board of Directors of the San Antonio Sports Foundation dating back to 1989 ... was part of the organization's efforts to bring major sporting events to San Antonio, including managing the Corporate Partner Program for the U.S. Olympic Festival in 1993, as well as bids for the 1995 National Senior Olympics, the 2002 NCAA Women's Final Four and the 1998, 2004, and 2008 NCAA Men's Final Four , and the bid for the 2007 Pan Am Games ...currently serves on the Executive Committee and is Vice Chair of the Board of Trustees of VIA Metropolitan Transit, the Board and Executive Committee of Centro Partnership San Antonio, past board positions include serving on the Executive Committee and Board of the San Antonio Economic Development Foundation, the Board of the San Antonio Tax Increment Reinvestment Zone, and Executive Committee and Board of the Boys and Girls Clubs of San Antonio ... holds a degree in accounting from Fairfield University and is a CPA ... has a 27-year-old son, Zack who lives and works in Manhattan.

GREGG POPOVICHHEAD COACH / PRESIDENT OF
SPURS BASKETBALL

In his 18th season as the Spurs head coach ... the longest tenured coach with the same team among the 122 NBA, NFL, NHL and MLB franchises ... has led the Spurs to four NBA Championships (1999, 2003, 2005 and 2007) ... he and Eric Spoelstra are the only two active coaches with multiple NBA titles ... one of five coaches in history with four-or-more NBA Championships (along with Red Auerbach, Phil Jackson, John Kundla and Pat Riley) ... finished the 2012-13 season with a career mark of 905-423 ... career winning percentage of .681 ranks third in NBA history (behind Jackson and Billy Cunningham) ... ranks 12th in NBA history in career victories (among active coaches trails only Rick Adelman) ... his 905 wins with one team rank second all-time in NBA history behind Jerry Sloan (1,127) ... posted his 900th career win vs. Utah on March 22, 2013 ... his 133 playoff wins rank third in NBA history (behind Jackson and Riley) and his playoff career winning percentage of .616 (133-83) is the third best in league history ... named NBA Coach of the Year in both 2003 and 2012 ... has been named the NBA Coach of the Month 14 times (4/99, 3/01, 3/02, 1/03, 3/03, 12/03, 12/05, 3/06, 3/07, 11/07, 11/10, 12/10, 2/12, 3/12), the most in league annals ... has led San Antonio to the NBA's best regular season record four times (1998-99, 2000-01, 2002-03 and 2011-12) ... the Western Conference All-Star coach in 2005, 2011 and 2013 ... the Spurs all-time leader in both regular season and playoff wins ... a 1970 graduate of the United States Air Force Academy with a degree in Soviet studies ... played four seasons at the Air Force Academy ... as a senior was the team's captain and leading scorer ... following his graduation in 1970 served his five-year military commitment ... during that time toured Eastern Europe and the Soviet Union as a member of the U.S. Armed Forces Team ... selected to represent the U.S. on the national AAU Team touring the Soviet Union ... in 1972 was the captain of the Armed Forces team, which won the AAU Championship ... earned an invitation to the 1972 U.S. Olympic Team Training Camp ... in 1973 returned to the Air Force Academy as an assistant coach ... spent six years at Air Force during which time he obtained his master's degree in physical education and sports sciences from the University of Denver ... in 1979 was named the head coach at Pomona-Pitzer in Claremont, California ... spent the next eight seasons at Pomona ... during the 1985-86 season led the team to its first conference championship in 68 years and to a berth in the NCAA Division III Tournament ... while at Pomona was an active member of the school's academic community, working as an associate professor, chairing the college's Student Life committee, serving on the Women's Commission and even – for one year – living in a dorm with his family ... moved to the NBA in July of 1988, joining the Spurs as an assistant coach as a member of Larry Brown's staff ... spent the next four seasons in San Antonio with a Spurs team that won a pair of Midwest Division titles ... in the summer of 1992 was named an assistant coach on Don Nelson's staff with Golden State ... spent the next two seasons with the Warriors ... returned to San Antonio on May 31, 1994, as the Spurs executive vice president of basketball operations/general manager (served as GM for eight seasons before turning the job over to R.C. Buford on July 1, 2002) ... named the Spurs head coach in December of 1996 ... served as an assistant coach for USA Basketball's Men's Senior Team for three consecutive summers (at the 2002 World Basketball Championship, the 2003 FIBA America Men's Olympic Qualifying Tournament and the 2004 Olympic Games) ... a very active member of the San Antonio community ... in 1991 teamed with Frank Martin to create the Spurs Youth Basketball League ... today the league plays at 75 locations in San Antonio and throughout South Texas ... over 15,000 boys and girls, ages 7 to 16, played in the league in 2011-12 ... prior to every game, each participant takes a pledge, promising to remain drug and alcohol free while showing good sportsmanship and fair play ... the league was honored with a Daily Point of Light Award by President Bush in February of 1992... is involved in several charities in the San Antonio area including the San Antonio Food Bank, Roy Maas' Youth Alternatives, Boys and Girls Club and The Miracle League ... honored by the Air Force Academy with its Distinguished Graduate Award in 2007 ... he and his wife of 38 years, Erin, have been blessed with two children, Micky and Jill.

