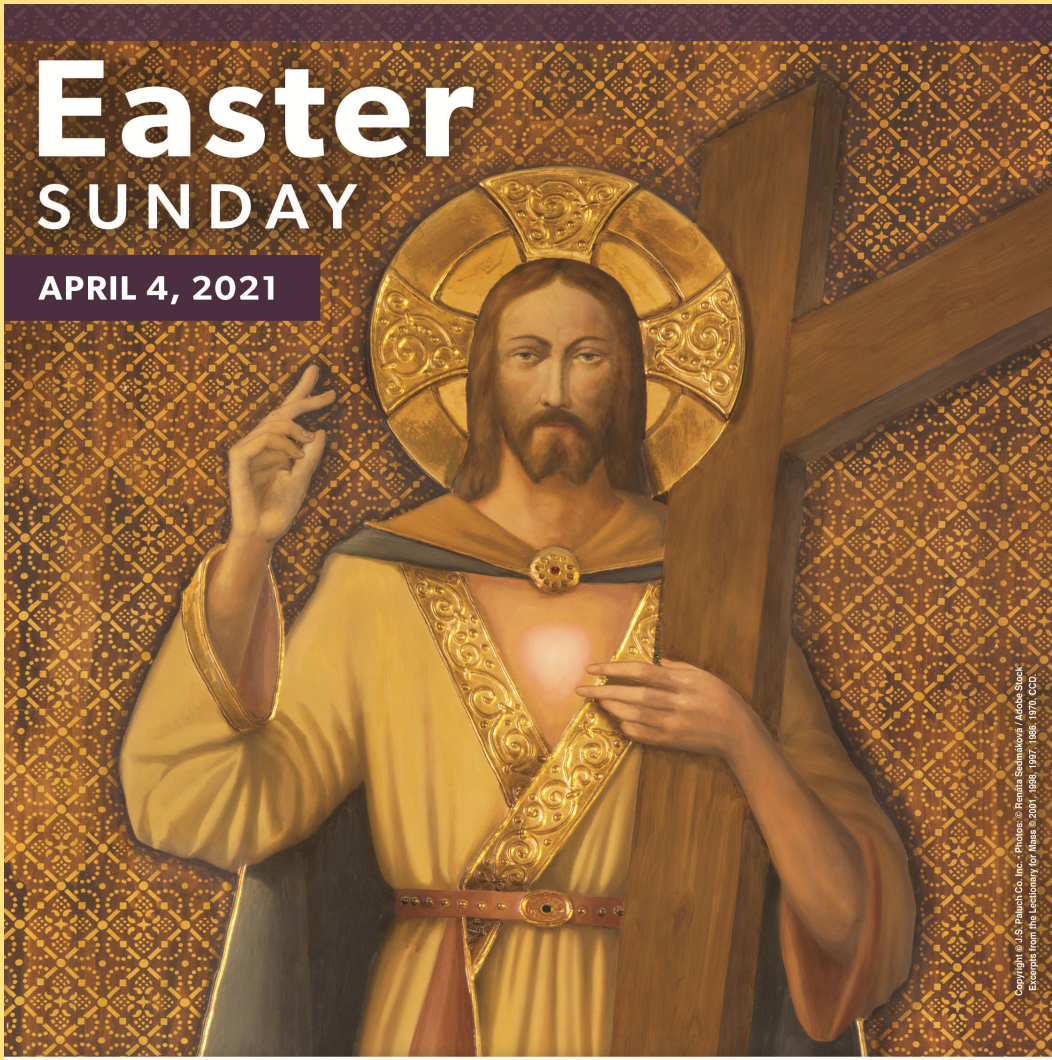

Dear parishioners,

As we prepare for the Feast of Divine Mercy Sunday, traditionally it is preceded by a Novena to the Divine Mercy. A Novena is nine days of prayer in preparation for a feast. Each day we pray the Chaplet of the Divine Mercy for a specific intention.

As our Lord told St. Faustina, "I desire that during these nine days you bring souls to the fountain of My Mercy, that they may draw...strength and refreshment and whatever grave they need in the hardships of life, and especially at the hour of death" (Diary, 1209).

