A NOTE FROM FR. DEREK

As we continue to see improvement in recovery from the COVID pandemic and as mask guidelines for those who have been fully vaccinated have been relaxed by the CDC and the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, I wanted to bring you up to date on some things that I announced at the conclusion of last week's Masses:

Beginning this weekend we will allow for those who have been fully vaccinated to remove their masks while seated in the church. In order to do this we will have "mask optional" seating on the right side of the church as you face the altar. The left side of the church as you are facing the altar will be considered "Masks required." This will be because some of our more vulnerable population require the open seating at the front for mobility issues. Those who are not fully vaccinated should remember that there may be people in the church who are unable to be vaccinated and may be unable to wear masks such as young children. Being a pro-family Church, you should consider carefully the moral obligation to continue to wear masks in order to protect the most vulnerable.

At this time I don't know how many people will be wanting the "mask required" side and how many the "mask optional" side of the church. That will remain to be seen. If you plan on wearing a mask but are still comfortable being seated in a section with those who are not, please feel free to sit there and allow more space for those who wish to sit in the "mask required" side.

Masks should be removed only when seated. To ensure everyone's safety and comfort, for the time being, masks will be required when (1) entering the church; (2) moving about inside the church, e.g., going to the restroom, coming up for Communion; and (3) leaving the church until you are outside.

Those who wish to receive Communion on the tongue are asked to keep to the end of the Communion line and come to the priest to receive Communion. Please see this as performing an act of charity towards those who might feel uncomfortable receiving Communion after you have.

Beginning this week, also, we will do away with the need to sign up for Masses. The only sign ups that will remain will be for the crying rooms. We are blessed to have these crying rooms and during this time of pandemic they provide an extra degree of safety for those who have some additional concerns or may have children that are unable to be masked. Please save the sign up for the crying rooms for those who really need it. Thank you.

POTENTIAL REPEAL OF "HYDE AMENDMENT" - YOUR HELP NEEDED



through their new life in Christ. God indeed will "lift high the lowly tree," as He solemnly promises.

Such salvation surpasses humanity's most ambitious dreams. And so we express our gratitude in the psalm: "Lord, it is good to give thanks to you." It is indeed good, and better still to give thanks with praise. The psalmist speaks of those who are just upon the earth, but looks to God as the source and measure of justice, of righteousness. Like Ezekiel, he evokes the image of a flourishing tree to describe the lives of the just. The image, again, suggests the Cross as the measure of righteousness.

The Cross is a sign of contradiction

to those who would rather "flourish" in worldly terms. As St. Paul emphasizes to the Corinthians, we need courage. Our faith makes us strong and it is proved in our deeds. He reminds us that we will be judged by the ways our faith manifests itself in works: "so that each may receive recompense, according to what he did in the body, whether good or evil."

God Himself will empower the works He expects from us, though we freely choose to correspond to His grace. In the prophetic oracles, He scattered the seed that sprang up and became the mustard tree, large enough to accommodate all the birds of the sky, just as Ezekiel had seen. He gave this doctrine to His

disciples in terms they were able to understand, and He provided a full explanation. In the sacraments He provides still more: the grace of faith and the courage we need to live in the world as children of God.



Saint Juliana of Falconieri

uliana was the only child of a wealthy couple in Florence, Italy, who had built the church of the Annunciation there. She refused to marry and was enrolled as a tertiary with the Servite order; her uncle, St. Alexis Falconieri, was one of the seven founders of the Servites. For nearly 20 years, Juliana lived a devout and useful life at home. In 1304 she formed a community of tertiary sisters who devoted themselves to prayer and good works in Florence. She is considered the foundress of the Servite community of nuns, and was canonized in 1737.


