The St. Claire Foundation's June 6th Signature Event started harmlessly enough, as about 100 people socialized over drinks and appetizers in anticipation of a wedding unlike any other.

It was all part of the Foundation's annual Mystery Dinner Theater to raise money to help equip the Family Medicine clinic in the new Center for Health, Education and Research.

"No one actually died, of course. But our wonderful volunteer cast was 'killing' the audience with laughter," said Roger Russell, SCR Vice President of Development. "I can't thank the cast enough for lending their time, talent and energy to support our mission and programs."

ST. CLAIRE REGIONAL ONCOLOGY NURSES RECEIVE CHEMOTHERAPY TRAINING

The University of Kentucky's Markey Cancer Center and St. Claire Regional Medical Center are working together to train and certify chemotherapy infusion nurses so cancer patients can receive care closer to home. St. Claire Regional nurses Brittany Blair and Patti Arnett recently completed certification.

"The Markey Cancer Center is committed to improving access to advanced cancer treatments for all Kentuckians, irrespective of where they may live," said Kevin McDonagh, chief of the Markey Cancer Center Division of Hematology, Oncology and Blood and Marrow Transplantation. "By partnering with rural community hospitals to train and certify their chemotherapy infusion nurses, we can help to ensure that patients will receive the same high quality treatment they would expect at our center in Lexington, while benefiting from the convenience and comfort of care in their hometown. The skill and dedication of these nurses is extraordinary, and we take great pride in the opportunity to work closely with them in this program."

The three-day course provided a comprehensive review of the administration of chemotherapy and biotherapy agents. The initial training took place at UK. This will be followed by a visit to the affiliate sites where the UK nurse specialists will observe and critique the administration of chemotherapy by the affiliate nurses in their own infusion suite. At the conclusion of the training, the nurses will be certified by the ONS and by Markey Cancer Center.

H1N1 UPDATE

PATIENT ISOLATION
PROTOCOL
DOWNGRADED

Please note there are changes in guidelines for isolation precautions for suspected or known cases of H1N1. The Society for Healthcare Epidemiology of America (SHEA) now recommends that the use of droplet precautions is sufficient for isolation. Patients will not have to be placed in negative air pressure rooms and a surgical mask can be used instead of the N95 respirator. Eye protection is not required for H1N1, but as always, anytime there is a chance of generating droplets or splashing in the eyes, precautions should be used.
