Six teams of 4-6 parishioners do seasonal and weekly liturgy planning. Our focus is on practical, real-life applications of scripture. Teams meet to reflect on the scriptures for assigned Sundays. Based on that reflection, notes are written for homilists' consideration, prayers are selected/written, general intercessions are written, and an ordo form is submitted. Representatives of each team and the parish staff do seasonal planning for Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter. We gather to reflect, pray and share our thoughts.




