## St. Bernard Sheriff's Office arrest couple for distribution of crack cocaine, possession of marijuana, stolen handgun

A New Orleans woman and a Mississippi man were arrested Feb. 23 in Arabi and crack cocaine, marijuana, and two handguns, one of which was reported stolen, were recovered after a deputy conducted a traffic stop on them for a speeding violation, St. Bernard Sheriff James Pohlmann said.

Tiffany Brooks, 30, of the 1800 block of Gordon Street, was booked with possession with the intent to distribute crack cocaine, possession of marijuana, possession of a stolen firearm, possession of a firearm while in possession of a controlled dangerous substance, and two warrants out of the New Orleans Police Department.

Drew Clark, 33, of the 1500 block of Eastward Drive in Gulfport, was booked with posses-

sion with the intent to distribute crack cocaine, possession of marijuana, possession of a stolen firearm, possession of a firearm by a convicted felon, possession of a firearm while in possession of a controlled dangerous substance, a speed law violation and two warrants out of the NOPD.

On Feb. 23, shortly after 9 p.m., Sheriff Pohlmann said, an agent with the Special Investigations Division conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle traveling at a high rate of speed, westbound along Judge Perez Drive in Arabi near Rowley Boulevard.

During the traffic stop, the agent noticed a strong aroma of marijuana emitting from inside the vehicle. Following a search of the vehicle, agents recovered two clear plastic bags contain-

ing marijuana, one clear plastic bag containing two smaller clear plastic bags containing crack cocaine, one clear plastic bag containing 11 smaller clear plastic bags containing crack cocaine, and two handguns, one of which was reported sto-

len out of the Gulfport Police Department in Mississippi.

Brooks and Clark were both transported to St. Bernard Parish Prison to be booked. Brooks was released Feb. 27 on a \$5,000 bond; Clark is being held in lieu of a \$40,000 bond.

# William Buckingham presents Free Talk “Remembering Isleño Décimas: Louisiana’s Lost Tradition of Spanish Ballad Singing”

The Center for Louisiana Studies, in partnership with the Jean Lafitte National Historical Park and Preserve Acadian Cultural Center, invites the public to a free lecture by University of Chicago doctoral candidate William Buckingham on “Remembering Isleño Décimas: Louisiana’s Lost Tradition of Spanish Ballad Singing.” The talk will be Wednesday, March 14, 2018, beginning at 6:30pm at the Acadian Cultural Center, 501 Fisher

Road, Lafayette, LA.

Buckingham’s research centers on the Isleño décima, a unique genre of Spanish folk song from St. Bernard Parish in southeast Louisiana. Louisiana’s Hispanic heritage is a significant, if often forgotten, facet of the state’s cultural mixture. An introductory overview of this heritage will provide context for close listening and analysis of some examples of recorded décimas. This rich and diverse

repertory attests to both ancient origins in medieval Spanish romances, brought by colonists from the Canary Islands in the eighteenth century, as well as more recent influences from both a regional circum-Gulf Hispanic culture and a rich local multicultural milieu. Today, the décima is no longer vital as a musical practice, resulting from the decline of the unique dialect of Isleño Spanish, decades of land loss, hurricanes, and the

decline of the communities that once sustained the tradition. In closing, Buckingham will consider the significance of these recent developments within the broader context of Louisiana’s diverse cultural heritage and unfolding ecological crisis.

The Chalmette Slip at the St. Bernard Port, one of our most historic, was built in 1907 and has been in need of repair and restoration. The slip has six sections of cargo wharves and the \$13 million TIGER Grant that I worked with Senators Cassidy and Kennedy to secure from the Department of Transportation will help update two of the last original wharf sections of the slip, which have been maintained but are now beyond their useful lives. This is great news for St. Bernard and the Greater New Orleans region as we continue our position as one of the dominant maritime commerce hubs in the nation.

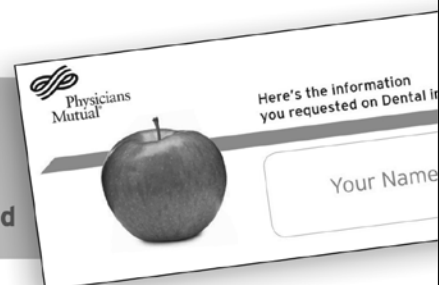

Maintenance is an ongoing priority at Chalmette Refining, and preventive maintenance is critical to preserving safe and reliable operations. That's why we are once again gearing up for a 'turnaround,' a planned activity that allows us to focus our efforts on preventive maintenance. The turnaround is scheduled to take place throughout March 2018 and there will be increased activity in and outside the refinery.

**So what does this mean to you as a refinery neighbor?** Here's what you can expect while the turnaround is underway.

- Increased traffic on main streets around the refinery, particularly during shift changes.
- Bright lights from portable towers at night.
- Additional contract workers who specialize in refinery turnaround work will be in the area.
- To prepare for this scheduled work, light gases from the refining process may be routed to our flares during shutdown and start-up activities.
- We can assure you that if you see the flare glowing, this safety device is working properly.



During the turnaround, shift changes will occur between 5:30 and 7:00 AM, and 5:30 and 7:00 PM. During peak work periods we may bus workers to the refinery from a nearby, offsite parking area. Please be assured that both traffic safety and parking control are key elements of our planning. We are coordinating our efforts with the St. Bernard Parish Sheriff's Department to ensure public safety, and effective monitoring and controls.

**What about production?** Although some of our units will be shut down, the refinery will continue producing gasoline, distillates, and other refined products. We feel confident we will be able to continue to supply our customers.

**Why are we telling you this?** We strive to be a responsible, caring neighbor. We are providing this information to you because we feel it is important for you to know our plans and to minimize surprises. Preventive maintenance programs like this turnaround help us make Chalmette Refining a safe, reliable and environmentally responsible facility.

We appreciate your patience during this period of increased activity and apologize for any inconvenience this may cause you, your family, and/or your business.

## St. Bernard Sheriff's Office stresses zero tolerance policy after booking several students with terrorizing

St. Bernard Sheriff James Pohlmann is stressing a zero tolerance policy after arresting several stu-dents, ranging from elementary to high school age, for making per-

ceived threats to St. Bernard Par-ish schools and/or students. "We want the public to know we do not take these types of acts lightly, and will take every

potential threat seriously, no mat-ter how small," Sheriff Pohlmann said. "We have no tolerance for individuals who threaten the safe-ty of our students and our com-munity."

Detectives with the Criminal Investigations Bureau booked several students with terrorizing following several unrelated inci-dents that occurred in a little over one week's time, between Feb. 23 and March 5.

Sheriff Pohlmann wants to en-sure the public that all of these threats were thoroughly investi-gated with cooperation from Su-perintendent Doris Voitier and the St. Bernard Parish School Board,

and no one was harmed in any of the instances.

However, the Sheriff said, these incidents caused a sense of wor-ry among students for their safe-ty and wellbeing, and also made parents leery about sending their children to school, which will not be tolerated.

"Any and all threats of this na-ture will be investigated and the offenders will be prosecuted if deemed necessary," the Sheriff said.

Sheriff Pohlmann urges parents to talk with their children about the severity of such threats, and

what consequences can come from making them. Even comments made in a joking manner are not acceptable and will be taken seriously, he said.

The Sheriff also reminds both adults and children of the "see something, say something" rule.

"If you witness someone saying something in a threatening manner about another individual or a student body as a whole, we encourage you to report it to school administrators and to the Sheriff's Office so we can investigate," the Sheriff said. "No matter how small, we need to check out all instances such as these to ensure the safety of our students, faculty members and the general public."