PRESIDENT OF SPORTS FRANCHISES

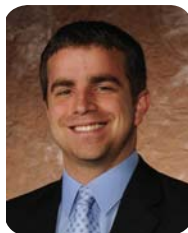

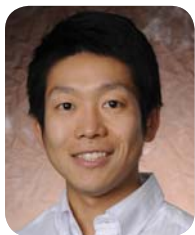

SAN ANTONIO SILVER STARS



The San Antonio Silver Stars posted a 12-22 record during the 2013 WNBA season ... Head coach Dan Hughes wrapped up his 12th season in the WNBA and his eighth overall with the Silver Stars in 2013 ... on July 25 of this past season, Coach Hughes picked up his 200th career victory against New York inside the AT&T Center ... currently, Coach Hughes has accumulated 206 wins in his career ... in 2013, Danielle Robinson became the 10th Silver Stars player to be named to the WNBA All-Star team ... prior to a season-ending injury, Robinson averaged 11.2 points and a league-leading 6.7 assists in 25 contests this season ... as a team, the Silver Stars ranked in the top five in two statistical categories ... they ranked fourth in the league in steals (8.26 per game) and fifth in assists

(16.4 per game) ... Silver Stars guard Jia Perkins ranked third in the WNBA in steals with 2.35 thefts per game ... Perkins also ranked fourth in the league in three-point field goal percentage, connecting on 38.8 (45-116) percent of her shots from long distance ... Stars center Jayne Appel ranked fourth in the WNBA in rebounding averaging 8.9 boards per contest ... Appel also ranked seventh in the league averaging 1.28 blocks ... at the conclusion of the season, Danielle Robinson and Jia Perkins were both named to the WNBA All-Defensive Second Team ... in 2003 the Utah Starzz, one of the WNBA's founding franchises, relocated to San Antonio and became the San Antonio Silver Stars ... the Silver Stars enjoyed the best season in franchise history during the 2008 campaign when the team posted a 24-10 record and made their first trip to the WNBA Finals falling to the Detroit Shock in three games ... the Silver Stars are currently one of 12 teams comprising the WNBA, which celebrated its 17th season in 2013 ... created on April 24, 1996, when the NBA Board of Governors approved the concept for a women's league, the first WNBA game was played in June 1997 ... the WNBA's 34-game regular-season schedule typically runs from Memorial Day to Labor Day. Just completed his eighth season with the Silver Stars ... the winningest coach in franchise history ... oversees the Silver Stars basketball staff, the team's roster development and all player acquisitions, while also coaching the team ... stepped aside as head coach to assume a full-time general manager role for the 2010 season and resumed his dual roles in 2011 ... in 13 years as a head coach – of the Charlotte Sting, the Cleveland Rockers and San Antonio – has led his teams to nine playoff appearances, four Western Conference Finals and one WNBA Final ... picked up his 200th career victory during the 2013 season ... is the only coach in WNBA history to take three different franchises to the playoffs ...



