# The Lord said to Moses, "Gather for me seventy of the elders of Israel, whom you know to be the elders of the people and officers over them; bring them to the tent of meeting, and have them take their place there with you. I will come down and talk with you there; and I will take some of the Spirit that is on you and put it on them; and they shall bear the burden of the people along with you so that you will not bear it all by yourself. Numbers 11:16-17

A small group of my clergy colleagues and I have recently embarked on an ambitious project: we are reading the bible together in 90 days, from cover to cover. The pace of the reading is a little intense. But I've got to say that I really appreciate the way that this kind of large scale bible reading helps connect all the little familiar stories that we're so used to reading on their own – it gives a much bigger picture view of how God has been working through and among God's people throughout the generations.

We just recently read through the stories of the exodus from Egypt and the people's journey through the wilderness of Sinai, and I was powerfully struck by a sense of déjà vu. There was so much about their wandering in the wilderness and their longing to return that felt deeply familiar. And I found myself identifying with Moses and Aaron, as they faced the challenge of trying to safely shepherd their people through a trying time, giving their best efforts to feed and care for them and keep them safe.

I read these couple of verses from the book of Numbers as an example of God's faithful care and provision in times of trouble. God sees the burden that Moses and Aaron are carrying and decides to call a group of elders and leaders from among the people to help share the heavy task of leadership.

It makes me mindful of how deeply grateful I have been for the elders and leaders of this congregation: our church council. At the outset of this pandemic, these leaders swiftly mobilized and made plans to shift our entire worship life to a digital platform, while also making sure to have means in place of staying connected with our nondigital folks. And in the many, many months since then, they have remained faithfully committed to their role as leaders: making decisions founded in genuine care and concern for the congregation and community, relying on synod guidance and the best public health information that was available, doing their very best to balance caution with the desire to return to a sense of normalcy. This has been an unprecedentedly difficult time to be in leadership, and our council leaders have been called on to help make the kinds of decisions that none of them imagined we'd have to make when they signed on for this. And time and again, they have proven themselves to be good leaders; by choosing to do what they believed was right, even when it wasn't popular.

This month of July, we will return, singing, to our sanctuary, with masks still recommended, but no longer required. It feels almost as though we have made it as far as the Jordan and are looking across into the promised land. We are still mindful of any folks among us who – for age or health reasons – have not been able to be vaccinated, but we continue to draw closer to some sense of our "new normal." And as we come to the end of this modern day saga of exile and wandering in the wilderness, I strongly encourage each and every one of you: <u>thank your council members</u>. You may not agree with the decisions council has made over the last 16 months – and that's perfectly fine – but they deserve your gratitude for carrying a heavy burden that none of them signed up for.

Jalaine, Jon, Rick, Karen, Chellee, John, Tracey, Randy, thank you so much for your diligent service to this congregation, for serving with integrity and compassion. To you I say, from the bottom of my heart:

Ingredients

1/2 cup milk 12 ounces lean bacon 3 medium ripe tomatoes, cut into chunks 1 tablespoon chopped fresh thyme 1 clove garlic, minced Kosher salt and freshly ground pepper 1/2 cup mayonnaise 1/4 cup sour cream 4 tablespoons chopped chives or scallion greens

5 heads Bibb lettuce, guartered, or 5 cups chopped romaine hearts

#### Directions

Cook the pasta in a large pot of salted boiling water as the label directs. Drain and toss with the milk in a large bowl; set aside.

Meanwhile, cook the bacon in a large skillet over medium-high heat until crisp. Drain on paper towels. Discard all but 3 tablespoons drippings from the pan. Add the tomatoes, thyme and garlic to the pan and toss until warmed through; season with salt and pepper. Crumble the bacon into bite-size pieces; set aside 1/4 cup for garnish. Toss the remaining bacon and the tomato mixture with the pasta. Mix the mayonnaise, sour cream and 3 tablespoons chives with the pasta until evenly combined.

Season with salt and pepper. Add the lettuce; toss again to coat. Garnish with the reserved bacon and the remaining 1 tablespoon chives. Serve at room temperature.
