Eucharist as Wisdom
 'The Book of Wisdom contains King Solomon's wise sayings. It helps readers who look for ways to live well-ordered lives with purpose. Christians assume that true wisdom is living faithfully the teaching of Jesus Christ, the Messiah and Son of God. If believers experienced God and lived this experience every day, they are following in the footsteps of Jesus. The Gospel this weekend goes further, saying the living bread, the Eucharist, stands in the center of the experiences of God. John has Jesus reminding his followers that to eat this bread begins an internal transformation that the Eucharist awakens. Christ is in them, and they are in Christ, just as the Father is in Christ and Christ is in the Father. Jesus exhorts his followers to spend time in self-reflection and prayer, understanding what eating this 'living bread' truly means. When they do, they will see how he is 'the way, and the truth, and the life' (Jn 14:6) They will believe and understand why he can guide them to true wisdom: eternity- their true finish line.' – OSV

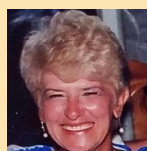

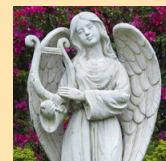

Come away for a fall day with Cabrini Tuesday Travelers!

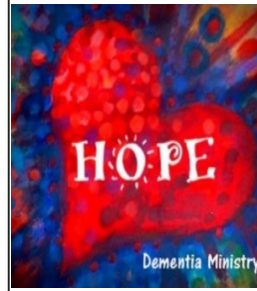

From the desk of Fr. Dom.....

WHAT NO ONE TELLS YOU ABOUT...

Question: The Church and Same-Sex Attraction (SSA) part 1

Understanding between the Church and her members who have SSA is a vital mission. This is an issue which demands Christian sensitivity and empathy. There are those among our brothers and sisters who struggle with SSA. Many may be struggling to live chastely while at the same time desiring an authentic expression of love. Many may be wounded and in need of healing. Many may feel abandoned by the Church and family. The response of the Church's members must be to provide the truth with compassion. For when we meet the truth we meet Jesus!

In the course of the article I will be using the term *Same-Sex Attraction* (homosexual attraction/tendency) for three reasons. First, the term "gay" or "lesbian" is indicative of a lifestyle choice. It is an unfair designation for those who may have attractions to members of the same-sex but no intention to indulge in such a lifestyle. Secondly, this two-part article will be more focused on the person than the sexual act which is separate. And finally, our sexual orientation is not our identity.

A brief distinction between a person and an act should be made at the outset. The Church says SSA is not sinful, but homosexual actions are. The Catechism states, "Homosexual acts are intrinsically disordered. They are contrary to the natural law. They close the sexual act to the gift of life. They do not proceed from a genuine affective and sexual complementarity. Under no circumstances can they be approved, CCC 2357". However, "men and women who have homosexual tendencies must be accepted with respect, compassion and sensitivity. Every sign of unjust discrimination in their regard should be avoided, CCC 2358". A person who struggles with SSA is not bad because of it, and they are not defined by what attracts them. The Church in Her wisdom classifies the homosexual action as sinful because it is bad for the person, just as the inordinate heterosexual action is sinful because it is bad for the person. Here I think of Pope Francis: "who am I to judge". The Church judges actions as sinful so the homosexual act is and always will be a sin when knowingly and freely done. Yet, we cannot say the person is bad nor unredeemable because God is mercy; and a person who struggles with SSA, even should he/she fall occasionally, Jesus still loves and saves! We are all sinners, we are all in need of redemption and this sinful-

ness is not particular to a homosexual or a heterosexual. God offers salvation to all because all are in need of it.

The bigger issue at hand, especially for a parent struggling to reconcile with the Church or a person who is struggling with SSA and chastity is identity. We are first and foremost sons and daughters of God. Nothing can change this reality. Circumstances of life impact a lot of things but they do not impact who we are in God's eyes. In my ministry, I have had the opportunity to walk with many people in their struggles. A common theme that I have seen, especially with sins of a sexual nature, is the distortion of the person's identity. They no longer see themselves as sons and daughter of God but rather as an adulterer or a homosexual or a drunk, or a gossip, or a liar. The sin becomes the identity. This is a LIE. The world does a wonderful job of isolating us in our sinfulness, of making us one with it, of making it part of who we are as people. This is a direct attack on our inherent dignity! Scripture addresses this directly with John 8: 1-11. A woman is brought before Jesus who has been caught in the act of adultery. The Pharisees want to stone her and ask Jesus what He thinks. This gives us two conclusions about the Pharisees. 1) They only see her as an adulterer, not as a daughter of God. 2) They see her devoid of dignity. This is evidenced by their wanting to stone her, because you do not destroy something valuable, you protect it. Jesus is able to distinguish between the sin and the person. "Let the one among you who is without sin, be the first to throw a stone at her." He sees the truth, that she has dignity as a daughter of God. Yes, she is a sinner. However, her sin doesn't reduce her worth. So after forgiving her, He commands her to "go and sin no more." This must be our approach, a heartfelt focus on the person and a walking with them towards truth and healing.

To close this part of the article a takeaway is: the distinction between sins and the person. The Church teaches that homosexual acts are sinful but this does not change the dignity and worth of any person. We are called to conversion. We are all called into a deep and intimate relationship with our God and one another. We were made to be loved and to love. We are all called to love regardless if a person is heterosexual or homosexual. In part 2 of this article, the nature of how we love will be explored.