guided the 2008 Silver Stars to a 24-10 mark, earning the best record in the league and the franchise's first Western Conference Championship and its first trip to the WNBA Finals ... is a two-time WNBA Coach of the Year in 2007 and has finished as runner-up four times ... a member of the five-person USA Basketball Selection Committee for the 2010 World Championships, the 2012 Olympics and 2014 World Championships ... serves as a member of the selection committee for the Kay Yow Award ... has also spent time working as a broadcaster on San Antonio Spurs telecasts, as well as on men's and women's college games ... has coached 14 WNBA All-Stars ... many of Hughes' former players and assistant coaches have gone on to become coaches both at the college level and within the WNBA. Hughes' former athletes who went on to become Division I coaches are: Suzie McConnell-Serio (Duquesne); Dawn Staley (South Carolina); Jennifer Rizzotti Sullivan (Hartford); and Tricia Bader Binford (Montana State). Four of Hughes' former assistants have become WNBA Head Coaches: T.R. Dunn (Charlotte); Brian Agler (Seattle); Cheryl Reeve (Minnesota); and Suzie McConnell-Serio (formerly Minnesota) ... a native of Lowell, Ohio ... has been involved in coaching basketball at almost every level in the Buckeye State ... prior to joining the Sting, served as the assistant coach with the University of Toledo's women's basketball program (1996-97) and men's basketball program (1991-96) ... during his tenure with the Rockets' women's team, they posted a 27-4 record, winning the MAC Championship, and made an NCAA Tournament appearance ... had assistant coaching stints with the men's teams at Mount Union College (1982-84 and 1985-91) and Baldwin-Wallace College (1984-85) ... during the 1977-78 season, served as a graduate assistant at Miami of Ohio, helping the team to a MAC Championship and an appearance in the NCAA Regionals ... graduated with a degree in physical education and history from Muskingum College in New Concord, Ohio, in 1977 ... earned a Master's Degree in education from Miami University of Ohio in 1978 ... Hughes and his wife, Mary, have two children, Bryce and Sara, who coaches high school volleyball and basketball.

The San Antonio Rampage celebrate their 12th season in 2013-14 and serve as the top American Hockey League affiliate for the Florida Panthers ... originally a joint venture between Spurs Sports & Entertainment and the Florida Panthers until June 30, 2005 when SS&E purchased the Panthers portion of the franchise to assume sole ownership ... before becoming the Panthers affiliate, the Rampage spent six seasons as the top minor league affiliate of the Phoenix Coyotes (2005-11) ... entered into a new affiliation agreement with Florida on June 29, 2011 ... the Rampage are one of 30 AHL teams competing for the Calder Cup ... San Antonio will face 14 different teams in the 2013-14 season over the course of a 76-game balanced schedule, playing all 76 of their regular season games against Western Conference opponents ... inside the newly-formed West Division, San Antonio will play 40 games against four opponents ... the Rampage will face their in-state rivals, the Texas Stars, and their divisional rivals, the Oklahoma City Barons, 12 times each, along with eight contests against the Abbotsford Heat and Charlotte Checkers ... San Antonio posted a 29-38-2-7 record during the 2012-13 season ... throughout the season, 14 players who donned the Silver and Black were called-up to the Panthers, six of whom made their NHL debuts ... forward Jon Rheaull led the team in scoring with 48 points (20g, 28a), while Greg Rallo paced the Rampage with 23 goals on the year ... netminder Jacob Markstrom became the seventh player in franchise history to receive AHL Player of the Week honors after he posted four-straight victories from Dec. 4-9 and allowed just seven goals on 137 shots (4-0-0, 1.75 GAA, 0.949 SV%) ... after finishing seventh in the league in attendance for two-straight seasons (2010-12), the Rampage wrapped up the 2012-13 campaign sixth in the league in attendance, welcoming a total of 268,560 fans to the AT&T Center ... the franchise held its third annual Pink in the Rink game on Feb. 1, 2013, which raised \$42,000 to benefit breast health awareness efforts in San Antonio, and sold-out the AT&T Center for the second-straight year with a franchise-record 16,205 fans in attendance ... the Rampage received their third Team Business Service Award from the AHL in as many years when the team was recognized for leading the league in new season-ticket sales during the 2012-13 season ... in operation since 1936, the AHL continues to serve as the top development league for all 30 National Hockey League teams ... more than 87 percent of today's NHL players are American Hockey League graduates ... for the 12th year in a row, more than 6 million fans attended AHL games across North America in 2012-13 ... for more information on the San Antonio Rampage contact Alex DiFilippo at 210-444-5734.