The Novena begins on Good Friday, April 2, 2021 and end on Saturday, April 10, 2021. Due to Mass schedule changes and some activities and space limitation inside of our church on Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter Sunday, we will skip three days and resume the Novena on Monday, April 5 after 11:00 A.M mass until Saturday, April 10, 2021. Please join us if you sign up for mass as we follow our Lord's wish to bring to Him various intentions during our nine days of prayer.

On the Feast Day Sunday, April 11, we will expose and venerate the Image of the Divine Mercy (including vigil Sunday Mass on Saturday at 3:00 P.M, livestream Mass at 9:30 A.M, and outdoor Mass at 11:00 A.M) as Jesus told St. Faustina, **"Yes, the first Sunday after Easter is the Feast of Mercy, but there must also be acts of mercy, and I demand the worship of my mercy through the solemn celebration of the Feast and through the veneration of the image which is painted. By means of this image I will grant many graces to souls"** (Diary, 742).

Note: There is no communal or personal veneration of the image after Mass.

100% of our students who applied to Catholic High School were accepted to their first choice Catholic High School. 26 students applied for Catholic High school and earned 21 spots at Archbishop Mitty, 18 spots at Saint Francis, 10 spots at Bellarmine College Prep, 4 spots at Notre Dame, and 4 spots at Presentation High School.

SJC Plans for Next School Year

Based on the recent guidance from the State and County, Saint Joseph of Cupertino is planning to offer both in-person and distance learning at the same time for the next school year. Our distance learning program will mirror the schedule of our in-person schedule. In-person learning will occur five days a week for full days (8:30-2:30) on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday and from (8:30-12:30) on Wednesdays. In person classes will meet everyday; we will not be using a hybrid program where students only attend for a few hours every day or a couple of days a week. To avoid being forced to offer hybrid classes, space is limited.

Mary ran to tell Simon Peter and the other disciple that the tomb was empty. No doubt confused and concerned, Peter and the other disciple set aside whatever fear might have occurred to them and ran to see the tomb for themselves. We do not always understand God's ways. We too are confused at times; our lives are marked by moments of uncertainty, and at times we are afraid. We can learn from Mary, Simon Peter, and the other disciple and step out in faith, trusting that we will find the Lord in the midst of the circumstances of our lives. When life gets complicated, as it often does, the best thing to do is step out, perhaps even run to the Lord!

BEAR WITNESS

We may not have opportunities to address crowds of people and share the gospel with them. Still, we are called to bear witness to our faith in the ways that we

are able, in word and in deed. We cannot share what we have not fully embraced ourselves, however. The Easter season is the perfect time to reflect on Christ's Paschal Mystery, the unfathomable love of Jesus who shows and shares God's love perfectly. Our Lord gave his life so that we might have life, and have it to the full. Christ's victory over sin and death is our victory, our promise of eternal life with God in the fullness of time. See in Christ's life, passion, death, and resurrection the sign of God's mercy. Let this Easter day be a moment in which you allow yourself to be touched by Christ's incredible, undying love. Then, renewed in faith, look for ways to bear witness to the mercy, forgiveness, compassion, and love of the Lord with others.

FEAST OF FAITH-The Eucharist: Food for Resurrection

How do we celebrate Easter, the greatest of our Christian feasts? By doing what we do every Sunday and every day: celebrating the Mass. On the first Easter, as the heartbroken disciples walked the road to Emmaus, the Lord was with them but they did not realize it. They only recognized him "in the breaking of the bread" (Luke 22:35).

It is the same for us. In the Mass—the breaking of the bread—we meet the risen Lord together. We meet him in each other—for by our baptism into his death and resurrection, we have become members of one body, the Body of Christ. We meet him in his word—in the liturgy the scriptures are proclaimed to us, that they might take root and grow in us. And we meet him in a special way in the Eucharist, the sacrament of his Body and Blood, which is food for resurrection: "whoever eats this bread will live forever" (John 6:51). CATHOLICISM 101- QUESTION FOR THE WEEK: What is the Triduum?

ANSWER: USCCB: The summit of the Liturgical Year is the Easter Triduum—from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery. The single celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten season, and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord at the Easter Vigil. The Liturgical services that take place during the Triduum are: Mass of the Lord's supper, Good Friday of the Lord's Passion, Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord.
