Dear Parish Family,

Praised be Jesus Christ for His unceasing pursuit of our souls and hearts!

Our Lord continues to speak with parables to the chief priests and the elders. This Sunday we have the parable of the wicked tenants (Mt 21:33-43). From a superficial perspective, these constant encounters of Jesus with the chief priests and the elders seem to be a battle against each other.

The prophet Isaiah reminds us that “The vineyard of the LORD of hosts is the house of Israel...” (Is 51:1-7). In today’s gospel parable, it is not that Jesus is against the chief priests and the elders, but He is trying to get through the hardness of their hearts. Jesus does not give up on them; He desperately tries to awaken them to the reality of who He is as the Son of God, but they just don’t seem to get it. Jesus tries to get through to them by using parable after parable, to see if finally they’re able to get it. There seems to be no progress, because the chief priests and elders are taking Jesus’ words as an attack, rather than as an invitation for their conversion.

Jesus is not interested in hurting them or making them feel outcast; He simply wants them to realize their need for God, not just for His laws.

These people were good at knowing God’s laws and followed them to the best of their ability. Perhaps they thought it was enough to know the laws, but they were forgetting about the law giver. Jesus knows this reality. Through His encounters with them, Jesus tries to place a mirror before them, so that they may see their own poverty. Our Lord wants them to realize their need for God’s love, not just for His laws. Parable after parable, and they don’t seem to get it. But Jesus is relentless. He doesn't give up on them, and continues to try.

Jesus’ efforts are a reflection of the Father’s love for each one of us.

He never stops pursuing our hearts in hopes of setting them on fire with His love. The Father knows our poverty, and wants to help. Just like in the parable, our Lord wants to hold a mirror

before us, not that we might be frightened of our poverty, but that we might run to His loving arms.

We always run the risk of imitating the attitude of the chief priests and elders in the Gospel today. At times, we might think that just by coming to Mass or saying a few prayers we are fulfilling our Christian duty. Our faith is a matter of relationship, an embrace of the Father’s love for each one of us.

He never gives up on us. He wants us to acknowledge our poverty, so that He might enrich us with His loving mercy.

May we have the humility to run to the Father’s arms to embrace His relentless love for us.

Estimada Familia Parroquial,

¡Alabado sea Jesucristo por su búsqueda incesante de nuestras almas y corazones! Nuestro Señor continúa hablando con parábolas a los sumos sacerdotes y a los ancianos del pueblo.

Este domingo tenemos la parábola de los labradores malvados (Mt 21, 33-43). Desde una perspectiva superficial, estos constantes encuentros de Jesús con los sumos sacerdotes y los ancianos del pueblo parecen ser una batalla campal.

El profeta Isaías nos recuerda que “La viña del SEÑOR de los ejércitos es la casa de Israel...” (Is 51: 1-7).

En la parábola del evangelio de hoy, no es que Jesús esté en contra de los sumos sacerdotes y los ancianos, sino que está tratando de penetrar en la dureza de sus corazones. Pero Jesús no se da por vencido con ellos; Intenta desesperadamente despertarlos a la realidad de quién es Él como el Hijo de Dios, pero parece que no lo comprenden.

Jesús trata de llegar a ellos usando parábola tras parábola para ver si finalmente pueden entenderlo. Parece que no hay progreso porque los sumos sacerdotes y los ancianos están tomando las palabras de Jesús como un ataque, más que como una invitación a su conversión.

Jesús no está interesado en herirlos o hacerlos sentir marginados; Simplemente quiere que se den cuenta de la necesidad que tienen de Dios. Estas personas sabían bien las leyes de Dios y las seguían lo mejor que podían. Quizás pensaban que era suficiente conocer las leyes, pero se estaban olvidando de Dios, Jesús sabe esta realidad.

A través de sus encuentros con ellos, El trata de colocarles un espejo para que vean su propia pobreza. Nuestro Señor quiere que reconozcan su necesidad del amor de Dios y no solo de sus leyes. Parábola tras parábola y parece que no la entienden. Pero Jesús es imparable. No se da por vencido con ellos y sigue intentándolo.

Los esfuerzos de Jesús son un reflejo del amor del Padre por cada uno de nosotros. Él nunca deja de perseguir nuestros corazones con la esperanza de prenderles fuego con Su amor. El Padre conoce nuestra carencia y quiere ayudarnos. Al igual que en la parábola, nuestro Señor quiere sostener un espejo ante nosotros, no para que tengamos miedo

de nuestra pobreza, sino para que corramos a sus brazos amorosos. Siempre tenemos el riesgo de imitar la actitud de los sumos sacerdotes y de los ancianos en el Evangelio de hoy.

A veces podemos pensar que con solo asistir a misa o rezar algunas oraciones estamos cumpliendo con nuestro deber cristiano. Nuestra fe es de relación, de abrazar el amor del Padre por cada uno de nosotros. Él nunca se rinde, quiere que reconozcamos nuestra pobreza para enriquecernos con su amorosa misericordia.

Ojalá tengamos la humildad de correr a los brazos del Padre para abrazar Su incansable amor por nosotros.