PETER HORACEK HEAD COACH



Enters his first year as head coach of the San Antonio Rampage and became the eighth head coach in the history of the franchise when he was appointed the bench boss on June 25, 2013 ... spent the last nine seasons working for the National Hockey League's Nashville Predators (2003-13), serving his last two years as an associate head coach and his first seven seasons as an assistant coach ... helped the Predators reach the playoffs and the 40-win plateau in seven of the nine years he was behind the bench ... enters his second stint as an AHL head coach after guiding the Milwaukee Admirals, the top affiliate of the Nashville Predators, to their first playoff series victory since 1998 during the 2002-03 season ... led the ECHL's Trenton Titans to the Eastern Conference Finals during his only year as head coach of the team (2001-02) ... named the 2001 IHL Coach of the Year after leading the Orlando Solar Bears to an IHL Championship with a 12-4-0 run in the Turner Cup Playoffs ... spent two years as a head coach with the Solar Bears and amassed an impressive 94-51-0 record ... served as an assistant coach in Orlando for four seasons (1995-99) before being promoted to head coach of the club ... began coaching career in the IHL as an assistant coach with the Saginaw Spirit in 1987-88 and spent one year as a player and assistant coach with the Flint Spirits (1988-89) ... earned his first head coaching role with the Nashville Knights of the ECHL prior to the 1990-91 season ... served as head coach for four seasons in the Colonial Hockey League, spending two years with the St. Thomas Wildcats (1991-93) and two seasons with the Flint Generals (1993-95) before being promoted to assistant coach of the Orlando Solar Bears ... coached alongside Chuck Weber, former Rampage head coach and currently the team's director of hockey operations, for the 2000-01 season in Orlando and the 2001-02 season in Trenton ... held title of team captain in four of his five seasons as a player with the Saginaw/Flint Generals and won a Turner Cup Championship in 1984 ... tallied 188 goals and 238 assists in 545 professional games throughout his nine-year playing career.





The Austin Toros concluded their 2012-13 season with a 27-23 overall record, including a 15-10 record inside Cedar Park Center ... the Toros featured two top-5 scorers last season, including Justin Dentmon (22.9 ppg), who led the league in scoring, and Spurs assignee Cory Joseph (19.4 ppg) ... Joseph also finished eighth in assists with 5.5 dishes per contest ... Austin also touted a top-3 rebounder with Rick Jackson pulling down 10.0 boards per contest ... Toros forward Tyler Wilkerson finished ninth in field goal percentage, converting on .529 (185-350) of his shot attempts ... the Spurs assigned three players to the Toros throughout the 2012-13 season, including Cory Joseph, Aron Baynes and Nando De Colo ... former Toros head coaches include the late Dennis Johnson (2005-07), who was inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame in 2010, Quin Snyder (2007-10), who is now an Atlanta Hawks assistant coach, and current Utah Jazz assistant coach Brad Jones (2010-12) ... the Toros joined the D-League on

