## Athletics Carnival - Important Information.

Dear Parents and Caregivers,



**Date** – Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> June, week 7 term 2.

**Time** – *Drop Off* 8:30 - 8:50am. Carnival begins **9am** with the running of the 800m races. *Carnival concludes* **2:30pm**.

**Venue** – Barden Park, Opposite North Dubbo Primary School on Fitzroy St.

The carnival is part of the PDHPE program and attendance for students in year 3-6 is compulsory on this day. If for any reason the carnival needed to be postponed please listen to Radio 2DU, 1251 AM, on the morning of  $13^{th}$  June. If the carnival was to be postponed it would be a normal school day at St John's Primary.

On the day of the carnival students will need to dropped off at Barden Park between 8:30 – 8:50am in the morning and can be collected when the carnival concludes at 2:30pm. *Please note: Buses do not run to or from Barden Park for our students on this day.* Mrs Dries will operate a canteen on the day. Lunch order forms will be going home this Wednesday and will need to be returned to school by Friday 7<sup>th</sup> June for students who wish to order lunch on the day.

All students will compete in their age 100m running race. Students who wish, can enter the 200m & 800m running races as well in the following age groupings, Juniors 8,9,10 years old, 11year olds, or seniors 12/13 years old. Field event eliminations in Shot Put, Discus, Long Jump & High Jump have been taking place at school with the top 6 students in each event competing in the final on carnival day. 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> from the running races and 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> from the field events will progress on to represent St John's Primary at the Northern Region Athletics Carnival at Barden Park on 25<sup>th</sup> July.

To help with the smooth running of the carnival it would be great to get parent helpers to facilitate with timekeeping and the running of field events. Lunch and refreshments will be provided on the day. If you are able to give some time on the day please fill in the information below and send it back to school with your child's permission note.
