This particular campaign is part of that pro-life perspective, focusing on the issue of abortion. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will be celebrated at all the Masses next weekend. 

Who is eligible?



Frederick CROP Hunger Walk Sunday 20 October 2013

Please Step Up! We need you!

Where does the money go? In the last 20 years, CROP Hunger Walks have raised more than \$294 million to help people struggling to feed their families – both around the world and around the corner. In fact, 25 percent of the funds raised by CROP Hunger Walks benefit the communities where they take place. Right here, in Frederick MD, 20% of our proceeds support the Food Bank via the Religious Coalition and 5% goes to help those who depend on services through Meals-on-Wheels.

What difference does it make? Funds raised in a CROP Hunger Walk assist people around the world with a "hand-up" to reach the goal of becoming self-sustaining. For example:

\$75 can enable three women to attend a literacy class for a year and change their lives forever.

\$350 can enable the eldest in a child-headed household of AIDS orphans to receive vocational training, so they can support their siblings and themselves.

\$1,050 can support community-based health, hygiene, and sanitation training for an entire community.

What's the point of walking? Hungry people in developing countries typically walk as many as six miles a day to get food, water and fuel, and to take their goods to market. We walk to be in solidarity with their struggle for existence. We walk because we want to end hunger and support self-sustaining opportunities ~ one step at a time.

\$50 can provide seeds and tools to help 3 families start a garden.\$100 can provide emergency food for a family of five for a month.\$125 can send six women to literacy classes and empower them for life.