May 4, 2005, when the Columbus Riverdragons moved from Georgia to Texas ... Spurs Sports & Entertainment purchased the team on June 28, 2007 ... the Austin Toros enjoyed their best season in franchise history in 2011-12, capped off by winning their first NBA D-League Championship by defeating the Los Angeles D-Fenders in a best-of-three series ... the Toros posted a franchise-best 33-17 during the regular season and were a league-best 18-4 on their home court at the Cedar Park Center ... the NBA D-League, founded in 2001, is the NBA's official minor league ... featuring 16 teams with direct affiliations to NBA franchises, the NBA D-League is a proven developer of talent: Entering the 2013-14 season, 132 NBA players have D-League experience, and the league continues to develop coaches, referees, and front-office staff for the NBA and its teams ... one hundred and sixty players with NBA Development League experience are featured on 2013-14 NBA training camp rosters ... the 160 former NBA D-Leaguers comprise 29 percent of all players on training camp rosters ... for more information on the Toros contact the team's front office at (512) 236-8333.



KEN MCDONALD HEAD COACH

Is in his first season as head coach of the Austin Toros ... served as an assistant last season for the Toros under head coach Taylor Jenkins, where he helped lead the team to a 27-23 overall record and to the semifinals of the 2013 NBA D-League Playoffs ... prior to the Toros, served as head coach at Western Kentucky University from 2008-12 where he accumulated a 67-48 overall record ... accomplishments with the Hilltoppers included guiding the school to the Sun Belt regular season and tournament championships in 2009 ... the Rhode Island native served as an assistant coach for the University of Texas (2004-08) where he helped guide the Longhorns to four straight NCAA Tournament appearances ... during his four seasons on the Texas bench the Longhorns posted a 106-35 (.752) record ... the 106 wins are still the most victories in a four-year period in school history ... Texas captured Big 12 Conference regular-season championships in both 2005-06 and 2007-08 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament "Elite Eight" in both of those years as well ... also served as an assistant coach at the University of Georgia (2003-04), Western Kentucky University (1998-2003) and Clemson University (1994-98) ... a Providence College graduate, played two seasons with the Friars before playing professionally for the St. Paul Revelles in Killarney, Ireland from 1993-94 ... before transferring to Providence he played two seasons at the Community College of Rhode Island, where he was a first-team junior college All-American, setting school records for single season scoring as well as three-pointers made in a game, season and career.



CEDAR PARK CENTER | HOME OF THE TOROS



As the premier entertainment venue in South Texas, the AT&T Center opened in November of 2002. The AT&T Center was built by the initiatives of a public-private venture amongst Bexar County, the Coliseum Advisory Board, the San Antonio Livestock Show & Rodeo and Spurs Sports & Entertainment. The facility hosts four anchor tenants: the NBA Spurs, the AHL Rampage, the WNBA Silver Stars and the San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo. Additionally, the venue attracts a multitude of concerts, family shows and special events. In 11 years of operation, the AT&T Center has hosted over 1,000 events with entertaining in excess of 15 million guests. George Strait, the Rolling Stones, Billy Joel & Elton John, The Police, Luciano Pavarotti, George Lopez, Cirque du Soleil, Lady Gaga, Justin Bieber, and Bon Jovi are just a few of the musical acts that have visited the AT&T Center. Other events include NCAA Basketball, WWE Royal Rumble, Walking with Dinosaurs, and the Harlem Globetrotters.



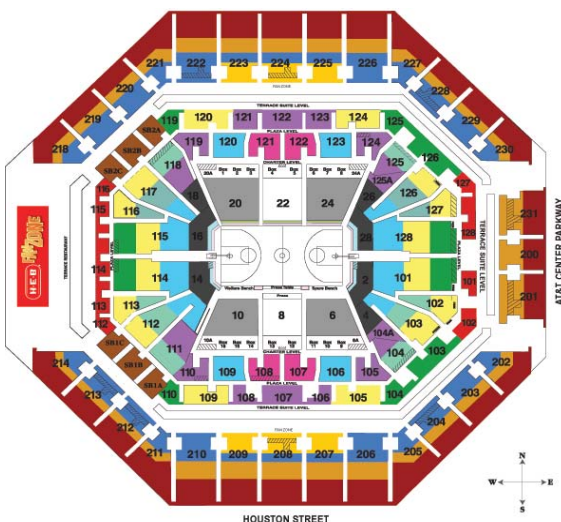
